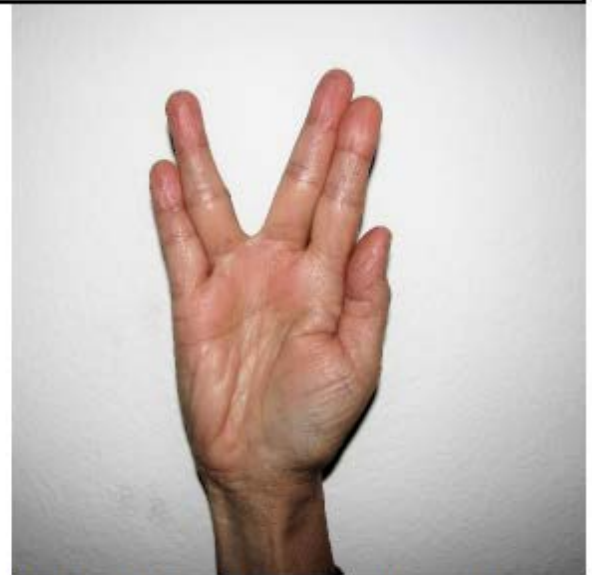
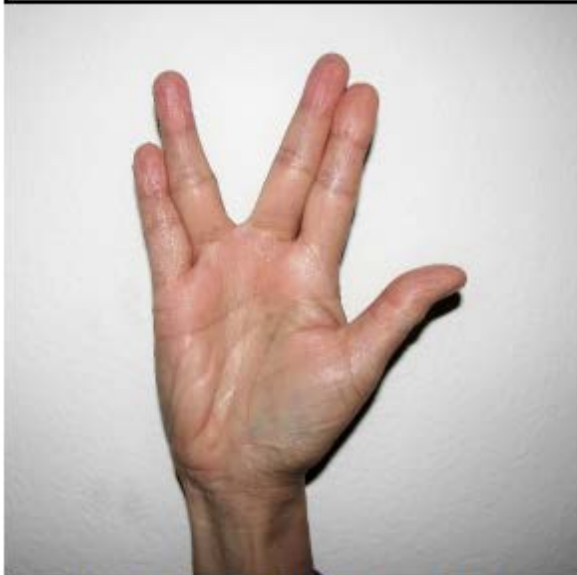

## “Rabbit Ears” – 2M Antenna Conversion

“Rabbit Ears” was the nickname for an adjustable indoor VHF dipole antenna used with conventional analog television (TV) sets for over-the-air reception. It had two telescopic whips, each extending around 40”, adjustable angle between them, and sometimes

a tuning capacitor and small UHF loop. The two whips could form a vee or straight dipole antenna.

In case you haven't heard, **all SCRA-sanctioned in-person events are canceled until further notice.** However, the Board of Directors approved a resolution authorizing meetings via teleconference for the duration of this crisis. 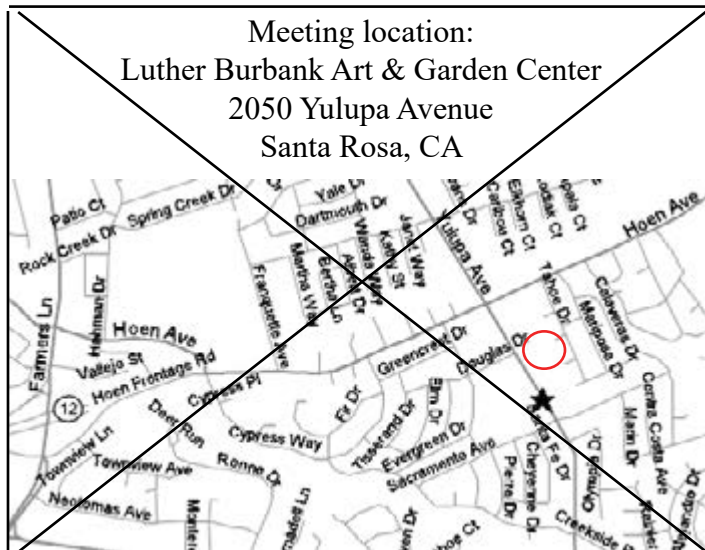

The club's DMR footprint continues to expand! We established a beachhead on DMR and the BrandMeister network of repeaters and hotspots by adding a talk group for Sonoma County. We are using talk group number 31707 to keep in touch on DMR and be able to discuss local news and topics of interest. The use of a talk group like 31707 allows a wider variety of Sonoma County DMR hams to be able to consistently reach each other on the air. Best of all, the 31707 talk group can be reached on hotspots as well as repeaters, meaning you can tie into your local community wherever you are!

Feedline was either 75 ohm coaxial cable or 300 ohm twin lead. In the late 1950's, the TV VHF frequencies ranged 54 to 88 MHz (Channels 2-6) and 174-216 MHz (Channels 7-13). From 54MHz to 216MHz, the corresponding electrical quarter wavelengths are about 52" to 13".

You can still buy rabbit ears (see Figure 1) and convert them to a 2-meter antenna. Due to the reassignment of TV traditional VHF frequencies to other services, modern rabbit ear whips each extend around 24". As we hams know, the electrical quarter wavelength (and thus whip length) for say 146.520 MHz is approximated by  $234 \text{ ft-MHz} / 146.520 \text{ MHz} = 1.597 \text{ ft} = 19.2"$ . Thus, the ears can extend to form a resonant dipole on 2 meters.

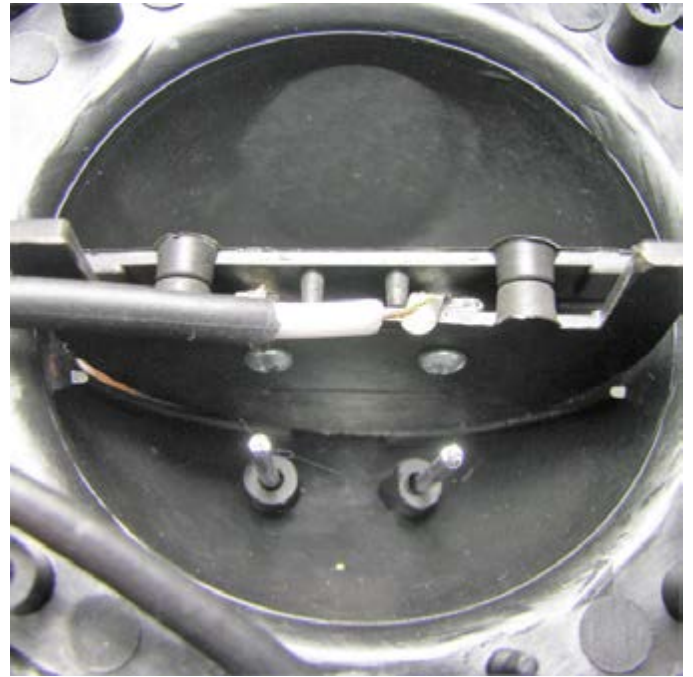


Figure 2. 75-ohm cable, as found.

Conversion of the antenna is simple. Remove the UHF loop, 75 ohm cable and balun if present (it wasn't, see Figure 2). Solder in a 50 ohm cable (I used RG-8X), add a tie wrap for strain relief, and install an appropriate connector (see Figure 3). Knowing that the impedance match at the antenna would not be perfect, I selected the feedline length to be an integral multiple of the electrical half wavelength to reduce impedance transformation by the feedline. Someday after the COVID-19 lockdown ends, I plan to borrow

an antenna analyzer and check tuning for various configurations.

What, no balun? If the antenna impedance is near 50 ohms, little radiation from the feedline will occur. During a large mismatch, the feedline may radiate, changing the antenna pattern for either better or

worse, but when driven by the low power of a handi-talkie (HT), RF burns are not an issue.

How does it perform? I tried three configurations while conversing direct (but split frequency) with Charlie KZ6T at 5W. Base case was the 14" vertical whip on my hand-held HT, and I was not heard. Second case was with each rabbit ear at 45 degrees from vertical (see Figure 4), and I was heard with a lot of scratch. Third case was with ears inline (actually a 155-degree angle) held vertically (see Figure 5), and the report was "a beautiful signal". You can't get much better than that.

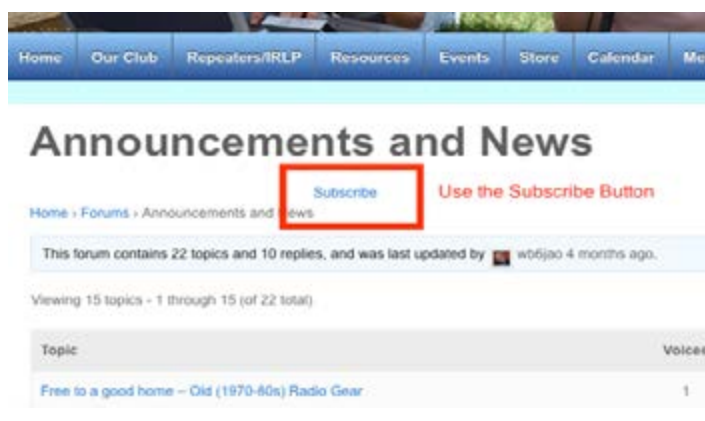

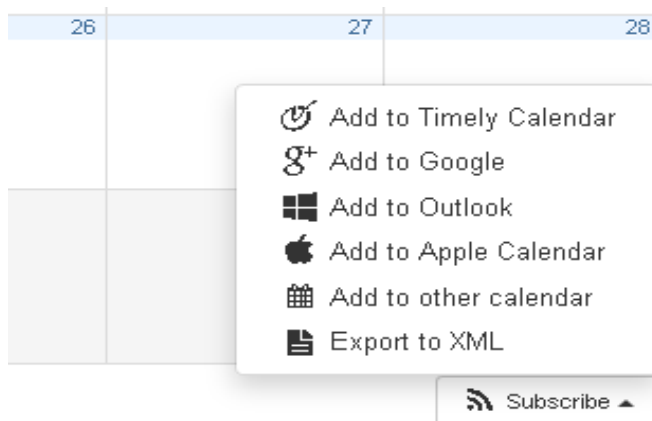

The new Amateur Extra-class license examination question pool, effective from July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2024, has been released and is available at the [National Conference of Volunteer Coordinators \(NCVEC\) website](#).

The [2020 – 2024 Extra-class pool](#) incorporates significant changes compared to the current 2016 – 2020 question pool, which expires on June 30. The number of questions in the pool was reduced from 712 to 622. The result was 239 modified questions, 49 new questions, and 139 questions removed due to changes in what was felt to be an abundance of outdated questions, while areas of new technology and subjects were added.

In addition, an effort was made to balance the difficulty level, removing or replacing some questions deemed too easy or too difficult compared to the rest of the pool. The 2020 pool has 10 diagrams, which have been renumbered because the new question pool has two fewer than the 2016 question pool.
