FIRST, "THANKS FOR CHOOSING ME AS YOUR CLUB PRESIDENT FOR EIGHTY FOUR." I HAVE NO CON-CRETE PLAN FOR THE OPERATION OF THE CLUB FOR THE COMING YEAR. THE REAL PLANNING IS DONE BY THE DULY ELECTED BOARD OF DIRECTORS. THE PRESIDENT IS A MEMBER OF THE BOARD BUT HAS ONLY ONE VOTE IN DECISIONS MADE BY THEM. THE REAL JOB OF THE PRESIDENT IS, I BELIEVE, CARRYING OUT THE DIRECTIVES OF THE BOARD AND THE MEMBERSHIP. I WOULD LIKE MOST TO ACHIEVE IS TO INSTIL PRIDE OF ACCOMPLISHMENT IN THE MEMBERS OF THE CLUB TO THE EXTENT THAT THEY WILL TAKE AN ACTIVE PART IN THE DAY TO DAY OPERATION OF THE CLUB. WOULDN'T IT BE NICE, WHEN THE NEXT ELECTION ROLLS AROUND, TO FIND THAT THERE WAS A REAL BATTLE TO SEE WHO COULD BE ELECTED INSTEAD OF THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE HAVING TO BEG FOR SOME ONE TO TAKE AN OFFICE. IT IS YOUR CLUB AND YOU CAN EXPECT TO GET OUT OF IT JUST WHAT YOU PUT IN. THIS WILL BE A RECURRING THEME ALL DURING THE COMING YEAR.

WHEN YOU WERE LITTLE, YOUR MOTHER PROBABLY TOLD YOU "IT'S NOT NICE TO INTER-RUPT." WELL HAM RADIO, LIKE ART, REFLECTS LIFE. WHAT IS IMPOLITE PERSON..TO..PERSON IS IMPOLITE ON THE AIR. THE PROPER PROCEDURE IF YOU WANT TO CALL A FRIEND WHEN SOMEONE ELSE IS USING THE REPEATER IS TO ASK FOR A "BREAK." WHEN ACKNOWLEDGED, YOU CALL YOUR FRIEND AND ARRANGE WITH HIM TO MEET ON ANOTHER FREQUENCY, THEN RETURN THE REPEATER TO THE ORIGINAL USERS.

BY THE SAME TOKEN, IT IS IMPOLITE TO "HOG" THE REPEATER. THIS IS LIKE THE LOUD BOOR AT A PARTY WHO TALKS SO LONG AND SO LOUD THAT NOBODY ELSE CAN GET A WORD IN EDGEWISE. WHEN YOU ARE TALKING ON THE REPEATER, EVEN IF YOU WILLINGLY ALLOW "BREAKS", THEN OTHERS WOULD FEEL UNCOMFORTABLE TO BREAK IN TO CHAT WITH SOMEONE ELSE (SEE ABOVE PARAGRAPH).

WE HAVE NO SET TIME LIMIT ON THE 73 MACHINE. I WOULD THINK THAT A SELF..IMPOSED LIMIT OF FIVE MINUTES OR SO DURING THE B USY COMMUTE HOURS WOULD BE REASONABLE, UNLESS YOU'RE IN A ROUND TABLE WITH A NUMBER OF STATIONS USING THE MACHINE AT ONCE. A LONGER TIME PERIOD WOULD BE ACCEPTABLE AT OTHER TIMES DEPENDING ON HOW HEAVILY THE MACHINE IS BEING USED. EVEN IN THE WEE HOURS OF THE MORNING, THOUGH, I'D THINK ANYTHING OVER 20-30 MINUTES IS GETTING EXESSIVE. REMEMBER, IF SOMEONE ON THE HF BANDS TALKS FOR THREE HOURS, YOU CAN ALWAYS MOVE UP OR DOWN 5KHZ, BUT CHANGING FREQUENCY IS OFTEN NOT FEASABLE ON REPEATERS.

ELSEWHERE IN THIS ISSUE IS A REPRINT OF A LIST OF REPEATER OPERATORS PRACTICES OUT OF THE ARRL REPEATER DIRECTORY. I THINK WE COULD ALL BENEFIT FROM A RE-READING OF IT ONCE IN A WHILE. SEE YOU AT XMAS PARTY...73 DE N1AL...

REPEATER OPERATING PRACTICES....

- 1. MONITOR THE REPEATER TO BECOME FAMILIAR WITH ANY PECULIARITIES IN ITS OPERATION.
- 2. TO INITIATE A CONTACT SIMPLY INDICATE THAT YOU ARE ON FREQUENCY. VARIOUS GEO--GRAPHICAL AREAS HAVE DIFFERENT PRACTICES ON MAKING YOURSELF HEARD, BUT, GENERALLY, "THIS IS WIXZ MONITORING" WILL SUFFICE. ONE PRACTICE THAT IS LOOKED UPON WITH DISFAVOR UNIVER-SALLY IS CALLING CO ON A REPEATER.
- 3. IDENTIFY LEGALLY: YOU MUST TRANSMIT YOUR CALLSIGN AT THE BEGINNING AND END OF EACH CONTACT AND EVERY TEN MINUTES IN BETWEEN. IT IS ILLEGAL TO KEY A REPEATER WITHOUT IDENTIFICATION.
- 4. PAUSE BETWEEN TRANSMISSIONS. THIS ALLOWS OTHERS TO USE THE REPEATER (SOMEONE MAY HAVE AN EMERGENCY), ON MOST REPEATERS A PAUSE IS NECESSARY TO RESET THE TIMER.
- 5. KEEP TRANSMISSIONS SHORT AND THOUGHTFUL. YOUR MONOLOGUE MAY PREVENT SOMEONE WITH AN EMERGENCY FROM USING THE REPEATER. IF YOUR MONOLOGUE IS LONG ENOUGH, YOU MAY TIME OUT THE REPEATER. YOUR TRANSMISSIONS ARE BEING HEARD BY MANY LISTENERS INCLUDING NON..HAMS WITH "PUBLIC SERVICE BAND" MONITORS: DON'T GIVE A BAD IMPRESSION OF OUR HOBBY.
- 6. USE SIMPLEX WHENEVER POSSIBLE. IF YOU CAN COMPLETE YOUR QSO ON A DIRECT FREQUENCY, THERE IS NO NEED TO TIE UP THE REPEATER AND PREVENT OTHERS FROM USING IT.
- 7. USE THE MINIMUM AMOUNT OF POWER NECESSARY TO MAINTAIN COMMUNICATIONS. THIS FCC REGULATION MINIMIZES THE POSSIBILITY OF ACCESSING DISTANT REPAETERS ON THE SAME FREQUENCY.
- 8. DON'T BREAK INTO A CONTACT UNLESS YOU HAVER SOMETHING TO ADD. INTERRUPTING IS NO MORE POLITE ON THE AIR THAN IT IS IN PERSON.
- 9. REPEATERS ARE INTENDED TO FACILITATE MOBILE HAMS. DURING THE COMMUTER RUSH HOURS, BASE STATIONS SHOULD RELINQUISH THE REPEATER TO MOBILE STATIONS; SOME REPEATER GROUPS HAVE RULES THAT SPECIFICALLY ADDRESS THIS PRACTICE.
- 10. MANY REPEATERS ARE EQUIPPED WITH AUTOPATCH FACILITIES WHICH, WHEN PROPERLY ACCESSED, CONNECT THE REPEATER TO THE TELEPHONE SYSTEM TO PROVIDE A PUBLIC SERVICE. THE FCC FORBIDS USING AN AUTOPATCH FOR ANYTHING THAT COULD BE CONSTRUED AS BUSINESS.

boug. WAOJRS, was first licensed as WNOJRS, in July 1964, with Novice Class privileges at station DTH Sutton, Nebraska. At that time, he was one of five radio amateurs in Clay County. The training toward the Novice began when boug asked Gary. KOSRV (now a silent key) to be his counselor for the Radio Merit Badge in the Boy Scouts. Doug and a friend worked together on the code, a requirement for the merit badge, and Gary suggested that the two boys "think" about amateur radio. Thus, the weekly meetings at Gary's DTH began. The exam was administered by one of Doug's oldest ham friends, Jack, WONHS (Rutty Ham Shack) of Dewessa, NE, who occasionally meets on the weekly sked Doug has with his dad. Wally, WROGXT. From these beginnings, Doug out together his Novice station using a Heathkit DX-20 transmitter and a Gonset GR-212 general coverage receiver. The antenna he first used was a 40 meter dipole, which also worked on the 15 meter band. Transmit/receive was accomplished by a knife switch in the middle of the operating table.

After many enjoyable CW QSO's, Doug realized that he had to get his code speed up to the 13 wpm required for the General Class. The Novice license was good for only one year, and in Nebraska back in 1964, there was not much (if any) VHF activity in Clay County. A Technician Class would have been fine in the Omaha or Lincoln area, but if he were going to communicate with anyone, he would have to get the General. So study he did, and made the trip to Omaha (120 miles away) to take the exam at age 14. He passed, and still has the same call today. WAOJRB.

Doug passed his Advanced in 1973 and today is currently active on 80 through 10, and 2 meters. Also, a new interest is 2 meter weak signal work on SSB and CW, and the new 30 meter band. Current projects include a 160 meter antenna, a new CW keyer, and helping his XYL. Pam, get her Novice license. Recently, he tied in his homebrew computer for RTTY, but is primarily a CW and SSB operator.

FCC APPROVES TEN YEAR HAM LICENSE TERMS

THE FCC HAS EXTENDED THE OPERATOR AND STATION LICENSING PERIODS IN THE AMATEUR RADIO SERVICE TO TEN YEAR LICENSE TERMS AND CHANGED THE GRACE PERIOD FOR RENEWAL OF AN EXPIRED AMATEUR OPERATOR AND STATION LICENSE TO TWO YEARS.

THE FCC SAID IT WOULD NOT ISSUE A BLANKET ORDER EXTENDING THE TERMS OF EXISTING LIC--ENSES BECAUSE THIS WOULD BE CONFUSING TO BOTH AMATEUR LICENSEES AND FOREIGN LICENSING AUTH--ORITIES. "RATHER, THE NEW TEN YEAR LICENSE TERMS WILL BE 'PHASED IN' AS LICENSES COME UP FOR RENEWAL."

SIGNIFICANT PROCEEDINGS LIST ISSUED


FCC DRASTICALLY REDUCES HAM TESTING

THE FCC FIELD OPERATIONS BUREAU HAS ISSUED AN INTERNAL MIMEOGRAPHED MEMORANDUM INDICATING THAT AMATEUR RADIO EXAMINATIONS FIVEN AT ALL DISTRIC FCC OFFICES THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY WILL BE LIMITED TO A TOTAL OF FOUR DURING CALENDAR YEAR 1984. THE AUTHOR OF THE MEMO WAS THE FCC'S FIELD OPERATIONS BUREAU CHIEF, RICHARDLM. SMITH.
