W5YI REPORT

FCC GIVES INSTRUCTIONS TO NEW VECS.....

THE FCC HAS ISSUED INSTRUCTIONS TO THE FIVE NEWLY APPOINTED VOLUNTEER EXAMINER COORD-INATORS (VECS) EXPLAINING TO THEM THE STEPS THEY ARE TO TAKE NOW THAT THEY HAVE BEEN APPOINT-ED TO COORDINATE THE EFFORTS OF VOLUNTEER EXAMINERS IN AUMINSTERING AMATEUR RADIO OPERATOR LICENSES.

CONTACT WITH THE FCC.....

THE VEC SHOULD NAME A CONTACT PERSON AND AN ALTERNATE TO CONDUCT DAY-TO-DAY COMMUNICATIONS WITH THE FCC. ONE OF THESE INDIVIDUALS MUST BE AVAILABLE DURING NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS TO ANSWER QUESTIONS THAT MAY ARISE DURING THE PROCESSING OF APPLICATIONS FORWARDED TO THE FCC BY THE COORDINATOR.

THE FCC ASKED THE NEW VECS TO TRY TO RECRUIT AMATEUR EXTRA CLASS OPERATORS AS VES "SINCE THEY CAN ADMINISTER ALL EXAMINATIONS." ADVANCED CLASS OPERATORS CAN ADMINISTER ONLY THE TECHNICIAN CLASS EXAMINATIONS. NO OTHER CLASS OF LICENSEE CAN PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM.

OTHER VE QUALIFICATIONS THAT THE FCC INSISTED ON WAS THAT A VE MUST HAVE A CURRENT EXTRA CLASS OR ADVANCED LICENSE . MUST NOT HAVE EVER HAD HIS/HER AMATEUR LICENSE REVOKED OR SUSPENDED...AND MUST NOT OWN A SIGNIFICANT INTEREST IN OR BE AN EMPLOYEE OF A COMPANY OR ENTITY ENGAGED IN THE MANUFACTURE OR DISTRIBUTION OF AMATEUR RADIO EQUIPMENT OR ENGAGED IN THE PREPARATION OR DISTRIBUTION OF LICENSE TESTING MATERIAL. UNIQUE IDENTIFIER CODES.....

WERE ORDERED ESTABLISHED FOR EACH EXAMINATION SESSION COORDINATED BY THE VEC. THERE ARE 90 INDENTIFIERS TO SELECT FROM: WA THROUGH WZ, KA-KZ, NA-NZ, AND AA THROUGH AL. THE FCC SAID THAT ANY INDENTIFIER COULD BE REUSED AFTER 90 DAYS. "SHOULD YOU NEED TO COORDINATE MORETHAN 360 EXAMINATION SESSIONS PER YEAR YOU MAY ADD A NUMBER AFTER THESE LETTERS. THE SAME LETTERS ARE USED IN ALL CALL AREAS.

CERTIFICATES OF SUCCESSFUL EXAMS.....

VOLUNTEER EXAMINERS WILL ISSUE EACH CANDIDATE THAT SCORES A FASSING AMATEUR RADIO TEST GRADE A "CERTIFICATE OF SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF EXAMINATION." THESE CERTIFICATES SERVE TWO FUNCTIONS: TELEGRAPHY ELEMENT CREDIT (WHEN A CANDIDATE PASSES THE HIGHER CLASS CW REQUIRE-MENT BUT FAILS THE REQUIRED WRITTEN TEST) AND TEMPORARY OPERATION AUTHORITY.

THE POSSESSION OF THE CERTIFICATE VALIDATES TEMPORARY OPERATION WITH THE RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES OF THE HIGHER CLASS UNTIL THE NEW LICENSE IS RECEIVED OR FOR A PERIOD OF 90 DAYS. WHICHEVER COMES FIRST.

THE FCC ADVISED EACH VEC THAT THE CERTIFICATE COULD BE MADE UP BY THEM BUT THAT ".... CARE MUST BE TAKEN TO DISCOURAGE ALTERATION OR IMITATION." EACH CERTIFICATE ISSUED MUST CON-TAIN:

- 1. RECIPIENTS NAME.
- 2. AMATEUR CALL SIGN (IF AVAILABLE),
- TELEGRAPHY ELEMENT SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED.
- 4. OPERATOR CLASS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED
- EXAMINATION SESSION IDENTIFIER, 5.
- DATE EXAMINATION SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED, 6.
- 7. SIGNATURE OF EACH OF THE 3 VOLUNTEER EXAMINERS ADMINISTERING THE EXAM,
- AMATEUR CALL SIGN OF EACH VE.

THE COMMISSION SAID THAT THE VECS COULD PROVIDE COPIES OF THE APPLICATION FORM (FCC FORM 610) AND THAT THEY COULD BE DUPLICATED FROM FCC COPIES. (CURRENT VERSION IS DATED: DECEMBER 1981.0 "UNTIL THE NEW FORM 610 IS AVAILABLE, (THIS VERSION) MUST BE USED TOGETHER WITH A TEMPORARY FCC FORM 610 ATTACHMENT." THIS ATTACHMENT IS USED BY THE VES FOR THE EXAMINERS REPORT (SECTION I) AND EXAMINERS CERTIFICATION (SECTION II-B.) THE ATTACHMENT FORMS CAN ALSO BE DUPLICATED. THE FCC SAID.

EACH APPLICATION RECEIVED BY THE VEC MUST BE DATE STAMPED AND SCREENED FOR COMPLETENESS AND AUTHENTICITY.

- l. VERIFY THAT THE VES HAVE BEEN ACCREDITED BY YOUR ORGANIZATION.
- MAKE CERTAIN THE TEAM REPORT ON THE FCC FORM 610 ATTACHMENT IS CORRECTLY FILLED OUT AND REQUIRED ELEMENTS PASSED.
- Ve certification must be properly filled out on the application. A PHOTOCOPY OR ORIGINAL OF THE LICENSE MUST BE ATTACHED. 3.

Sympathy Expressed to N6FQZ: It was noted that Jack's wife had passed away. A card was sent around for the club membership to sign.


PR Committee: It was noted that Van, NAGFY, who is chairman of this committee was not present because of a fall and blow to his head. It is hoped that he heals soon.


