REFLECTION TIME OR WHERE HAS ALL THE TIME GONE?

AT THIS TIME OF YEAR THERE IS SOME SPACE FOR REFLECTION. LOOKING BACK OVER THE YEARS AND SOME OF THE CHANGES THAT TOOK PLACE IN AMATEUR RADIO, IS A START. IT BEGAN WITH NO LICENSE, NO CODE AND THE FIRST STEP WAS ONE CODE SPEED AND ONE LEVEL OF LICENSE, TO THE PRESENT FAY OF THREE CODE SPEEDS AND FIVE LEVELS OF LICENSE. NOW THE FCC HAS TURNED THE TESTING PROGRAM OVER TO THE RADIO AMATEUR. THIS IS A STEP JUST TRIED BY OUR LOCAL CLUB.

NOT TOO LONG AGO THE "NO CODE" BIT THE DUST, YET WITHIN THE LAST MONTH RUMOR HAS IT THAT THE FCC IS AGAIN INTERESTED IN A "NO CODE" LEVEL TO BRING MORE MEMBERS INTO THE DECLINING MEMBERSHIP OF AMATEUR RADIO.

A CURRENT ITEM OF INTEREST TO THE AMATEUR IS ANTENNAS AND THEIR HEIGHT ABOVE GROUND. MANY CITIES AND COUNTIES PLUS SOME STATE ACTIVITY SEEM TO LEAN TOWARDS A MUCH LOWER OR NONE AT ALL. YEARS AGO THE HEIGHT DEPENDED ON HOW LONG A TREE YOU COULD GO OUT AND BRING HOME OR IF YOU LIVED IN AN AREA WHERE BAMBOO WAS RAISED A NICE FIFTY FOOT LENGTH WAS IDEAL. I HAVE HEARD OF ONE AREA THAT WOULD LIMIT ANTENNA HEIGHT TO SIXTEEN FEET. WHAT NEXT?

TECHNOLOGY HAS PROGRESSED SO FAST IN OUR AREA THAT IN THE LAST FIVE YEARS MORE INFORMATION HAS COME FORWARD THAN IN THE PAST FIFTY OR MORE YEARS COMBINED. WE STARTED WITH CW, THEN AM OR FM, THEN ON TO RTTY AND SSB, NOW WE ARE INTO PACKET RADIO, SST, MAILBOX, COMPUTER CONTROL, WHAT NEXT? WE NO LONGER BUILD MOST OF OUR EQUIPMENT; NOW WE GO TO HRO, ROSS, ETC..AND LAY DOWN THE GREEN STUFF. TECHNOLOGY HAS PASSED MANY OF US BY FIVE TO TEN YEARS AGO. SO STOP AND REFLECT FOR A WHILE, WHAT HAVE YOU DONE, AS AN INDIVIDUAL AMATEUR, OVER THE LAST FEW YEARS? ARE YOU IN TO DE OR RAG CHEWING OR TRAFFIC? DO YOU HELP AT ALL WITH PUBLIC SERVICE? ARE YOU ONLY VHF, UHF, HF? HAVE YOU BUILT ANYTHING LATELY, EVEN AN ANTENNA? HAS A NOVICE OR ANY OTHER GRADE AMATEUR ASKED YOU FOR HELP AND DID YOU GIVE IT? HAVE YOU MADE A BALANCE BETWEEN AMATEUR RADIO AND YOUR FAMILY? ALL ARE IMPORTANT: SOME REFLECTION MAY BE NEEDED.

WELL BACK TO XMAS TIME..PLAN THIS PERIOD WITH THE FAMILY AND THEY WILL HELP YOU IN PLANNING YOUR AMATEUR ACTIVITIES. REFLECTION IS NECESSARY AS IT TELLS YOU WHERE YOU WERE, AND WILL HELP YOU IN PLANNING WHERE YOU WANT TO GO. MERRY XMAS AND A HAPPY NEW YEAR TO ALL..



STANDING BUSINESS
