




The above map indicates areas (in black) that have adopted the Pacific Northwest 20 kHz 2-meter bandplan, and those states now considering a changeover to it. Note that the Canadian province of British Columbia and all of Mexico are using 20 kHz, making it a truly "internationally accepted" standard of frequency coordination. Expect the southern half of California to be on the "evaluating" list shortly, as that area's 2-meter coordination council will soon begin its "evaluation" of 20 kHz.
