CHRISTMAS PARTY!

REPEATER NEWS

At the November Board mtg. (joint session with old/new boards), it was decided to accept the Repeater Committee's recommendations on disposition of the Repco repeater.

We will attempt to transform it into a two-channel repeater. Since the transmit/receive PC boards already have provisions for this, it should be a fairly simple mod. The two frequencies used will be 146.13/73 and an adjacent channel. In this way, we quickly can switch from one freq to the other without retuning the duplexers.

Primary use of the machine will be as a backup in case the 146.73 repeater on Sonoma Mt. goes out. Secondary use will be as an additional repeater on the adjacent channel to be used in emergencies.

The machine will be stored in the RACES room at the EOC with any additional equipment required to make it operational (antenna, feedline, mast, etc. and possibly the club's small 3kW generator.)

The Board voted that up to \$150 may be spent by Hoppy WD6CKP to finish fixing up the 3 kW generator.

HOW LONG SHOULD I TALK ON THE REPEATER ?

We've had some complaints lately about some people being too longwinded on the repeater. It's all very well and good to say, "But I pause after each transmission to let others break in". The problem is that most people don't feel comfortable breaking into an ongoing QSO unless they have an emergency. Yet they have a right to use the repeater too.

How long is too long? Well, of course, it depends on the time of day and usage level of the repeater, but we've had reports of QSO's lasting over an hour and a half! That's too long at any time of day or night. During rush hour, even 5 minutes may be a big percentage of someone's commute. At these times, we often go into a "round table" with everyone on the repeater transmitting in his turn.

Repeaters are not really meant for long-winded ragchewing. Many of these QSO's could easily be handled on simplex, and if so, there is just no excuse for tying up the repeater.



RE-TESTING OF SEVERAL AMATEURS is being required by FCC in the Volunteer Exam scandal. Two unidentified Dallas, TX hams have reportedly refused to take the exams over and are suing all involved, including FCC, on unknown grounds. Meanwhile, the W5YI VEC has revoked the VE accreditation of one of their southern Calif VE's. (Westlink)

CREDIT FOR WRITTEN EXAMS will now be allowed for those who fail the code. The certificate is good for 1 year. (Code credit certificates have been available for some time for those who fail the written.) The change will go into effect Dec 15. (ARRL)

MORE HAMS THAN EVER are now licensed in the US: 421,082, up some 8,500 over last year. The number of newcomers is up 21% while the dropout rate is down about 15%. Upgrades are up 9.5%. (Westlink)

WORLDWIDE BEACON SCHEDULE: There are 9 crystal-controlled beacon stations on 14.100 that each transmit for 1 minute every 10 minutes. Each sends a series of four 9-second dashes using 100W, 10W, 1W and .1W. This gives a convenient way of instantly appraising worldwide 20M propagation. For more info, see June 1983 QST page 27. (ARRL)

PACKET NEWS

A SATELLITE MODEM suitable for FO-12 has been designed by G3RUH. Its digital AFC follows satellite doppler shift is compatible with "all known ICOM, TRIO, and YAESU standards", adjustable for 10-100 Hz/step. The unit uses standard CMOS and LSTTL parts. Your TNC must have provision for bypassing its internal modem. Order the PC board from AMSAT-UK, LONDON E12 5EQ, England. Price \$17.50 airmail. For instructions only send sase or 2 IRCs.

THE ARRL REPEATER DIRECTORY will include packet systems in the '87-88 edition. Only "major systems" that are operational 24 hours a day will be listed. Include following info: State, QTH, Frequency(s), Address, Sponsor, Source, Notes. Under Notes include System type (gateway, BBS, digipeater etc), Coverage area, and Link(s) (if you are a single-hop link between 2 or more digipeaters).

WØRLI BULLETIN BOARD SOFTWARE will now run on an IBM PC! This is rather amazing as the WØRLI program was written to run under CP/M on a Xerox 820 computer. KØVLD has written a conversion program that emulates a Z-80 processor and the CP/M and BIOS in a Xerox 820. advantage over re-writing the WØRLI program for the IBM is that any future upgrades can be incorporated easily. From FCC rules, paragraph 97.125:

"No licensed radio operator shall willfully or maliciously interfere with or cause interference to any radio communication or signal."

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SCRA CLUB BULLETIN BOARD

SCRA now has a club bulletin board on-line. Provided free of charge, courtesy of HSC Electronics, it is available 7PM-9AM weekdays and from 5:30 PM Saturday to 9AM Monday. Phone number is 792-2357 (300 or 1200 baud, 7 or 8 bit, even parity).

When you call up, send a couple returns to get the connect message. It will ask for your name/password. Once you enter the "Main Section", type a "?" to list the available commands. An "M" gets you into the Message Section, where another "?" will list the message commands. SCRA is in message Area #5.

In addition to SCRA items, other sections list HSC specials, Fidonet mail (nationwide), San Francisco Bay area mail, etc.

PACKET BEACONS

Beacons are a major cause of congestion on the packet radio frequencies. Here are some suggested rules from KE3Z at ARRL:

- 1. Beacon only to serve a <u>specific</u> need that can't be served by <u>leaving</u> a message on the local BBS system.
- 2. If your TNC permits, use a mode that avoids beaconing on a busy channel. (Use the BEACON AFTER command rather than BEACON EVERY.)
- 3. Set the beacon timer to the maximum value possible. There is seldom a need for a beacon that is repeated more often than once every 15 to 20 minutes, except for CQ's.
- 4. Never put a bell character in a beacon. There's nothing more annoying than listening to your terminal ring every 5 minutes from a beacon.

Following these simple rules isn't very difficult. Trying to operate on a channel crowded with beacons is. (Tnx Gateway Magazine)
