



REPEATER NEWS

"FAMOUS" HAMS OF SONOMA COUNTY

We have a number of local hams known among the ham fraternity outside the confines of Sonoma County. In Callbook order:

Frank Jones W6AJF has published numerous VHF/UHF articles in the ham magazines. He was the original editor of the Editors and Engineers Radio Handbook.

Al Bloom NIAL is a former WIAW operator. He wrote the Advanced and Extra class chapters of an earlier edition of the ARRL License Manual.

Bob Shrader W6BNB is well-known in the Amateur Radio publishing field. His many books and articles include college electronics texts, commercial and amateur license guides, and articles in amateur radio magazines.

David W. Nurse W8GCD was president of the Heath Company during the "glory days" of its amateur radio equipment.

Chod Harris VP2ML is another former ARRL staffer where he was head of the Club and Training Department. A noted DX-er, he has published a number of ham radio articles and is now the editor of the DX Bulletin.

HF PACKET -- COMMENTS AND TIPS

(Excerpted from article in QEX Magazine by Gregory P. Latta AA8V)

Anyone who has operated packet radio on the HF bands is aware that problems exist with this mode. The issue causing the most concern is the excessive number of retries.

Fortunately this is not an inborn trait of HF packet. Rather, the problem is a result of packeteers operating their equipment incorrectly. Here are some suggestions that may help to improve the situation:

- 1) Use the proper modem. The VHF modem that comes with your TNC is just not good enough. Several manufacturers now produce high-quality modems suitable for HF use.
- 2) Change the timing parameters in your TNC to values more suited to HF operation:
 FRACK (FRame ACKnowledge time):
 Since 300 baud HF packet takes 4 times as long to send as 1200 baud on VHF, use a longer FRACK value.
 TXD (Transmitter Delay): HF rigs take longer to stabilize on transmit. Also the receiver AGC circuit must respond. Set TXD a bit more than you may think necessary. It helps in the long run.
- 3) Change other TNC parameters:

 PACLEN: PACket LENgth should be shortened to no more than about 60 characters, or less when conditions are bad. The longer the packet, the more likely a "hit" (error).

 MAXFRAME (max # of packets enroute at any one time): Should be reduced from 4 (typically) on VHF to 1 or 2, unless the path is especially good.
- 4) Read your manual until you understand how the TNC parameters affect on-the-air operation.

These recommendations are for normal QSO-type contacts. For file transfers, bulletin boards, etc., some parameters should be changed.

They come from you, because there is an old adage in the newspaper business that "names make news", and with 165 strong of you out there, we should have enough grist for the feature mills of the newspapers and electronic media for times to come.

How can you help? Ordinary hamming is curious enough for the average reader. It does have interest, but it has been publicised as straight hamming in the past. I want more than that! I want the things you do with hamming that have a curious and interesting twist. A new angle! Something different!

Experimentation! New gimmiks! New angles to old devices! New twists! Different types of contacts! Interesting contacts! Different interests in sunspot activity! Weather! Weather satellites! If it is interesting to you, it would most certainly be interesting to the public. If it has only the normal amount of interest for you, it still will be interesting to the public.

Are you interested in the old, antique types of radios? Any other interesting hobbies such as rug weaving, weaving & dying, collecting old bottles, buttons, etc. All these can be used as "news-hooks" to get and keep your name and the club's name before the reading public. Not only that, it will give us an avenue to the newspapers and electronic media that will be labelled "reliable, trustworthy and NEWSWORTHY", and we will become even further, an organization that the media will turn to in times of stress, need and emergency. They even may find us a fund of technical knowledge that is not found elsewhere.

How do we accomplish it? You give me the information, and I'll translate it into stories that will be acceptable for the press! Kathy has done a bang-up job, and she is a tough act to follow. If there are photographers among you (and who ever heard of a ham who is not a photographer) I would appreciate the help for stills for the printed media. [Ed note: and for Short Skip!] Further, and I could use much, much advice in this area, why not develop a film clip library that the electronic media could use, when needed?

We will attempt to break into the national ham magazines also, but remember, in times of emergency, man-made or natural disasters, we will be the people the national media will look to for information for national coverage and local press for local coverage.

The hobby has vast possibilities! Not half-vast but vast possibilities, and it will keep me busy at the word processor night after night feeding the info to mags like QST, World Radio, ARRL SCM, Ham Radio and so forth all with the thoughts in mind, and these are crucial thoughts, of (1) how we benefit society, (2) our contributions to society through experimentation, (3) our help to society in emergencies, and (4) the intrinsic values to society of our hobby. These are all inter-related, but yet different.

Thanks, people, for your help and don't "downplay" the importance of your singular contribution or effort. It all fits together nicely.

Take some time and write out <u>your</u> contributions to society, <u>your</u> gimmicks, <u>your</u> experimentation, <u>your</u> whatever. <u>Names make news, and you</u> are those names!



(Clip & save so you can be Net Control Station, if NCS doesn't show)

[CAPITAL LETTERS = Material to be spoken by NCS over the repeater.]
[small letters = Instructions to you, the NCS.]

QST QST QST. THIS IS (your call here), NET CONTROL STATION FOR THE SONOMA COUNTY AMATEUR RADIO SERVICE NET. THIS NET IS SPONSORED BY THE SONOMA COUNTY RADIO AMATEURS INC AND MEETS ON THIS FREQUENCY EVERY TUESDAY AT 7 PM.

THIS REPEATER WAS INSTALLED AT THE COUNTY SITE ON SONOMA MOUNTAIN PRIMARILY FOR EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS IN TIME OF DISASTER. EMERGENCY TRAFFIC ALWAYS HAS PRIORITY OVER ALL OTHER COMMUNICATIONS. AN EMERGENCY SHOULD BE ANNOUNCED BY EITHER A DOUBLE BREAK OR BY THE WORDS, "BREAK EMERGENCY". ANY QSO IN PROGRESS WILL CEASE IMMEDIATELY, AND ALL STATIONS WILL REMAIN SILENT UNTIL THE EMERGENCY IS OVER, UNLESS THEY CAN HELP. IT IS IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER THAT DURING NET OPERATIONS, THE EMERGENCY AUTODIALER IS DISABLED. ANY STATION HAVING EMEMGENCY TRAFFIC DURING THE NET SHOULD CONTACT NET CONTROL.

SCRA MEMBERSHIP IS OPEN TO ANY INTERESTED PERSON IN THE SONOMA COUNTY AREA. FOR FURTHER INFORMATION, CONTACT ANY MEMBER STATION OR WRITE TO: (pause) SCRA, P.O. BOX 116, SANTA ROSA, CA 95402. THE CLUB MEETING IS THE FIRST WEDNESDAY OF EACH MONTH AT 7:30 PM AT THE [E.O.C., LOCATED IN THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATION COMPLEX]. (or after Jan. 1987): [PUBLIC HEALTH ROTUNDA ROOM NEAR COMMUNITY HOSPITAL, SANTA ROSA].

DOES ANYONE HAVE ANY ANNOUNCEMENTS FOR THE NET? (pause)

NEWS of Amateur Radio EVENTS CALENDAR:

A NEW ARRL VIDEOTAPE is to go into production in early 1987. Called "The New World of Amateur Radio", it will replace the popular "World of Amateur Radio". Send suggestions or material to Bill Pasternak WA6ITF, TNWOAR, 28197 Robin Av, Saugus, CA 91350. (ARRL)

COORDINATION TERRORISM. Due to the refusal of the 3 Southern California repeater councils (TASMA, 220-SMA, and SCRRBA) to sanction "pirate" FEBRUARY: repeaters, machines owned by council officers have been suffering a spate of selective jamming. In the case of Karl Pagel N6BVU, who owns no repeater, the harassment has taken the form of over 100 magazines and pieces of junk mail arriving at his PO box each day. Then some costly COD's began to arrive: \$1250 for make computer boards, and a phone call from a ham dealer to confirm his credit-card order of over \$20,000. The postal inspectors have brought 19 - SCRA Flea Market in the FBI to investigate possible wiretapping violations. If the perpetrators have hacked into private data bases, the "phone freaks" are looking at up to a \$500,000 fine and 5 years in federal prison for each count. (Westlink)






