BADGES: Hank W6DTV handed out badges to those who were present. OLD BUSINESS:



APPLICATION FOR ISSUANCE OF THE 146,730 AUTOPATCH CODES

The Board of Directors of the Sonoma County Radio Amateurs, Inc., has decreed that the issuance of Autopatch User Codes shall be conditional upon the following prerequisites: (1) Application in the SCRA, Inc., and application for Autopatch Codes, shall be two separate entities. (2) At any SCRA general club meeting, the applicant shall request, fill out in full, and submit to the Treasurer, an "Application for Issuance" of the 146.730 Autopatch codes, (no applications for Autopatch shall be accepted by mail). The applicant will be issued the Autopatch codes in person, (none sent by mail) at any sebsequent SCRA general club meeting. (3) It is mandatory that the applicant shall have a Technician or higher class radio amateur license. (4) Before Autopatch Codes are issued, the applicant shall satisfy the requirement of living, working, or spending reasonable time, in Sonoma County.

The repeater is owned by Sonoma County, and operated by SCRA, Inc. for all to use. The Autopatch is owned by SCRA, Inc. and is for members use only. The phone expenses are paid by Sonoma County, and will continue to be so. providing that the inner-county phone privaliges are not abused. Dialing numbers outside of Sonoma County is abuse, as well as calling someone everyday on the autopatch just to say I'll be there in five minutes is abuse. So please use the autopatech responsibly! The following FCC rules regarding Autopatches shall also be followed: * (1) Phone patches or autopatches involving the business affairs of any party must not be conducted at any time. The only exception is when the immediate safety of life or property is endangered. (2) Phone patches or autopatches should never be made solely to avoid telephone toll charges. Phone patches and autopatches should never be made when normal telephone service could just as easily be used. (3) Third parties should not be retransmitted until the responsible control operator has explained to them the nature of Amateur Radio. Control of the station must never be relinquished to an unlicensed person. Permitting a person you don't know very well to conduct a patch in a language you don't understand amounts to relinquishing control. (4) Phone patches and autopatches must be terminated immediately in the event of any illegality or impropriety. (5) Phone patches or autopatches should be kept as breif as possable, as a courtesy to other amateurs; the amateur bands are intended to be used primarily for communications amoung radio amatuers. Compliance with these guidelines will help ensure that our interconnection and autopatch privilage will continue to be available in the future, which will in turn help us contribute to the public interest. * FCC RULE BOOK.

PETER I ISLAND, a DXCC country on nearly everyone's "most needed" list, should be on by the time you read this. Look for 3Y1EE and 3Y2GV on 14022 and 14145 kHz. Also 3503, 7003, 21022, 28022, and on SSB: 3788, 7043, 21195, 28495. (TDXB)

NOVICE ENHANCEMENT IS COMING! FCC's new rules should be released very soon, now. See June QST p 48 and Sept. QST p 67 for details on the proposal. (ARRL)

ATTENTION VE's: Do not issue any certificates for written exam credit as you do not have the authority to do so! The new regs will not go into effect until after the Novice enhancement proposal is announced, so that the FCC only has to revise the 610 forms once. (Westlink)

FCC CHAIRMAN RESIGNS. Mark S. Fowler, longest-reigning Chairman of the FCC (6 years next May), has resigned effective this Spring. His tenure was marked by "deregulation" of all the services, including Amateur. A leading contender for the job is Commissioner Dennis Patrick, a former White House staffer. (NY Times)

THE ARRL DIRECTORS at their meeting Jan 16/17 in Hartford: -- Planned to spend \$250,000 in 1987 on recruiting people into ham radio. -- Assigned people to search for funding for the new museum and refurbishing of WlAW. -- Created a Pub.Relations Committee to be staffed by expert volunteers. -- "Strongly supported" a new membership service: notification of license renewal deadlines. (WlAW)

ARRL MEMBERSHIP IS UP 4% in the Pacific Division this year, 2.36% overall. (ARRL)

PACKET NEWS

NETWORKING COMES TO THE BAY AREA.

The W6AMT digipeater system, which stretches from the Mexican border almost to Oregon, is starting a test of "NET/ROM", a new firmware package for the TNC-2 which supports state-of-the-art networking capabilities (known as "layer 3 and 4" to those in-the-know). It's now up & running on W6AMT-0, -1, -2, -3 and -4, and will be on W6AMT-7 in the spring.

NET/ROM allows "store-&-forward" relaying rather than traditional multi-hop digipeating. This greatly decreases the amount of "garbage" on the channel. Routing between nodes is done automatically: each NET/ROM station "knows" all the other nearby nodes and routes. It even can detect equipment failures & re-route the circuit automatically, without the user even knowing what happened! Routing lists are automatically updated over the air every hour, so that whenever a new node comes online the whole system will know about it in a few hours.

The hardware supports multi-port (multi-frequency) nodes. For each additional port, you simply add a radio and a TNC, connected to the other TNC's by cables plugged into the RS-232 connectors. No hardware mods to the TNC are needed. Multi-porting allows linking between nodes via high-speed data links on another band, with 2 meters reserved for connecting to users. (Tnx W6IXU)

PICTURES VIA PACKET can be sent using TELIPAK, a system that allows amateurs to exchange high-resolution error-free, digital color images, text and speech. Developed by the Belleville TELIPAK group, it was demonstrated at the November meeting of the Kingston (Ontario) ARC by Syd Horne VE3EGO. (Tnx Gateway newsltr)

A MODEM FOR THE FUJI SATELLITE has been developed by TAPR, the group that invented the TNC-1/2. The unit interfaces with any TNC-1, TNC-2 or clone. Fuji's mode "JD" transponder allows worldwide message store-and-forwarding. (Tnx Westlink newsltr)

HOW TO SEND RADIOGRAMS VIA PACKET RADIO

Here is a short-form guide for handling NTS (ARRL National Traffic System) traffic on the linked automatic WestNet packet system. This is condensed from the HOWTO.NTS file by NI6A on the N6IIU Packet Bulletin Board System.

1. Unbundle Your Messages Please

One NTS message per BBS message. When you place two or more NTS messages destined for different addresses within one packet message, it must be broken up by either the BBS sysop (system operator) or the relay station, placing an unreasonable burden on them both. No "Book" messages unless they go to the same city.

2. NTS Packet Format = Same as CW Format

Packet NTS message format should be identical to the one used on CW. This allows easy transfer to CW and RTTY files.

3. Use the accepted designators.

Use State, Province, and U.S. Possession abbreviations as spelled out by the U.S. Post Office and the ARRL Net Directory. (See list elsewhere in this issue.)

No foreign (except Canada/US) NTS traffic should be relayed via the packet system at this time until proper routing designators and procedures are established.

California Designators:

Within California, additional designators are used as well, to permit efficient automatic forwarding:

SCN (Southern California net)
SCNSB (SCN Santa Barabara Section)
SCNSD (SCN San Diego Section)
NCN (Northern California net)
NCNSAC (NCN Sacramento Valley)
RN6 (Sixth Region net)
(NOTE: List traffic as RN6 if there is no known packet outlet.)
OFSSAC (Office of Emergency Services in

OESSAC (Office of Emergency Services in Sacramento)

REDCRS (Red Cross Western Operations Headquarters in Burlingame)

4. EXAMPLES:

NTS traffic must be entered on WORLI-compatible forwarding systems with the "ST" command. Examples:

"ST CA" <CR>
"QTC 1 San Francisco" <CR>

"ST CT" <CR>
"QTC 1 Podunk Ct" <CR>

"ST SCNSB" <CR>
"QTC 1 Lompoc Ca" <CR>

Remember to use the "T" in the "ST" command or your message cannot be killed with the "KT" command at the end point.

When you log onto the BBS, type the "LT" command to list all NTS traffic. To read message #123, type "R 123". If you can deliver it, type "KT 123" to kill the message so it won't be delivered twice. Do so only after you are sure you have a valid copy. On some systems, this also services a message back to the originator with the time the message was picked up and by whom.

SAMPLE OF A MESSAGE FOR GUIDANCE: (BOLDFACE is what you type, Normal type is sent by the BBS.)

Amateurs are encouraged to use the NTS frequently - the experience will be fun, and your friends will appreciate hearing from you. -- But, most important, the experience will also give you training for emergency communications (which all Amateurs should be able to work with when the occasion demands: Mexico City, etc.)




COMMODORE COMPUTER INFO

Here's a little help for all you packeteers trying to hook up the MFJ-1270 TNC to a Commodore 64 via the TTL port (without using an RS-232 interface). MFJ made one little mistake when they constructed the 1270: the male TTL connector on the back was installed upside down, so if you follow the TTL hook-up sequence given in Chapter 2 page 3, it will be backwards. To correct this problem, simply reverse the number sequence 8 through 1, and your problems are solved. Another small problem is with the DTR wire. After talking with MFJ, we found that most terminal programs will not work with the DTR wire connected. solved the problem by connecting it via a micro on/off switch, allowing me to use it or not, depending on the terminal program used. Well, packeteers, there you have it, straight from the guy who spent over 15 hours figuring out MFJ's little goof-up!

While on the subject of Commodore computers, when you start getting a lot of FILE NOT FOUND's, that is the tip-off that the drive may be out of alignment. (Commodore drives are famous for this.) There are several programs on the market that allow you to align your own drive, but most require taking the drive apart and making hardware adjustments. For those of you that choose not to attempt this sometimes-delicate job, you can take it to a repair center, which charges around \$35 - \$40. "A LITTLE PLUG FOR MYSELF", I do disk drive alignments for \$25, diagnosis for \$10, have a 1-day turn-around time, and guarantee my work for 90 days.
