# SCRA DX EVENT

25/50/25



SONOMA COUNTY RADIO AMATEURS 25/50/25 DX EVENT

- ACTIVITY PERIOD: This event will begin at 0001 UTC October 9, 1987 (SFM local time October 8) and ends 2359 UTC November 1, 1987 (S PM local time November 1).
- OBJECTIVE: Objective of this event is for club members with a Novice, Tech, or General Class license to work 25 DIFFERENT DX countries is 25 days. Club members with an Advanced or Extra class licenses will have to work 50 DIFFERENT DX countries during the same 25 day period.
- TYPE OF COMPETITION: This is a single operator event, you must operate your station without assistance. Contacts maybe made on SSB and/or CW. You may use any of the following bands: 1.8; 3.5; 7; 14; 21; or 28Mhz.
- 4. EXCHANGE RST and QTH. Be sure to maintain a separate log for this event. Acurrate entries are essential as in the event of a tie the log with the earliest time entry will be the winner.
- AWARDS Certificates will be awarded to the first Novice; first Tech and the first General to work 25 DX stations during the 25 day event. Certificates will also be awarded to the first Advanced and the first Extra to work 50 DX stations during this period. Additional awards will be given for the class of licenses working the MOST DX stations during the 25 day period.





### MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEETING OF SCRA, SEPTEMBER 2, 1987

The meeting was called to order by the President, Connie Freitas N6FYV, at 7:32 PM.

Warren WB6RHP made a motion to approve the August general meeting minutes as they appeared in Short Skip. Doug WW6D seconded the motion.

Phil N600A made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report, and Rudy N6KLU seconded it.

Al NIAL asked the club to decide on which radio they preferred as the grand prize at the Flea Market: an Alinco HT or a Kenwood TH-21AT. Jud N6QAV made a motion that the club approve the purchase of the Alinco from HSC with a vote of 22 to 5. Russ N6KMJ seconded it.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Hank W6DTV announced that there will be upgrade tests given the day of the Flea Market at the Sebastopol Fire House.

Steve WA8LLY asked people who attended the Club Picnic to check and see if they accidentally picked up some serving utensils that belong to him.

Steve also announced that Don WA6ACX will teach a Novice class and that Doug WW6D will assist. Steve WA8LLY will be willing to teach an Advanced class. He also is taking orders for ARRL Callbooks. They will be \$20.25 for both the US and DX books.

Lyle announced the next activity the club was sponsoring. It is a 25/50 in 25 days DX Contest. Novices, Techs, and Generals are to make 25 contacts, and Advanced and Extra class 50 contacts. It will begin on October 8 at 5:00 PM PTD.

Hoppy WD6CKP said the repeater is working fine, and there are no current problems.

Al NIAL reported that the packet station is still not quite ready for operation.

### CDF-VIP



At the meeting Sept OLUNTEER Darrell Mead announced that a new incident base radio is to be PREVENTION / installed at CDF HQ on Tuesday Sept 22. VIP's are invited to look on.

The question came up: Why were the Sonoma County VIP's not called up in the recent wildland fires that burned up thousands of acres in the Sierra's from California to Oregon?

There were a number of factors. First, it was not, for the most part, a CDF fire. "Only" 30,000 acres were under CDF jurisdiction, while over 600,000 acres (at last count) were being run by the US Forest Service.

CDF had plenty of help from the VIP units in the areas where the fires were located. (No fires in Sonoma Co.) The only exception was the Santa Clara VIP's were called out to make use of their packet radio and ATV, capabilities not yet in place here.

At the fire, Darrell offered our services to help with support functions (Fire Information, etc.). However, they had been wanting to get their non-professional CDF staff involved in these activities, so the offer was declined.

Darrell commented that before he calls us out, he wants an official order number. If you decide to go without an order, be aware you are truly "on your own". An official call-out is much better because 1) you will be covered by insurance, 2) you will be assigned a specific job with a specific supervisor, and 3) your time and location will be tracked, so if you get lost or into trouble, people know you're "out there" and can come help.

Don't forget the October 15 meeting: packet radio training. This includes instruction on how to "fly" the computer and special CDF forms software. See you there! - NlaL

Each year, SCRA makes an award to the most outstanding member of the club who has consistently and actively participated in Amateur Radio and club activities.

A committee has been formed to select the Member of the Year for 1987. The committee is made up of myself and two other members. We will be taking only written recommendations up to and including October 31. Recommendations received after Oct 31 will not be considered.

Your recommendation must state your candidate's name and your reasons for the nomination in sufficient detail to justify your recommendation. Nominations may only be made by paid-up club members. Only individual nominations will be accepted: Petitions will not be considered. Only voting members who have been club members for at least 1 year are eligible for the award. No person may receive the award more often than once every 3 years. [Previous winners: 1985: Betty AG6C & 1986: George KS6W - ed.]

The primary time period to be considered shall be from Nov 1, 1986 to Oct 31, 1987. Performance in prior years, however, may also be considered.

Criteria which the committee will consider are as follows:


- 1. Standards of operating ethics and practices, compliance with FCC requirements, exhibition of fair play, sportsmanship, and good operating practices at all times.



### HOW TO CALL CQ THROUGH NETROM

Here's a method for calling CQ through packet radio networks using NET/ROM (such as the W6AMT chain):

- 1. Connect to your local NET/ROM node.
- Establish a link to a distant "target" node.
- 3. Ask it to connect you to the call sign "CQ" with the following command:

"C CQ VIA FROM NETROM NODE xxx" where "xxx" is your local NET/ROM node. This will cause the target node to send out a connect request to the callsign "CQ" and route it via the digipeaters "FROM" "NETROM" "NODE" and "xxx". Of course, there aren't any digipeaters near the target node by these names, but people monitoring the channel there will see this and will know how to respond to you.


Some niceties of this method are:


- 1. The target node will send your "CQ" 10 times, then stop.
- 2. Because you have specified several "digipeaters" as shown above, the target node will pause for a short time between each CQ. This provides a means to spread your CQ out over several minutes. Without the extra digipeaters, it will transmit every 5 seconds or so.

IMPORTANT: Don't forget to enable multiple connects on your TNC so that if someone responds while you are still connected to the target node, you will accept his incoming connect and not give him a BUSY signal! This technique is being used successfully in Florida.




