We recently completed the last public service event of 1987. Thirteen events in all. The most activities that the club has ever participated in during a single year. There were walk-a-thons, bike-a-thons, a mini triathlon, running events, and even a parade.

A few more facts that may be of interest:

1. Forty five amateurs volunteered for one or more events.
2. One thousand four hours were devoted to preparing for and participating in these events.
3. We worked as far North as Cloverdale, as far South as Petaluma, as far East as Oakville, and as far West as Sea Ranch.
4. The thirteen events took place between April and November (no events in September.)
5. We used as few as five and as many as thirty one people on a single event.
6. The events lasted anywhere from two to sixteen hours in duration.
7. Volunteers worked from 2.5 to 17 hours on a single event.
8. We were instrumental in insuring the safety and well-being of thousands of participants and spectators.
9. Volunteers came from Santa Rosa, Petaluma, Sebastopol, Monte Rio, Windsor, Jenner, Penngrove, Glen Ellen, Kenwood and Bodega Bay.
10. SCRA members and non-members were both represented in these events.

You have, through your participation, gained the respect of all with whom you have come in contact. Every group sang your praises and requested our assistance again in 1988. In addition, a number of sponsors have advised me that they have recommended us to other organizations for their 1988 events. As a result, I predict that 1988 will be an even greater year for volunteer communications. WHAT A GREAT WAY TO PROMOTE AMATEUR RADIO !!!

A very special thanks to Marie KI6QY for her support throughout the year and for the many many hours she spent at the computer. Without her help, this task could not have been completed. [Ed note: this paragraph was "snuck in" in a hand-written note, so the typist wouldn't see it!]

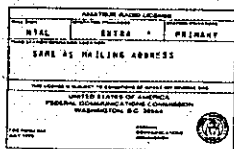
