





NOTES FROM THE O. T.

As the new year approaches, our club has a new set of officers to guide us through the new year. This new year is a little different than past years in that 1939 was the year the club (early SCRA) was first affiliated with the ARRL. That brings up a point of interest: In 1989, this club will have been with the ARRL for 50 years. The certificate is in the display case, found after being lost for many years. It sounds like some planning is in the future.

In those 50 years, many things have happened. In the first place, SCRA goes back longer than 50 years. The War placed a hold on club activities as well as on Amateur Radio activity for a few years. In the late 40's, several Amateurs got together at the QTH of Floyd Barnes W6ADM and talked about revitalizing the SCRA. Three of those amateurs are still members of SCRA. The club has progressed from this committee to the 195-200 members we now have.

The club's format has changed over the years from a more sociallyoriented one to a multi-activity or Special Service Club. Now with nearly
200 members, perhaps change is in view. When only around 25% of the club
is active, regardless of the activity, it means 75% do not participate in
any activity. Why? Well, maybe some come just for the monthly programs.
Others receive all the information they need from our informative monthly
Short Skip. Some are interested only in the repeater and phone patch. We
see some members once a year at the Field Day activity or at the annual
flea market.

Is this enough, or should we strive to find some more creative and interesting programs? Last year a WAS contest attracted only about a dozen participants. The DX contest later had an attendance of only 5 or 6, so I think you can see we need something to provide progress in the club.

Now, as a club member, think it over and see if you can come up with an outstanding activity that would move the club membership. As a commercial on TV says, "All we need is one good idea a meeting." Just think what the Board of Directors would say if each member sent a new, interesting activity or idea to them. They would be floored.

Two of our members revised the Public Service activity this year, and it worked like a charm. We only had 25% of the club to work with, but it's a start.

Think this over, and send a letter to SCRA at Box 116, Santa Rosa, CA 95402, and astound the Board for next year.



FBI JAMMER PLEADS GUILTY. Jerry Gastil K6DYD pled guilty on Nov 27 to one felony count of jamming FBI communications. Sentencing is set for Jan 25. He could receive up to 10 years in jail and a \$10,000 fine plus loss of ham & commercial licenses. (Westlink)

CANADA/USSR THIRD-PARTY TRAFFIC will be allowed for the joint Canadian-Russian Skitrek expedition.

Extensive use will be made of the OSCAR 11 satellite for navigation, and the UOSAT-2 digitalker will broadcast the skiers' position. The polar-orbiting satellite will be in sight on every orbit. ICOM America has provided micro 2AT HT's for the team. (Westlink)

SCRA GETS A NEW CALLSIGN. On Sept 3 thru 9, W6LFJ will become W2ØØLFJ in honor of the bicentennial of the US Constitution. Originally, FCC had proposed authorizing only club stations located in state capitals, but a couple weeks ago, ARRL HQ was notified that all clubs who had previously registered would be included. 
Germany has no Novice license which is a handicap in recruiting young people.




