## BALUN COIL AND MATCHING NETWORK



L1 - 2 turns #14 Formvar 1-1/16" dia PVC (matching network). L2 - same, but 10 turns (balun 1:1 3.5-30 MHz). C1 fixed mica (360 pF @ 14.2 MHz). Tnx Jack Reeder W6NGZ.

## **HOMEBREW CONTEST**

The HOMEBREW CONTEST was judged by Bill K9ASL and Rick K6ZWB. We had many quality entries this year:

Not really an entry, but very interesting never the less, was W6AHH's TRANSMITTER built in the engine room of the SS Glymont in 1931. It uses a single 210 tube.

Of more recent vintage was W6CCY's 1952 Two meter (AM) transceiver built from a C0 article. 15 of these were built locally.

A QUAD that isn't really a quad was shown by Bill WA60LW. This all-driven-element array works from 144-450 MHz and is a prototype of a larger HF version. Gain is 6-9 dB.

An OPTO-ELECTRONIC STRAIGHT KEY built by Dave KM6QO (woodworking) and John WB6FRZ (electronics) had a great "gee whiz" factor.

CAST ALUMINUM CLAMPS for mounting boom to mast and boom to elements were the first of three submission by Jack W6NTZ. These were massive parts, designed for a 3 inch boom. Jack also made one of epoxy for the insulated driven element.

A REMOTE-CONTROL IMPEDANCE BRIDGE allows you to measure antenna impedance right at the antenna feedpoint.

A BALUN COIL & MATCHING NETWORK combo helps maintain low SWR on 20 meters.

A very nice **KEYER PADDLE** was built from scratch by Linda WB6TMM.

A 2.6 GHz RADAR GUN, using tiny surface-mounted parts was carefully assembled from a kit by Merlyn N6VUC.

Another **KEYER PADDLE** was crafted by Doug KC6RHA.

A 20-900 MHz **SPECTRUM ANALYZER** was designed and built by Phil KC6BSI. It uses a TV VHF/UHF tuner and IF and is built into an old RCA oscilloscope.

A **HEADSET AND RADIO INTERFACE** was presented by Brian N6IIY.

A RAMSEY 2 METER AMPLIFIER kit was built by Ted KB6PTA. Ted added a cabinet and T/R switching relay circuit.

Identical 80-10 METER HF AMPLIFIERS were built by the father/son team of Charlie KK6WN and Steve KK6VY. They use four 811A tubes and many junk box parts scrounged from several club members.


TWO CW KEYERS, one from 20 years ago and one from 10 years ago were shown by Al N1AL. Al also had a digital logic probe.

Another PACKET NODE is now up in Pt. Reyes, per WX3K: N6MIH-3 "REYES".


N6UYB is leaving for Kentucky May 4th.

## **HAPTest 92**



Three things hams like best are to eat, socialize, and play with their radios. Based on this premise, the nth quasi-annual Chicken Net Barbecue took place on April 5th at the Russian River Campground in Forestville. N6VUD Allan supplied the pop, beer, and chicken; and everyone else brought potluck dishes and contributions.

Some fifty Chicken Netters enjoyed each other's good company and festivities. The formal event for the day was the HT Antenna Performance Test, or HAPTest 92. The objective was to answer the question, "which antenna really works best on a HT?" -- and, to have a little fun at the same time.

Awards fell into several general categories: antenna performance, best this or that, and fraud (an area of heavy participation). KC6PJW Jim won Best Antenna with his HT-mounted roof-top Diamond X-50. The half-wave antennas performed best of all practical mounts, the rubber duck/dangler combo first, followed close by Hot Rod half-waves.

Flagrant fraud and hoaxes made judging a challenge, but judges N6ZME Reed, KK6YZ Dave, KC6FKX Laurel, and KD6FYK Steve feel that justice was eventually served. KC6PJV Jeff and KC6PJW Jim kept the judges guessing

by falsifying evaluation forms, battery switching, keying mobile rigs, and (best of all) a generous bribe.




## FIELD DAY MEETING - NOVICE AND TECHNICIAN STATION(S)


- 1. When and where the event will happen.

- 11. Anything else you can think of.






## WHAT'S FIELD DAY ALL ABOUT?

For the benefit of those of you unfamiliar with the club activity called "Field Day", I would like to explain. Quite simply, Field Day is a contest sponsored by the ARRL (American Radio Relay League) that is meant to test the emergency capabilities of amateur radio operators throughout our country.

#### A NATIONWIDE EVENT

It is, therefore, not "just" an SCRA club event, vut is national in scope! Once each year, hams from all over the United States head out into the field (quite literally). They assemble shelters and kitchens, put up antennas, set up radios, operate for a 24-hour period (non-stop) using emergency power, and try to contact as many other hams as possible.

Field Day is a contest, and contests are happening all the time in ham radio. But this is special for at least the following five reasons:

#### **EMERGENCY TRAINING**

First, one of the purposes for the existence of amateur radio is our ability to respond in time of communications emergency. This event is designed specifically to exercise that ability.

Second, our technical abilities are tested in a wide variety of ways. When you have ten ham radios operating at the same time using antennas that are close to each other, you are inviting interference problems and equipment failures of all types that must be dealt with. These problems must be repaired quickly or you are off the air and out of business.

### LEARN NEW OPERATING SKILLS

Third, there is a science to operating quickly, efficiently, and effectively. There are clubs that use automated memory keyers and a linked computer system with terminals at each operating position to automatically log stations and check duplicate contacts. Clubs of this type -- the local REDXA (Redwood Empire DX Association) comes immediately to mind -- use a myriad of methods to make an absolute maximum number of contacts (and points) within the 24-hour time period. And they are very good at it! The REDXA (pronounced "red-ex"), has been in friendly competition with SCRA for several years now to see who can make the most points during Field Day.

### PUBLIC RELATIONS

Fourth, the event provides for spectacular public interest stories in local papers and other news media. It puts amateur radio in a good light in front of the public and generates sympathetic support towards the hobby. Extra points are awarded to groups that encourage news media coverage during the event.

Fifth, Field Day promotes club spirit. There's nothing like people working together with ham radio during a summertime camp out to build team spirit and friendships within a club. We plan to hold our traditional Saturday evening dinner at the Field Day site. All members and their families are invited to partake.

Past Field Day sites have included:


A mountain peak above Sugarloaf State Park A picnic site at Two-Rock Coast Guard Station Ragle Park in Sebastopol
