No More Heathkits!

Before there were nerds, before there was a Silicon Valley, there were Heathkits, which let tens of thousands of ambitious amateurs and aspiring engineers build their own radios, televisions and other electronic equipment.

But this month, after 45 years in the business, the Heath Co. is closing out the last of its kits to concentrate on faster-selling home-improvement and educational materials.

Heath's kit sales have steadily declined since 1981, victims of reduced leisure time, declining prices that make it cheaper to buy than to build, and the seduction of technically-oriented consumers by personal computers. [And by Heath's rising prices and declining quality! - Ed.]

Heath's phasing out its kits "leaves the amateur, like me, no place to turn," said former Sen. Barry Goldwater, who used to fly to Heath's headquarters in Benton Harbor Mich twice a year in his private plane to buy kits.

Heath had a dozen or more competitors in its heyday, the mid-1960s, but it is the last large company to leave the kit business. Electronic do-it-yourselfers must now work from scratch, or from plans in magazines like Audio Amateur and Speaker Builder. [Or Ramsey, or Radiokit or several other kit companies. -Ed]

The kits were designed to be buildable by anyone with opposable thumbs. One did not need to know the difference between a resistor and a capacitor; only how to follow the step-by-step instructions and make a clean solder joint.

Nevertheless, Heathkits provided a hands-on introduction to electronics that could not be found in textbooks. By making the technology non-intimidating, Heath made it accessible to thousands of potential engineers.

Founded by a former barnstormer named Ed Heath, the company began in Chicago in 1926 by selling airplanes in kits. After Heath died in a crash on a test flight, a new investor, Howard Anthony, reorganized the company, moved it to Benton Harbor, and expanded into

the electronics business with a line of twoway aircraft radios. The first kit for an electronic product, a five-inch oscilloscope, was introduced late in 1947 for \$39.95.

Heath was an early player in the PC business, and it was its computer unit, Heath Data Systems, that prompted Zenith Electronics to acquire the company in 1979 for \$63 million. From that core grew Zenith Data Systems, now a unit of Groupe Bull of France, with annual revenues of \$1 billion.

But the PC revolution was in some ways a death blow to Heathkits because it siphoned off the most enthusiastic kit builders. The kinds of people who used to build stereo amplifier kits learned how to program and now spend their leisure time writing software. But Heathkit lovers say writing software is a cold, cerebral pursuit that will never match the allure of tubes, transistors and circuit boards.

"Every kid should try picking up a little soldering pencil, smelling the smoke in the room, and running a wire from point A to point B," said Gary Staton, an immigration investigator in Honolulu who has built nearly 200 Heathkits. "When you're done and it works, there's no competition from the assembly-line products. They don't compare in any way." The Steve WASLLY


The next FOX HUNT will be sponsored by the previous winners, N6PTM and W6DTV.
