


RACES News: Earthquake Expo

Other officers present: Secretary Al Bloom N1AL, Treasurer John Gauger KK6XT, Repeater Chairman Jim Rutherford WB6PER, Activities Chairman Jim Pelmulder N6PTM, and Members-at-Large Bill Splaine N6GHG and Gary Gouger KC6WTE.

VISITORS: We had 14 visitors tonight.

The **MINUTES** were approved as published in last month's *Short Skip*. m/s N6KZS/WB6TMY

The TREASURER'S REPORT was similarly approved. m/s WD6CKP/KD6HQ.

UPGRADES & NEW CALLS included KD6GCD to Tech-plus, N6QAV to Advanced, KC6WTJ to General and two others.

PUBLIC SERVICE: Steve KK6VY announced the upcoming Earthquake Expo on Oct 10. We need 4 volunteers to man the RACES comm trailer, OES-1.

W0CF, Tom Ware recently became a silent key, according to Hank W6DTV. Tom was a member of SCRA 30 years ago when he donated the big generator/trailer that we still use on Field Day.

Another ex-member, Joel Potts WB6PDP, is in Quito Ecuador as head tech for the religious shortwave station HCJB. They run a ham radio program weekly.

JOTA, the Jamboree On The Air is coming up. Jim WA2EWE will run a Field-Day-type operation with 3 SCRA members.

W5YI's petition for changing the license structure was made available to any members interested.

The TREASURER'S REPORT by KK6XT included a summary of Field Day finances. Shelly KD6AFZ and Megan KD6BUW really worked the crowd selling raffle tickets -- we netted \$842 on this item alone.

EDUCATION: Tracy WB6TMY's last student has passed his Novice test. Tracy showed an example of a carved wooden callsign made by his student Mike Michlig. John WB6FRZ had 23 students at his first Novice/Tech class last Friday. Steve KK6VY is planning an MS-DOS Windows class that would run 4-5 sessions. Also Rick K6ZWB will be starting his construction class soon.

A NEW EDUCATION COORDINATOR is needed as John WB6FRZ is stepping down. This person keeps the list of those wanting classes and gets them together with the instructors.

VE EXAMS: Dave AA6YX reported that the volunteer exam session at the flea market had 34 applicants. 65% got a new license: 13 Technician, 5 Tech+, 2 General, 1 Advanced. Of the 59 elements taken, 47 passed (80%). Thanks to KK6XT, N1AL, AB6OL, WX3K, KC7VS, N6OLD and AA6YX.

From now on, we will be scheduling our exams in cooperation with other VE teams in Marin, Sonoma, and Napa Counties for maximum coverage and efficiency.

The PITA BREAD award was presented by Dave KD6KWM to Bill N6GHG for valorous duty as public service Net Control Station.

MEMBERSHIP SUPPLIES are being investigated by Gary KC6WTE. Discussion followed on what types of items (with club logo) should be purchased.

The CLUB CAMPOUT is this weekend at Sugarloaf Park. Dinner Saturday night. Jim WB6PER is the trail boss.

The PROGRAM was an enlightening slide presentation by Rick K6ZWB (professional cellular radio technician) on mobile antennas.

Walt KA6DJY would have won \$30.85 in the MEMBER LOTTERY had he been present.



VSWR — **Exploring the Myth**

Unlike politics and religion, the laws of physics are not subject to interpretation.

The most common disregard for this statement takes place during conversations held between mis-informed Amateur Radio operators concerning HF antenna systems. Set forth below are 8 facts to expel the great myths regarding the importance, or lack thereof, of VSWR in antenna systems that function below 30 MHz. Support of these facts can be found in publications by Walter Maxwell, Kurt N. Sterba and recent editions of the ARRL Antenna Book.

FACT 1. The presence of SWR does not, in itself, cause an RF power loss.

FACT 2. Reducing the SWR below 2:1 will not significantly increase the antenna radiation below 30 MHz.

FACT 3. A low VSWR over a wide frequency range does not mean the antenna is efficient.

FACT 4. Adjustment of a transmatch at the transmitter end of the feedline does not correct a mis-match at the antenna.

FACT 5. A high SWR does not cause the feedline to radiate.

FACT 6. In order for an SWR meter to be accurate, it must be designed for the impedance of the feedline with which it is used.

FACT 7. A high VSWR does not cause TVI and RFI.

FACT 8. Changing the feedline length does not change the SWR.
