Alan Bloom N1AL for his duties as *Short Skip* editor and Secretary.

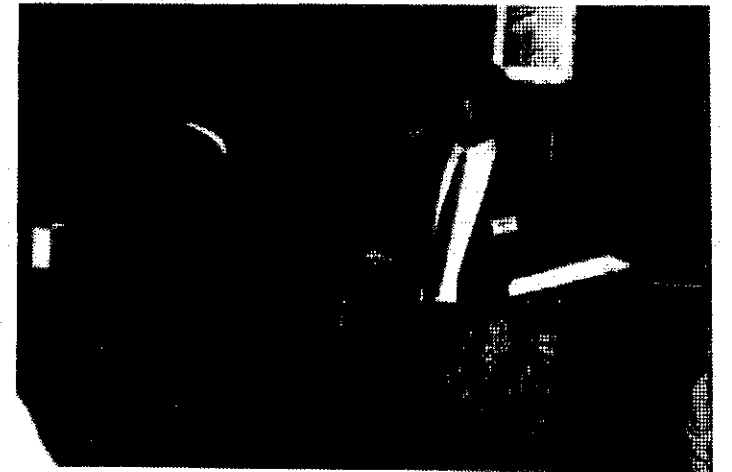
And Merlyn Pfeiff for the great job he did as President this year.

Merl N6VUC and last year's President Jim Pelmulder N6PTM shared the club of the year award that was presented at the ARRL Division convention.

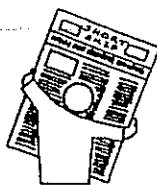


John Breckenridge WB6FRZ is responsible for many of the new Novice and Technician licenses that have been issued in Sonoma County over the past few years.

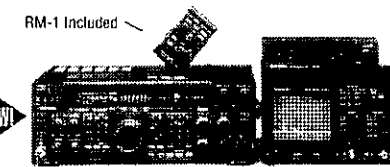

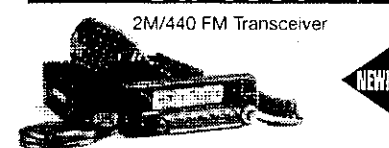

Be Alert For Passivated Glass

The metallic content of passivated glass, installed on many new cars, impedes the performance of antennas installed on glass. That's all brands of antennas.

Available on numerous models of General Motors, Ford and Chrysler Corporation cars, passivated glass has a high metallic content to help block sunlight. Unfortunately, it's equally effective at blocking radio waves.

Alternatives include using traditional mobile mounts, or purchasing a car without passivated glass. For information, check the glass index on the corner of the windshield or call the manufacturer.

DO

- Clean glass with Bon Ami. It's great at removing car wash wax and road spray chemicals.

- Use adhesive enhancers. Products such as Tite-R-Bond (just spread on and let dry completely) give tape an even better grip on today's smoother glass.

DON'T

- Cut coax. It disrupts wave pattern in cable.
- Trim whips (unless cutting chart is enclosed). It degrades transmit performance.

It's LiTZ! FM/RPT

Repeaters are indispensable tools for letting Amateur Radio operators provide mutual assistance and public service emergency communications. Most hams don't bother to monitor their local VHF/UHF repeaters at all times, however, because they don't care to listen to the noise and chatter of routine conversations. This means that if a situation arises when assistance is needed, there may not be anyone listening who can respond. It's easy to set up a system to allow those who wish to be available in times of need to be alerted to an important call, but the question is, "How do we make sure most hams know it exists and how to use it?"

The FM/RPT column in December 1989 QST raised this question and solicited suggestions for establishing a "universal" method of getting a response to a call for assistance on a repeater. This generated a huge pile of mail, and many intriguing techniques were described by repeater owners and users. Regardless of the particular system proposed, however, most hams who wrote in agreed that, no matter which one was chosen, at least some standard was necessary. To resolve this matter, the ARRL Board of Directors asked the Public Service Advisory Committee (PSAC) to study the issues and make a recommendation.

PSAC Chairman Dave Kersten, N8AUH,

reviewed the correspondence and solicited input from Committee representatives from all League Divisions, and from members and repeaters operators all over the US. The consensus was that the Long Tone Zero (LiTZ) tone-alerting system, where an operator sends a touchtone "0" over a repeater for at least three seconds to activate an alerting system (described in the August and November 1991 FM/RPT columns), was supported by the majority of League members who took the time to express their preferences to the PSAC.

At its semiannual meeting July 17-18, the ARRL Board of Directors voted to adopt the Committee's recommendation to endorse LiTZ as the national alerting system for repeaters. Furthermore, repeaters that support LiTZ will be so indicated in the ARRL Repeater Directory.

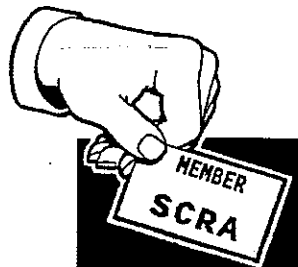
Although the ARRL encourages repeater operators to take advantage of LiTZ alerting, compliance is an optional, voluntary decision. Repeater operators are by no means compelled to provide this capability, nor are they prohibited from choosing alternate ways of making their repeaters accessible or to simply ignore the issue. Adoption of the LiTZ system is a response to members' requests that the League establish a uniform starting point for help-

ing repeater users respond to calls for aid. Implementation is not specified: Amateurs who wish to participate in the LiTZ system may configure it in any way they desire, eg, to unmute a receiver, to initiate a telephone call to a designated operator, to activate a paging system, or in any legal manner their creative abilities might devise.

The point of having the LiTZ alerting system available is *not* to offer a way for hams to initiate routine contacts for rag-chewing or other nonessential communications. It's to be used *only* in emergencies or to summon assistance when absolutely necessary. Amateurs are cautioned to employ conservative, critical judgment of whether a specific situation calls for LiTZ access. Chronic instances of "crying wolf" or other misuse will undermine the plan's purpose and ultimately lead to its abandonment.

If you use, or plan to use, the LiTZ alert system on your local repeater, how do you do it? Have you built an activation circuit into the repeater controller? Do individual amateurs use their own decoding devices? Send us your ideas, to be shared with your fellow amateurs. We'll publish as many sound, practical designs as space permits. Perhaps you'll suggest—or find out about—a unique way to make the most of this new ARRL recommendation.
