





Revocation or suspension of the license may result when correspondence from the FCC is returned as undeliverable because the person failed to provide the correct mailing address."

CALL SIGNS ON THE INTERNET

This callsign database is updated DAILY and is derived from the FCC database. It can be a usefull resource for new hams waiting for their license as well as old hams waiting for an upgrade. Under the new rules, as soon as you know your call, you can begin using it and its privilages.

Ham License Plates

Have you ever considered getting Ham license plates, but were afraid to ask HOW MUCH?

Regular personalized plates cost \$41 initially and an extra \$25 every year. Ham plates, which are a type of special interest plate, cost \$21 initially and have NO annual surcharge. Not a bad deal...

The folks at the DMV can get you fixed up with the proper form to fill out. Just ask for an Amateur Radio license plate form. You must supply a copy of your FCC license to accompany the paperwork.







Sky search gets name

A name and starting date have been chosen for a radio astronomy project that aims to involve large numbers of radio amateurs.

The SETI League has chosen "Project Argus" as the name for its upcoming search for extraterrestrial intelligence (SETI). The SETI League hopes eventually to involve 5000 amateurs worldwide in scanning the sky. Earth Day, April 21, 1996, is the target date for beginning the project.

The name Argus was chosen in 1971 at Stanford University for a proposed ultimate SETI receiver that was never funded. Argus was a mythological figure with 100 eyes that could look in all directions at once.

Dr Robert Dixon, W8ERD, a SETI League advisor and assistant director of the Ohio State University Radio Observatory, hopes to share technology with the SETI League, according to SETI League Executive Director Paul Shuch, N6TX.

Sunspot hints new cycle

Astronomers at the California Institute of Technology say they have identified the first new sunspot in the next sunspot cycle.

Scientists at Caltech's Big Bear Solar Observatory in Big Bear City, California, photographed the spot on August 12.

"This makes us happy," said Hal Zirin, professor of astrophysics at Caltech and director of the Big Bear facility. "The sun is a lot more interesting to study when things are going on."

Early in the 11-year sunspot cycle, sunspots appear rarely and at relatively high solar latitudes around 30 to 35 degrees, then increase in frequency and appear at lower latitudes until they reach sunspot maximum, Caltech said. After this peak in activity, the number of sunspots slowly declines, and they appear ever closer to the sun's equator until they reach a relatively quiet phase called sunspot minimum.

The sun has been in a quiet period through much of 1994 and this year, with a few spots showing up near the equator. The new sunspot found on August 12 appeared at a solar latitude of 21 degrees, and its magnetic polarity is opposite to that seen over the last decade, a key to identifying it as "the manifestation" of the start of anew cycle, Caltech said.

Scientists at Caltech said they expected an early beginning to Cycle 23, but not this early. "Sunspots in the new cycle should rapidly become more common and reach a high level of activity in 1998 or 1999," Caltech said.

WRTC-96 Makes Plans

The Northern California Contest Club (NCCC) has selected judges for the World Radiosport Team Championship (WRTC-96) competition, scheduled for July 13 and 14, 1996, in the San Francisco Bay area, and has announced the rules for the event.

According to NCCC President Ken Silverman, WM2C, since the WRTC competition takes place within the IARU HF World Championship, WRTC rules will follow suit as much as possible. Each of the 52 WRTC teams will compete as a two-person, multi-single contest entry, running a maximum of 100 watts output. WRTC competitors will be limited to 18 hours (from 1200 UTC Saturday to 0600 UTC Sunday), and will use only the 40, 20, 15 and 10 meter bands.

Lew Gordon, K4VX, will head WRTC-96's Judging Committee as chief judge. Additional judges will be Roger Western, G3SXW, "Bear"Kumagai, JA7RHJ, Fred Laun, K3ZO, Dick Frey, K4XU, Tom Taormina, K5RC, Glenn Rattmann, K6NA, Gene Walsh, N2AA, Dick Norton, N6AA, Phil Goetz, N6ZZ, Ville Hillesmaa, OH2MM, Tine Brajnik, S50A, John Brosnahan, W0UN, and Rush Drake, W7RM.

The WRTC, first held in Seattle, Washington, in 1990, pits two-person teams comprised of some of the world's top operators in ahead-to-head competition. To emphasize operator ability, each team runs the same transmitter power and operates from stations having similar antenna systems and located in the same geographical area.
