





The following is the proposed draft antenna ordinance for the city of Santa Rosa, which has been sent to Wayne Goldberg, Director of Community Development by Bruce Leavitt, Assistant City Attorney. Thanks to Joe KM6TN for submitting a copy for publication.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTA ROSA AMENDING SECTION 2005.725 OF THE SANTA ROSA CITY CODE AND ADDING PERMIT EXEMPTIONS TO THE UNIFORM BUILDING CODE RELATING TO **CERTAIN ANTENNAS**

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF SANTA ROSA DO ENACT THE FOLLOWING:

Section I. Subsection E is added to section 20-05.725 of the Santa Rosa City Code to read as follows:

"E. The provisions of subsection A shall not apply to antennas installed for use with federally-licensed amateur radio facilities by an amateur radio operator licensed by the Federal Communications Commission as follows:

- (a) An antenna installed on, or attached to, an existing building or structure when the antenna, together with its supporting tower, pole or mast, does not exceed a height of 25 feet above the highest part of the building or structure to which it is, or will be, attached.
- (b) A freestanding antenna together with its supporting tower, pole, or mast, which does not exceed a height of 75 feet above the level of the ground or grade at the installation site.
- (1) A conditional use permit is required for any freestanding antenna where the completed height of the antenna and its supporting tower, pole or mast exceeds a height of 75 feet above ground level at the installation site.
- (c) No part of the antenna installation may overhang a property line unless the affected adjacent property owner has given written consent to the encroachment and the consent has been recorded in the Office of the Sonoma County Recorder. Any consent given under this subsection shall set forth a procedure by which the consent may be terminated.

Section 2. Section 18-16.018 is added to the Santa Rosa City Code to read as follows:

"Section 18-16.018. Section 301(b), Work Exempt from Permit, of the Uniform Building Code is amended to add subsections 12 and 13 to read:

- 12. Antennas and their supporting tower, pole or mast, if any, which are described in subsection (a) of section 20-05.725-E of the Santa Rosa City Code, provided the antenna does not include a supporting tower, pole, or mast, the height of which exceeds the highest part of the building or structure by more than 25 feet and provided, further, the installation of the antenna, tower, pole or mast dos not require a structural modification of the existing building or structure to which the antenna, tower, pole or mast is, or will, be attached.
- 13. Freestanding antennas and their supporting tower, pole or mast which are described in subsection (b) of section 20-05.725-E of the Santa Rosa City Code, provided the height of the antenna, tower, pole or mast does not exceed a height of 25 feet above the level of the ground or grade at the installation site."
 - Section 3. This ordinance shall become effective on the 31st day following its adoption.

ALONE WITH **MY RADIO...**

SHORT SKIP

Driving over 3,000 miles alone in a rental truck over five days sounds to my wife like the ultimate form of punishment, but I couldn't wait!

I always did have a hard time using my radio in the car while on a family outing, or for that matter with any non-hams in the car - almost like I was ignoring my passengers for the invisible co-traveller in the ether.

But now I would be alone for five whole days, alone with my radio and all the hams with funny accents I could contact, 24 hours a day if I liked. Oh yeah, driving 16 hours a day too, but that was beside the point. A small price to pay for the mix of solitude and companionship which blend together so nicely when one hooks up one of those little black metal boxes to the vehicle's battery.

And of course the antenna - a mag mount - shouldn't be too hard. Well, with a metal vehicle it shouldn't be too hard! Try fiberglass and plastic! I figured that the cargo portion of the rental truck was fiberglass, so no big surprise there. But I did not figure on the hood being plastic. It's funny how a heavy mag mount just slides down the front of the plastic body; and it looks so compatible!

The solution: a top-fed inverted triband omnidirectional whip (I stuck the antenna in the cargo area upside down from the metal bar on the roof). Worked great. Didn't get a single 1.2 gigahertz contact at all between Florida and California. I did raise two or three repeaters, but not a sole came back to me on them. 440: First contact in New Mexico - day 3 of the trip. And even then a rare one.

Quite simply, everyone uses 2 meters in the rest of country. because they haven't yet been crowded out of it. In New Mexico and Arizona there's an extremely wide-coverage 2meter system, with something like 12 different high elevation machines all linked together simultaneously. Can you imagine 12 Bay area 2-meter machines linked together? But on the ZIA link there are plenty of open spaces, and when two stations get into a chat, no-one seems to get annoyed that they are hogging the repeaters. They leave long-enough pauses for breaking stations, and just keep on chatting. It's pretty neat being in El Paso, Texas and getting someone on the repeater to make a local call for you in Santa Fe, New Mexico!

Even before I became acquainted with the ZIA link, I had the opportunity to benefit from having my radio with me. I thought I had studied the map of San Antonio well enough at the rest stop before approaching the city, but I did manage to miss my exit, and when you're driving a 15 foot truck towing a similar length trailer, you don't try to read the map while in motion! Fortunately I heard some hams on a local machine, and after breaking in and explaining my predicament, they turned me around and got me going in the right direction again.

Once, while talking with someone I had just met and telling them how a was driving this yellow truck towing a red car, he passed me on the opposite side of the highway. Not too unusual I suppose, but when I passed a Suzuki Samurai and he immediately passed me in return, and turned on his inside light as he passed my cab, I figured either I was about to be shot for being so rude as to pass him, or or he was a ham who couldn't hit the repeater he heard me on and was dangling his mike in the window so I would call him on 6.52 simplex! We chatted for the next 45 minutes.

I found Alabama and Mississippi to be friendly enough, getting responses to my "mobile and listening" calls about as often as I wanted to. But the big mystery to me is: how come no-one in Louisiana wanted to talk to a 6-call the day I drove through?





Autopatch Update by Jim WB6PER

In an effort to make the 146.73 autopatch more user friendly and provide better service to more members, some changes in policy have been made. These changes will allow users to make autopatch calls without the number being read back by the repeater, thus providing more security for sensitive phone numbers.

Also the area of coverage has been expanded to provide all members phone access to all numbers in the 707 area code. Some of our members live outside of Sonoma County and up until now they have not had autopatch priviliges. Until now only phone calls within Sonoma County were allowed.

As of now the following procedures will apply:

Any phone call in the 707 area code will be allowed. This includes Solano, Napa, Lake and Mendocino as well as Sonoma County. In fact if you look at page A-27 of your phone book you will see that the area code 707, goes all the way to the Oregon/California border, between the coast and highway 5. The repeater will not respond to any call that starts with a one or zero, thus elimenating calls outside of the authorized calling area. Remember, the autopatch is for non commercial use, when a land line phone is not available. Abuse it you loose it.

The second user function that has been authorized is the autopatch hide function. When you dial a number on the patch the number reads back so you can make sure you dialed the proper number. This is a good idea, it keeps wrong numbers from being dialed. However, if you are sensitive about the numbers you dial, you may keep the number from being read back by keying your mic for one second immediately after the repeater says "autopatch" and before it reads back the number. Example: Key your radio, give your call sign, enter the autopatch code, enter the phone number, the repeater says "autopatch", key your mic for one second, there is silence as the repeater dials the number. In most cases it isn't worth worrying about, but if you do not want the number to be said on the air, use the above procedure.

If you do not want your autoslot number read back, let me know and I can program your slot so that the slot number does not read back on the air. You can contact me at:Jim_WB6PER@MSN.COM or on packet at KWDBB on 144.91.

Give these new functions a try if you think you will want to use them so you can feel comfortable with them. If you have any questions or comments please contact me at one of the above addresses or by phone at 526-2972.

The first **QUARTERLY RAFFLE** drawing is next month. Tickets are \$1 each, \$5/7 or \$10/15.

DUES: Steve KK6VY presented the following possible expenditures that are in addition to normal SCRA expenses: Annual expenses:

\$300 Maintenance (new repeaters)

\$300 Telephone bills

\$600 Misc (Portable tower, RACES support, packet BBS, etc.)

County-required upgrades to Sonoma Mt. antennas:

\$500 New antenna system

\$500 Triplexers

\$900 Cabling and connectors

\$200 Standoffs

\$800 New 440 MHz controller

\$250 Safety belt

Equipment required to secure site on English hill: \$1000

Assuming we buy these items over the course of two years, that works out to an extra \$3275 per year. With 300 members, a dues increase of \$11/year would cover it. It was moved and seconded to raise dues from the current \$12 to \$24 per year. m/s KH6GJV/WB6PER

Considerable discussion followed. Jim N6PTM feels we do need a dues increase, but \$16 would be a adequate. N1AL recommends \$18, so the pro-rated dues for new members would be easier to calculate (\$1.50 per month). Tracy WB6TMY wonders how many members we lose per dollar increase. Ted KB6PTA feels that \$16 is a bargain. KK6VY noted that dinner tonight cost nearly the \$24 suggested for dues. Susan N6IRJ noted that other high-level repeater clubs in the area charge \$24-\$25, which is about 8 cents a day. Darlene KD6GCK says \$24 would be OK with special provision for low-income members. WB6PER feels that \$24 dues is right for a club that is going someplace. Jim KC6PJW notes there are lots of projects such as the packet BBS's that the club could contribute to.

KJ6LF then moved to amend the motion to set the new dues level at \$18 per year. m/s KJ6LF/N1AL

After further discussion, the club voted in favor of the amendment 25 to 20. Then the club voted in favor of the original motion, as amended, by a vote of 22 to 21. So dues next year will be \$18. WB6PER said he voted against the motion because \$18 is not enough to accomplish our goals.



October 11, 1995



Minutes of the Sonoma County Radio Amateurs board meeting held November 6, 1995 at the Northbay Savings Bank community room. Members of the board present were: President Kelly KD6CJQ, Treasurer Angela KC6OCD, Repeater Chairman Jim WB6PER, Activities Chairman Joel KJ6LF, Member-at-large Marie KI6QY and Merl N6VUC. There were also 9 other SCRA members present.

The meeting was called to order at 5:40 PM by President Kelly KD6CJQ.

Angela KC6OCD indicated a need to go over the \$250.00 budgeted for the end of the year awards due to 2 extra awards that were not anticipated at the time the funds were allocated. Jim WB6PER moved that the extra funds be expended, seconded by Angela KC6OCD. Motion carried. Angela will also be arriving early at Cattlemen's for the Christmas Dinner to greet and collect funds for the dinner.

Jim WB6PER proposed that the repeater controller be configured to allow all 707 area codes to be accessed by autopatch and to allow phone number announcements to be masked if desired. There were no objections to his proposal. He will implement the changes and write an article for *Short Skip* explaining the details of the changes.

Marie KI6QY informed the board that 1160 hours of service were given by members of SCRA during the 1995 Public Service season.
