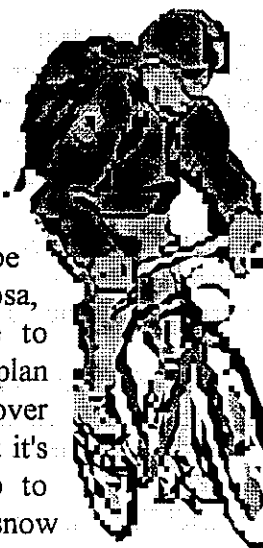
Hello Everyone,

It's time to get serious about our cross country bike trip. It's Wednesday evening and on Saturday morning Alan Bloom (N1AL) and I (N6LAJ) will be leave our homes in Santa Rosa, California and start our ride to Gettysburg Pennsylvania. We plan on riding thru Yosemite then over Tioga pass, but at the moment it's raining. Tioga pass goes up to 10000 feet in elevation, and the snow level is down to 7000 feet. Caltrans does plan on having Tioga Pass open on the 22nd, but that plan was made before this storm. So much for plans! Some how we are going to get out there, but were not exactly sure of the route yet. We will pass thru Death Valley, Zion, and the North Rim of the Grand Canyon. From there we plan on basically taking highway 64 over to the Shenandoah mountains, then go North to Pennsylvania. All this is assuming we can figure out how to get out of California.

We are taking an HP Palmtop computer with us, and will be sending radio information out to this distribution. We have not talked about a schedule for our transmissions, but Alan is bringing along a 2 watt CW DX rig. We will definitely be active on field day, and probably on a regular schedule once we get settled into a pattern. Alan will be on 20, 40 and 80 meters. We will let you know what we will be doing if we figure it out. Will keep everyone posted via both the radio and electronic mail.

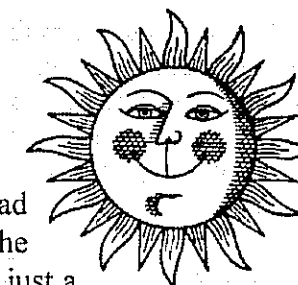

The ARRL Letter

* According to FCC figures, the numbers of new hams and of hams who've changed their class of license are up compared to the last half of 1995. New hams for the months of January, March and April have each totaled more than 3000, and upgraders have topped 1200. In February, new hams numbered 2109, and there were 980 upgraders. During the last half of 1995--which included the Federal government furlough the last half of December--the number of new hams averaged 2137 per month, while upgrades averaged 811 per month.

SOLAR UPDATE: FLUX IS UP



Propagation guru Tad Cook, KT7H, reports the average solar flux was up just a few points during the first full week of May, and the average A index moved from 5.7 the previous week to 6.1. After peaking around 80, solar flux should drop below 70 after May 20 and rise above 70 again after June 1. The geomagnetic field is expected to be most stable between May 21 and 27. Best worldwide DX at this low point in the solar cycle is expected on 30 and 40 meters. Look for 20 meters and even higher bands to open up, especially on north-south paths, when the solar flux is at 80 or higher.

Sunspot numbers for May 2 through May 8 were 0, 0, 0, 12, 26, 27 and 19 respectively, with a mean of 12. The 10.7-cm flux was 67.9, 68.3, 69.4, 70.8, 74.6, 74.9 and 76.1 respectively, with a mean of 71.7.

This year we will be in the shade at the Coast Guard Station at Two Rock. This is a fantastic listening post and one of the most famous stations during World War II. This is the place where the Japanese code regarding Midway was broken.

If you have never attended a field day, you are missing a lot of fun. If you are a 2 meter/440whiz, this is a great chance get your hands on a good HF rig and make a lot of contacts. RACES-ARES-VIP*

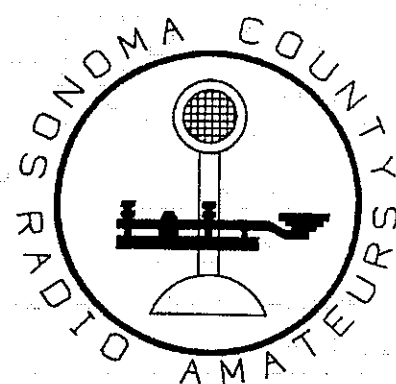

Emergency communications support - if your agency needs auxiliary communications, this is where to get it! Can't contact your EOC, field units or family because phones and central dispatch have failed or are overloaded? Request *RACES volunteers from the Op Area*. A radio operator can be assigned to set up a transmitting station at your agency. Ham radio operators are licensed by the FCC to operate on special frequencies, which they can use during emergencies to assist your agency. 75 hams assisted during the '95 floods. Plan ahead: 1. Find a ham operator in your agency - or train one. 2. Set up a ham radio station with an antenna. There are 3000 ham operators in Sonoma County. Maybe one works for your agency!

ARES provides *non-emergency communications* for public service events and relays health and welfare traffic during emergencies. ARES hams will provide radio communications during the California Beach Clean-up on 9/21/96. ARES is run by the hams and their National organization, ARRL. Request *ARES volunteers from your local radio club, or leave a message at 579-9608*.

VIP is a group of ham operators and others who volunteer for CDF. Now that you've learned all that heads up, the name RACES may change soon because these volunteers are no amateurs. They are trained professionals who have agreements with government and disaster response agencies nationwide to provide emergency services. Be sure to include RACES in your next exercise and in your disaster plan.
