



Avalanche of New Antenna Ordinances

There is a huge new wave of antenna ordinances being proposed by cities and counties. These ordinances are being driven by the spectrum purchases and by new and expanding Cellular and Personal Communications Services licenses. All of us need to be aware of this trend.

When you first sense any of this action in your community, contact your Section Manager, the ARRL Regulatory Information Branch, and me immediately so that we can get help to you and the rest of the hams in your community. The key to a successful defense is to separate the commercial interests from Amateur Radio in the minds of the city officials. It's vitally important that your city or county officials understand Amateur Radio involvement with emergency communications - this story must be told repeatedly, especially before the antenna ordinance crisis develops!

Just two examples of ARRL Volunteer Counsel (VC) action in this arena: Lee Dibble, KE6EAQ, VC in Santa Rosa, has been waging a successful battle for the hams in Sonoma Co. and its cities. Phil Kane, K2ASP, Division VC Coordinator in Redwood City, has been engaged in Millbrae, Hayward, and other areas. submitted by Alan Bloom NIAL

Dave Willey announced that the club patches are still available for \$3.00 and the sale of which includes a free monthly raffle ticket.




Rick Reiner K6ZWB spoke briefly about our brother club, the Redwood Empire DX Association and suggested that the members visit their meetings also.


Public Service:



Yes, WE ARE GOING! A mad contingent of SCRA members are going to make the trip to Death Valley to do a little radio work. We plan on setting up several HF stations and at least one VHF/UHF station. The object of the trip is some radio operating, some socializing, some sightseeing and a lot of fun!

We will be staying at the Furnace Creek campground which is near the Furnace Creek Inn. The inn has a general store and other amenities. The campground features tables, water, flush toilets, fireplaces and a sanitary station. There are NO utility hookups. RVs up to 40 feet in length are permitted.

Four campsites have already been reserved for radio operations. Some people will also be staying in those spots (guess they can tolerate late night CW!) You may wish to reserve your own camp site. More on that later. We are working on the equipment lists now. The radio equipment will be run by generator during the day and off batteries at night. (Generator operating hours are 7 AM to 7 PM)

To date, the plan is to leave Santa Rosa at about 3:00 AM on Friday morning the 18th. That would get us in to Death Valley about 4:00 PM. Plenty of time to set up for the evening. See if you can share a ride/expenses with someone. Splitting up the driving makes it easier. The drive is similar in distance to driving to Las Vegas. Plan about a 10 to 11 hour trip, not including "stops". The planned return will be on Sunday the 20th. But, of course, you can plan to stay longer or arrive before the 18th. Make a vacation of it!

The weather at that time of year should be moderate. Day temperatures should run in the 80's. The evenings should be in the s or 50s. The desert weather is unpredictable so there can be large variations on conditions. Plan your clothing accordingly.

Food stuffs are on you. There is talk of a "group pot luck." More information as it develops.

The hard facts: There is a park entry fee of \$10 per car. Camp sites are \$16 per night Furnace Creek camp sites are reserved by calling Destinet at 800 365-2267. Be sure to state that you are with the Larry Gustufson/SCRA group. That way the park rangers will try to get us all close together. We are planning to charge a \$15 per family fee to offset the costs of the operating sites. If there is enough cash, we will also supply soft beverages, snacks or whatever the committee can buy.
