# The M2 Enterprises 6M7JHV 6-meter Yagi

Reviewed by Bart Jahnke, W9JJ, ARRL/VEC Manager October 15, 1998

M2 Enterprises 6M7JHV antenna is a mid-sized (by today's standards), moderately-priced, high performance 7-element 6-meter Yagi on a nearly 31-foot boom. The "JHV" reference in the model number refers to the fact that the antenna was originally designed for Dave Batcho, N5JHV. (Dave has a high performance 6-meter station consisting of an array of stacked "JHV" Yagis).

What sets the 6M7JHV apart from most other long boom 6-meter antennas is its light weight--a mere 17 lbs!--as well as its clean pattern and carefully optimized performance. These characteristics should make it an ideal choice in single Yagi or stacked Yagi arrays for long-distance terrestrial, scatter or EME applications. This antenna is specifically designed for weak signal use between 50 and 50.5 MHz.

The antenna arrives in an unbelievably small 5-foot long by four-inch square box. The boom is made up of seven 1½-inch aluminum tubing sections with swaged end sections for easy interconnection. The element halves are 3/8-inch aluminum tubing. The longest element, the reflector, has a total assembled length of 115.25 inches. The element-to-boom mounting blocks, the T-match shorting bars, and the boom mounting plate also are aluminum. Boom section and element attachment hardware is stainless steel and uses elastic stop nuts. To minimize sagging, addition boom support is provided by a 3/16-inch Dacron rope overhead guy system. A turnbuckle arrangement is included for easy adjustment.

The assembly instructions are well written and the antenna went together quite easily. After wrestling the monster into position on my 36-foot steel push-up mast, initial checks indicated resonance at around 50.1 MHz with the factory recommended shorting bar locations.

Once on the air, one of the first things I noticed is the ability of the 6M7JHV to reject local power line and other neighborhood noise sources outside the main lobe. My other 6-meter antenna, a stacked wire loop array, suffers nearly continuously. The 6M7JHV allows me to choose from a broad range of beam headings with virtually no interference

The ARRL September VHF Contest offered some additional challenges. My home's location is in New England and essentially line-of-sight with several strong local and nearby mountaintop contest stations. QRM coupled with the previously mentioned local noise problems can make for some difficult working conditions. The narrow main beamwidth and exceptional front to back ratio of the 6M7JHV let me pull weak S1 and S2 signals from several directions and also supplied the gain I needed to work them with my relatively modest 100 W output.

Fixed signal sources, such as beacons, also come alive with the 6M7JHV. A few of the 6-meter beacons 250-400 miles away, previously only occasionally audible on my stacked loops, can now be heard consistently. Planned station improvements over the next few months include an amplifier and a receive preamp. I'm hoping to use this equipment to work moonbounce with some of the big gun EME 6-meter stations.





# Japanese Eavesdropping

Retired news writer, editor, and broadcaster Clarence W. "Bill" Bailey, W7DF, recalls the time he had a chance to use his knowledge of the Morse code on the job to get a "scoop" on the competition during the heady final hours of World War II.

During the latter part of World War II my job was in the NBC newsroom in New York as a news writer and editor. On the eve of the Japanese surrender I had an unusual opportunity to put ham radio CW to good use for the network.

Among the many Associated Press dispatches crossing the NBC news desk that night in August 1945 was a story that mentioned an Amateur Radio operator in upstate New York who was copying the text of the Japanese surrender document in radiotelegraph code.

I called the AP, told them I was an Amateur Radio operator, and asked the location of the ham. The wire service editor was kind enough to give it to me. I immediately phoned the ham, identified myself as a fellow amateur and NBC news editor, and asked for the frequency of JFD, the Japanese commercial station transmitting the surrender text to Berne, Switzerland, for relay to the Allies. He also graciously complied.

Then I phoned the RCA Transmitter and Monitoring site at Riverhead at the tip of Long Island and asked that they put a receiver on JFD and pipe the CW down to the newsroom monitoring desk, which they promptly did. (In those days RCA owned NBC.)

Although the CW was being sent at well above 20 wpm I was able to copy the text without difficulty. (In March, 1933, at age 13 I had won first place in the 25 WPM code contest at the first ARRL ham convention held in Arizona, in Phoenix.) NBC's famous foreign correspondent and broadcaster H.V. Kaltenborn was doing a running account of developments as the evening progressed. He was intensely interested in the text I was pounding out on my typewriter at the NBC monitoring desk just outside his glass-walled broadcasting booth. As I finished copying several paragraphs or so he'd grab them from my typewriter and rush back to his microphone to continue his commentary on the network.

None of us in the newsroom understood why it was the Japanese who were sending the surrender document. One of the best conjectures was that the Allies had required it as a means of assuring that Japan clearly understood the surrender terms, which were not open to negotiation. The surrender was absolutely unconditional.

Unfortunately, I never got a chance to really thank the AP editor, the upstate New York ham, or the engineer hams out at Riverhead for helping to make this unusual news coup possible. But it probably doesn't matter because they, along with the entire nation, undoubtedly were consumed with gratitude that WWII was finally over.

Clarence "Bill" Bailey, now 78, lives in Mesa, Arizona. First licensed in 1932 as W6HBQ, he still remembers his first contact with W6FVU on Christmas Day of that year. He used a 201A (TNT circuit) with copper tubing tank coils and a 40-meter Zepp. The power supply was from an old RCA Radiola 28 (chemical rectifier type). The following year, at the ARRL Arizona Convention, he helped W6HBF man his station round-the clock for a couple of days to handle eastbound traffic out of Long Beach, California, for a couple of days after a devastating earthquake. His other prior call signs include W9JJD and W8SML. Lately, he's been working with his daughter, Joan, and her husband, Greg, who are preparing to take their Technician Plus exams. Bill is an ARRL member.

A trust fund has been set up for the Dean children at Wells Fargo Bank.



## **Proposed Constitutional Change**

The following change was proposed by Joel Nadler, KJ6LF, at the October general meeting and will be voted on in November. The change reads:

I propose that section #6 be added to Article IV – Officers and Board of Directors and shall read:

6. No member of the SCRA board of directors shall concurrently hold office or be a member of a governing board of any other amateur radio club or organization. Members of national amateur radio organizations (such as ARRL), state and local government's liaison officials (such as ACS representatives) are exempt from this restriction.





### New TH-G71A programming software:

Kenwood has announced an updated version of the MCP-G71A programming software for the TH-G71A dualband H-T. You can download the software (version 2.0) free at ftp://ftp.kenwood.net. You'll need the PG-4P programming cable to operate.

### PK-232 DSP upgrade kit:

Timewave has announced a new internal PK-232/DSP, an internal DSP filter upgrade kit for the PK-232/PK-232MBX multimode data controller. The filter is aimed at enhancing PK-232 performance in noise and QRM. Timewave says that, in most cases, installation is as simple as plugging in the daughter board and two new PK-232 EPROMS, soldering three connections, and clipping a couple of component leads. Owners of the early PK-232 without the MBX (mailbox) daughter board can get both the MBX and DSP daughter boards with the new ver 7.2 EPROMs to bring their PK-232s up to date. ### GPS week number rollover?

By now, most people are familiar with the Y2K millennium year rollover problem. But some GPS systems could have problems starting on August 15, 1999, the first day that the GPS week number rolls over from 1023 to 0. The reason is the limited number of bits used in the GPS navigation message. If the GPS receiver firmware is not corrected, the receiver will interpret the new week 0 as January 6, 1980, and could malfunction. Users of (especially older) GPS units should check with manufacturers to determine if their equipment is GPS week rollover proof and if a firmware revision is available.
