DRAKE ENDS FACTORY SERVICE FOR OLDER GEAR

R. L. Drake Company has announced it no longer will provide factory service for most of its older Amateur Radio and marine equipment. The list includes much--but not all-of the popular 4-Line equipment.

Veteran Drake Service Manager Bill Frost, WD8DFP, says it's getting harder to get parts for the older Drake units. "The big switches, you can't buy those things anymore," he said this week. "The big electrolytics are not available."


Technicians familiar with the older, mostly tube-type gear also are in short supply these days. "Our technical expertise on the older equipment has gradually been diminished by the loss of long-time employees due to retirement," Frost said. He also said the cost of repairs can easily exceed the cost of the equipment.

The company has posted a list on its Web site at http://www.rldrake.com/tech/Outofservice.html of items that it no longer can service. The list includes The R-4 and R-4A receivers, the popular T-4X, XB, and XC HF transmitters, and the TR-3 and TR-4 transceivers, as well as most of the power supplies for those units, the SSR-1 receiver, and the TR-22, 22C and TR-33C 2-meter transceivers. Items on the list and sent to Drake for repair will be returned to the sender unrepaired accompanied by a bill for shipping, handling, and applicable COD fees.

Frost said Drake is still servicing "to an extent" the R-4B and R-4C receivers as well as the TR-5 and TR-7 transceivers. The company also still will provide factory repair service for the L-4, L-4B and L-7 linear amplifiers.

Drake says its supply of unique parts is limited that it





ARRL Update

ARRL PACIFIC DIVISION UPDATE DECEMBER, 1998

Last Chance to Comment on Major Amateur Radio License Restructuring Proposals:-

The Comment deadline on FCC WT Docket 98-143 is Dec. 1, 1998. The implementation of this Docket will set the framework for the Amateur Radio Service in the US for the next several years. The Docket and the ARRL "constructive suggestions" to the FCC on this Docket have been widely discussed in the Sept., Oct., Nov., and Dec. QSTs as well as the recent issues of the Pacific Division Updates. Already several hundred comments are on file at the FCC on this matter and are available on the FCC WWW site. For those of you who have not sent in your Comments, it is now YOUR turn to express your views about the future of Amateur Radio licensing and related topics in the US!

For your consideration, following is a capsule summary of the ARRL plan that will be covered in the ARRL's Comments that will be filed.

Number of License Classes and Privileges.

- 4 classes Technician, General, Advanced, Extra.
- No one to lose any privileges.
- Novices and Tech Plus licenses become Generals immediately.
- Refarm the Novice HF bands to better uses.
- Technicians to have CW privileges on HF in General segments to help broaden their scope of Amateur Radio.
- Morse Code Examination
- 5 wpm for General; 12 wpm for Advanced and Extra.
- Solid copy or fill in the blanks examination.
- Enforcement
- FCC Compliance and Information Bureau (CIB) to have full enforcement capability.
- FCC/CIB to enforce all Amateur Radio Service rules.
- -- Written Examinations
- Modify topics and questions to be more relevant to class of license.
- Enlarge the total number of questions in the question pool.

- Questions to be more difficult for higher level of licenses.
- Retain the syllabus in the rules to maintain national uniformity.
- Explore newer techniques for distractor generation.
- -- Greater Volunteer Examiner Opportunities
- Advanced Class to have greater opportunities as VEs.
- -- RACES Station Licenses
- Special RACES licenses no longer relevant, but keep RACES.

Of course, you many have a different approach than the ARRL Board has taken. This NPRM provides a unique opportunity to express your views on the direction that Amateur Radio should take in the US in the years ahead. I urge all of you to write and send your constructive comments to the FCC at one of the addresses noted in the following paragraph. To be effective, you should not only include your suggestions for change (or no change) in your message, but should also include the rationale behind your suggestions. If you wish, please also send a copy to me at k6wr@arrl.org or at the address on page 10 of any QST.

Several hundred comments have already been filed with FCC on this Docket. These comments range from very simple comments such as "T like it" or "I don't like it" with little or no rationale for the points made to very extensive Comments with accompanying rationale. Suggestions have been made for as few as three license classes (one no code VHF; one with 5 wpm code for current General class HF privileges; and one with 5 wpm code for all current Extra class privileges). Others have asked the FCC to "leave it all as it is." Most Comments are from individuals, but some are from organizations. All the Comments can be found on-line at the fcc.gov WWW site.
