

- Call to Order, Verification of Quorum, Introductions The meeting was called to order by club Vice President Steve KF6RCH at 6:43 PM. The meeting was held at the offices of Master's Touch Mortgage, 8979 Conde Lane, Windsor. A quorum was present in that eight of the nine voting board members were present.
