




# FIELD DAY!







# Sept 28 & 30 - Waves to Wine



# Who should be our next ARRL Section Manager?

An Editorial

There are two candidates running for election as the ARRL San Francisco Section Manager: Leonard Gwinn WA6KLK and John Wallack W6TLK. The contrast between the two is striking.

Wallack has served as SM several times in the past. He has resigned from the office twice leaving the Section adrift. He even withdrew as a candidate from this election and then re-entered the race. Each time he resigned, the Section faltered due to the lack of an in-place management structure. Most holding appointments in the Section were inactive and not serving the ARRL membership under Wallack's terms. Most recently, Wallack was a no-show at the Ferndale Section Convention where, after Wallack advised them he was going to attend, the vacant chair at the head table was an example of Wallack's management. Wallack is backed by those in ACS/Sonoma County government that want to control Amateur Radio and are trying to steal the 146.73 frequency from SCRA.

Gwinn took over the job as SM when Wallack resigned again. He quickly realized that the Section was dead in the water. As he was working to assemble a management team, during a conversation with Sonoma County DES officials, he was told by them that DES had to approve all of his appointments. Gwinn had the backbone to resist DES's attempt to control the ARRL Section. In his short term in office, Gwinn has appointed truly interested Hams to posts and organized a management team. Gwinn has taken the steps to ensure that the Section will not suffer if a team member leaves. The result has been new, involved and interested ECs, DECs, OOs and PIOs. Gwinn has also seen to it that each club in the Section is visited frequently, not once a year, if at all.

In our opinion, the correct choice is clear. For a strong, resilient and independent San Francisco Section, vote for Leonard Gwinn WA6KLK when your ballot arrives from ARRL this month.

# ARES Comm Log

(NOTE: The following article is not entirely original. Many of the thoughts were borrowed from an article by Jim Wades, WB8SIW, in WorldRadio Magazine)

I've been doing a lot of thinking lately about the rift between local ACS/RACES and ARES. From my perspective as a local Emergency Coordinator I see that I have one job - that is to provide communications for the local served agencies. It seems to me that too few people realize that, at the volunteer level, there is plenty of room for all of us. As hams we don't own communications - we simply do emergency communications. The ownership belongs to the served agency ..... that's what we're there for - to get the message through.

Have you ever thought about what happens in a real emergency? Have you given any thought as to how unprepared you really are when things go "upsidedown"? It doesn't even have to be a "major" catastrophe .... a simple "minor" disaster at the local level will probably bring chaos to the communications system including the ham bands. It will most likely be a case of the unprepared doing an inadequate job with mediocre equipment.

When the power goes out and disaster strikes there will be an immense need for communications. The fact that one, two, three or even four local repeaters are operational will still be sorely inadequate for disaster needs. Think about just a few of the immediate disaster needs that require communications:

> Initial check-in and deployment General tactical communications (vehicles, personnel, supplies, logistics) Damage assessment ICS/EOC interface Health and welfare inquiries Shelter Ops (Red Cross/Salvation Army) Weather Ops (Skywarn, flood levels, etc.)

It's readily apparent that a single net is totally inadequate for the sheer volume of traffic generated in an emergency. The bottom line is there simply are not enough repeaters or nets in the county to support these needs.

Next month I'll continue this train of thought and we'll see some ways to organize emergency communications to get the "biggest bang for the buck".

# **Disaster Strikes**

A series of rolling blackouts throughout the state have caused a rippling effect of power surges. Many local backup generators have been overloaded and have burned out. Currently nearly every local utility is without power ..... signal lights are out, shopping malls are dark and most of the telephone system is inoperative.

Does this sound familiar? If it does then you probably participated in the last ARES Simulated Emergency Test conducted a couple of weeks ago. The ARES team were stationed at five locations and passed priority, routine and welfare traffic while operating totally on emergency power. For over two hours we dealt with everything from minor traffic accidents and heat stroke victims to looting in blacked-out malls and trying to locate an elderly person in a shelter. After the event we all met for lunch for a critique of the exercise.

This was the first SET since the national ARRL SET last fall and all team members expressed the desire to have more training. The first question asked was "When do we have another drill". The best way to become a good communicator is the same way to become good at most other things .....practice, practice, PRACTICE. By this time next year I hope to be conducting at least three drills a year.
