# ARRL Pacific Division Director Jim Maxwell W6CF Announces Conclusions in 146.73 Repeater Debate

On July 16, 2001, Jim Maxwell, who had been working to resolve the repeater issue between SCRA, NARCC and the County of Sonoma/Jack Rosevear, issued his conclusions on the matter. The entire text of Jim's letter is reprinted here.

To: Greg Gordon, Bob Lanning, Jack Rosevear

#### Gentlemen:

When I volunteered to act as mediator in the dispute between the English Hill and Sonoma Mtn. repeaters on 146.73 MHz earlier this year, I naively expected it to be a relatively straightforward exercise. I expected that we would all pull together to find a solution, and that we would find that solution in short time.

That has not happened. As the months passed and I became more and more familiar with the issues, I came to the realization that a friendly resolution might be impossible to achieve. After my meetings with Sonoma County OES and the Board of SCRA on Wednesday, July 11, I came to the final conclusion that the time has come to move into a new, and hopefully, final phase of this mediation process. I have therefore listed several recommendations below that represent my last effort at achieving a solution to this problem. Some of you will not care for those recommendations. However, they result from what I believe to be a realistic assessment of the technical issues, and I believe that the recommendations have potential for bringing

this unhappy matter to a close.

I understand fully that there are other disagreements between the two principal parties, SCRA and Sonoma County OES, as well as between various individuals. My mediation activities and this memo have not and shall not address those disagreements. My recommendations should not be interpreted as endorsing either side with regard to those disagreements; they will have to be addressed at a different time, in a different forum.

Throughout this exercise I have attempted to deal with all of you fairly and impartially. I believe I have done just that. Dealing fairly and impartially, however, does not mean that I have been blind to the realities of the situation. It is now time to discuss realities, to "lay it on the line." so to speak.

First, my conclusions.

A. I conclude that the SCRA claim for coordination of their 146.73 MHz repeater on English Hill is valid. 1 believe that SCRA also held a valid coordination for Sonoma Mtn. on 146.73 MHz prior to the shutdown. As the coordination holder for the Sonoma Mtn. repeater, SCRA had the right to terminate operation of that repeater, and they did. In making this statement I understand fully that the subject of "to whom is a coordination issued?" is under active review by NARCC.

B. After SCRA abandoned the Sonoma Mtn. site. Sonoma County caused a change to be made in the NARCC database, designating a new organization representative and a new call sign for the Sonoma Mtn. repeater. NARCC accepted the changes, based upon their assumption that the owner of the repeater equipment (Sonoma County) held the coordination, and was therefore authorized to make such changes. However, that assumption is inconsistent with FCC practice, which leads me to conclude that the change should not have been accepted. Sonoma County, as the equipment owner and site owner, has the right to set rules of access to its equipment and facility, or terminate such access, as it sees fit. However, Sonoma County has no standing with regard to licensing or coordination of the former SCRA repeater on Sonoma Mtn.

C. I conclude that when SCRA terminated their operation on Sonoma Mtn. and so notified NARCC, their coordination expired. Thus, when the County caused a new organization representative and call sign to be entered in the NARCC data base, the appropriate response from NARCC should have been to inform the County that a) Sonoma Mtn. was no longer coordinated for 146.73 MHz; b) even though Sonoma County is a government agency and owns the equipment, they have no greater standing in the matter than any other possible applicant for coordination on Sonoma Mtn. on 146.73 MHz; and c) a coordinated repeater was operating on that same frequency at a nearby location, English Hill.

Based on the foregoing conclusions I make the following recommendations.

- 1. I recommend that the two repeater groups (SCRA and the Amateur group managing KD6LSO), plus NARCC. immediately launch a vigorous cooperative effort to find a new 2-meter frequency pair for the KD6LSO repeater. On July 11 the two groups agreed to continue a frequency search. attempting to identify a new frequency pair for both repeaters. I recommend that the July 11th agreement be modified to the extent that a frequency for only Sonoma Mtn. be sought. This search should be completed no later than Sept. 16, 2001.
- 2. While the frequency search is in progress I recommend that KD6LSO continue to operate as an uncoordinated repeater, but that the two groups develop a cooperative plan to reduce interference on 146.73 MHz. This may include a temporary time sharing plan.
- 3. If a new pair is identified with a high likelihood of success, then I recommend that a reasonable amount of additional time be granted the Sonoma Mtn. group to transfer their operations to the new frequency pair.
- 4. If no new frequency pair has been identified for Sonoma Mtn. by the end of the two-month search period, then I recommend that the KD6LSO repeater on Sonoma Mtn. cease operations on 146.73 MHz. However, taking into account the demonstrated value of the Sonoma Mtn. system for public service, I also recommend that the SCRA and Sonoma Mtn. groups then make a good faith effort to find a way such that Sonoma Mtn. can operate on 146.73 MHz on an emergency-only basis. Such operation can be authorized

in accordance with Paragraph VII(4) of the NARCC Policies and Procedures document of Oct. 17, 1998. I recognize the difficulty in such an arrangement, for it would likely put Sonoma County ARES and Sonoma County ACS in competition with one another for repeater resources during an emergency situation. I can only hope that reason will prevail and that a suitable accommodation can be worked out, such as a joint operational plan.

5. Only as a last resort do I recommend that this matter be referred to the FCC. Hams have a long and honorable history of self-policing; let's keep it that way.

I will be happy to meet with any of the three involved groups at a mutually agreeable date and time. I will be away until Monday, July 23, although I will have email capability while gone.

## California QSO Party Coming! October 6 & 7


