





clipboard with nightlight, extension cord (1-50 ft. or 2-25 ft., 110v.), power strip (110v.), area maps (free from AAA), nylon parachute cord, garbage bags (two 55-gallon, four large ziplock), binoculars, AM/FM radio and batteries, Cyalume light sticks (four 12-hour, green), shaver, soap, small air mattress, and a small folding shovel.

The contents of your particular emergency kits are constrained only by your imagination. This list is intended to present possibilities from which you should choose; the intent is not for you to include everything. Think about what you may be asked to do and the potential environment. It's impossible to anticipate every situation but you can certainly make your job easier by including some of the above items. Remember, you could be asked to serve at any time with virtually no advance notice. One thing for sure ... start your kit now before an emergency event occurs and it's too late. Be prepared.

#### ARRL comments in support of AMSAT-NA petition

The ARRL has commented in favor of an AMSAT-NA Petition for Rulemaking that seeks to change an FCC rule regarding pre-space notifications for Amateur Satellite Service stations. AMSAT-NA wants the rule changed to require a single, written pre-space notification (or information document) within 30 days after receiving a launch commitment.

The current rule requires two pre-space notifications: the first at 27 months before initiating space station transmissions and the second at five months prior, even if no information has changed. The ARRL said that because finding affordable launch opportunities can be difficult and often involves last-minute decisions, "the 27-month notice requirement imposes an unreasonable and practically impossible compliance burden."

AMSAT currently must seek a waiver of the requirement for essentially every launch and the FCC has routinely granted such waivers, the ARRL noted. AMSAT-NA President Robin Haighton, VE3FRH, expressed his appreciation to ARRL for its support of its petition.

#### New FCC consumer e-mail service now available

The FCC has inaugurated a new e-mail service, The FCC Consumer E-Bulletin, to let consumers know about FCC developments, to disseminate FCC consumer information and to invite comments on FCC regulatory proposals.

Those signing up can expect to receive FCC fact sheets, consumer brochures and alerts, news releases, public notices, notices of proposed rulemaking, reports and orders, and other consumer-related information. The Consumer Education Office in the FCC's Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau (CGB) operates the free service.

To subscribe, send an e-mail to subscribe@info.fcc.gov. On either the subject line or in the message body, type "subscribeFcc-consumer-info <first name> <last name>". If you encounter difficulties subscribing, send an e-mail to lneely@fcc.gov.

Greg Gordon AC6VJ will make a presentation on the original silicon part - tubes! Join us for this blast from the past as Greg brings us up to date on what is happening with tube technology. Building projects with tubes is having a resurgence in Ham Radio. What will you build?

At the January meeting, **Tim Bosma W6ISS** provided a detailed overview of the Space Amateur Radio Experiment (SAREX) and the Amateur Radio on the International Space Station (ARISS). Tim is the coordinator for school contacts for the SAREX/ARISS program. Tim said that the ISS crew's time is worth about \$15,000 per hour and that they spend a large part of their time just performing routine maintenance on the station to keep it running. The work load was designed for 7 people, but only 3 are on each mission due to the limited capacity of the life boat vessel. If you weren't there, you missed a great presentation!

#### SCRA v NARCC

NARCC filed a motion called a demur alleging that only the FCC had jurisdiction over frequency allocation issues. A hearing on the motion was held on January 9<sup>th</sup> in the Contra Costa court at which SCRA's attorney provided the court with information on how the FCC does not involve itself in Amateur Radio repeater coordination. The court originally tended to lean in favor of the demur, but after hearing the arguments, gave SCRA additional time to amend the original petition. Another hearing will be scheduled on the amended petition.



#### **ARES Comm Log**

#### Go Kits....continued

In my last article I discussed some approaches and reasons for maintaining a ready "go-kit" available at all times. If you recall, I encourage maintaining three separate kits: an everyday kit that is small enough to be carried with you in virtually any situation that contains the "bare necessities" of emergency communications gear; a larger "backup bag" that provides extras for extended operating under auxiliary power while containing additional supplies for a 24-hour activation; and a "disaster bag" that has emergency cash, food and water, rain gear, and clothing and shelter to sustain a 3-day activation or evacuation. Now, let's discuss some particulars of what each of these bags should contain. Remember, the object is to include items that will be necessary while excluding the obvious "bells and whistles."

Your "everyday" kit should be one that stays within easy reach, includes a dual-band HT, and is light enough that you don't perceive it as being a burden to lug around. Besides the mentioned dual-band HT and a padded case, you should remember to include a copy of your current FCC operating license, ARES and served-agency ID cards, extra high-capacity (1000 mAh) nicad or nimh batteries, a standard AA battery case and batteries to fit the HT, DC adapter and cigarette plug cord with extra fuses for your HT, earphone / speaker mike, pocket knife, Leatherman tool, pencil and pocket notepad, emergency phone/gas money (\$10 bill, four quarters and five dimes in a pill box), and lots of connectors (SO-239 to BNC, BNC to SMA, SO-239 barrel connector, and any others that may be useful for your particular radio to connect to other combinations of coax and antennas). Also consider one or more RG8-X jumpers with connectors, Band-Aids, moist towelettes, sunscreen, pocket sewing kit (like the free ones from hotel rooms), matches, small pocket compass, operating reference card for your HT (if not a partial copy of the manual itself), and an ARES phone and frequency reference card.

Your "Backup Bag" which contains "24-hour" items should be in a sturdy shoulder bag with external pockets marked as to contents. It should be no bigger than a large briefcase and should weigh less than 20 pounds; some of the smaller gym/sports bags or the larger padded camera bags of ballistic nylon are ideal for this use. Remember, this bag stays in your vehicle until needed. Some suggested contents are a neck-lanyard with pocket for spare keys and ID cards. \$20 emergency cash, credit card, long-distance calling card,

a second "backup / loaner" 2-meter HT (ideally the batteries and accessories interchange with your dual-bander), fused DC adapter cords with Anderson Powerpole connectors for brick amplifiers and HTs, a 10' AWG 10 gauge extension cord with battery clips, in-line fuses and Powerpole connectors, a rugged 25-40 watt 2-meter or dual-band brick amplifier, gain antennas for both HTs - 1/4 wave VHF and 5/8 wave UHF, HT nicad and gel cell wall chargers, gel cell batteries with connectors, extra coal jumpers, cable ties (large and small), rugged flashlight with extra bulb and batteries, extra fuses for everything, pencils, pencil sharpener, erasers, note pad, permanent marker, and the ARES Field Resource Manual. Also include comfort items such as sunglasses, toothbrush, tissues, insect repellant, tweezers and a small first aid kit. The purpose of the brick amp for emergency use is to provide better range and clarity with an HT while providing maximum endurance when operating on battery power. When choosing a portable amp to augment a handheld for ARES, it should weigh no more than 1.5 lb. and provide 10-15w output when driven by the HT transmitting on its low power setting and 25-40w output when the HT is operating at full power from its normal nicad/nimh battery pack. Low-priced, no-name amps may overheat and quit under heavy use; it is more important to buy a rugged amp with an ample heat sink than the smallest "box."

Your "Disaster Bag" should be packed in a duffel and stowed with the "Backup Bag" in a Rubbermaid storage container in the car trunk until needed. The contents of this bag should be inspected and changed seasonally to provide a complete change of clothing, shelter, food and equipment to support a weekend activation or evacuation. A 3-ring binder with ARES operating procedures, ARES handbook, area topo maps and copies of all operating manuals should be included along with mag-mount antennas, portable ground plane, collapsible mast, tripod adapter, and 50-100 feet of 9913 Flex coax on a reel. If your mobile radio is not in your regular vehicle, don't forget to include it in this kit. While you may expect to be sheltered during an extended activation. don't expect all the comforts of home. It's a good idea to include at least one blanket, a rain poncho, some dehydrated meals (the new ones for backpackers are much better than the old field rations), a larger battery-lantern, and some camping eating utensils. As a final thought, pack that paperback book that you've always wanted to read but never seemed to have the time ... even during an extended activation you can probably expect some relief time and you will probably welcome the diversion to get your mind off the events of the day!

And, the list goes on and on. Some other items to consider are a canteen, Power Bars for snacks, chap stick, toilet paper (!), pain relievers (Motrin, Advil, Imodium, Dramamine, Tylenol, Benadryl), disposable camera w/film, (continued of page 9)






