

Personal Preparedness: Rolling Blackouts

We've touched on a number of preparedness topics in this column in the past, most have dealt with emergency communications from an operations standpoint but sometimes it's important to prepare for an event from a personal point of view. This article, taken from a Red Cross fact sheet, will give you some information on rolling blackouts and how you can deal with them.

A rolling blackout occurs when a power company turns off electricity to selected areas to save power; the areas are selected using sophisticated computer programs and models. Blackouts usually occur during peak energy usage hours but they can happen at any time of day. Hospitals, airport control towers, police stations, and fire departments are often exempt from rolling blackouts.

The initial item of importance is to assemble a cache of essential supplies including: flashlight, batteries, portable radio, at least one gallon of water, and a small supply of food. Due to the extreme risk of fire, do not use candles during a power outage.

If you use a computer, keep files and operating systems backed up regularly. Also, turn off all computers, monitors, printers, copiers, scanners, and other devices when they're not being used; that way, if the power goes out, this equipment will have already been safely shut down. It can also prevent your equipment from being damaged by power surges when the electricity is turned back on.

Remember that telephones that require electricity to work will be rendered inoperative in a blackout; plan for an alternate means of communication including having a standard telephone handset, cellular telephone, radio or pager. Remember, too, that some of these systems may not operate when the power is out

where they are located. So, even if you have power, your access to remote technology may be interrupted if the power that serves those areas is disrupted. Check with remote service providers to see if they have power backup systems, and how long those systems will operate.

If you are considering obtaining a generator, get advice from a licensed professional such as an electrician. Some municipalities, Air Quality Districts, have air quality permit requirements. Always plan to keep the generator outdoors - never operate it inside, including the basement or garage. Do not hook up a generator directly to your home's wiring without utilizing a transfer switch to isolate the generator from the power grid. Connecting a cord from the generator to a point on the permanent wiring system and back feeding power to your home is an unsafe method to supply power during an outage.

During a blackout, turn off or disconnect appliances, equipment (like air conditioners), or electronics you were using when the power went off (it's a good idea to leave a single light bulb turned on so you'll know when the power is restored). When power comes back on, it may come back with momentary "surges" or "spikes" that can damage equipment such as computers and motors in appliances like the air conditioner, refrigerator, washer or furnace.

If it's hot outside, take steps to remain cool. Move to the lowest level of your home, as cool air falls. Wear lightweight, light-colored clothing; drink plenty of water even if you do not feel thirsty. If it's cold outside. put on layers of warm clothing. Never burn charcoal for heating or cooking indoors. Never use your oven as a source of heat. If the power may be out for a prolonged period of time, plan to go to another location.


