

# Amateur Radio Antenna "CC&R Bill Reintroduced in Congress

(Sep 23, 2005) -- New York Congressman Steve Israel has reintroduced legislation that could make it easier for radio amateurs living in communities with deed covenants, conditions and restrictions (CC&Rs) to erect suitable antennas. Arkansas Congressman Mike Ross, WD5DVR, signed aboard as an original cosponsor of the "Amateur Radio Emergency Communications Consistency Act" (HR 3876). ARRL Hudson Division Director Frank Fallon, N2FF, who attended Israel's public announcement of the bill September 19 on Long Island, pointed out the Amateur Radio volunteers always fill the gap after other communication systems fail in an emergency or disaster. He notes the bill's introduction comes in the immediate aftermath of positive media coverage of Amateur Radio's response to the Hurricane Katrina disaster.







## Katrina Stories

by Rich Freitas KF6SZA Sonoma County ARES District Emergency Coordinator

Note: Many of you know that I have been mentoring students in the ARRL/AREUC online emcomm courses for the past few years. One recent student, Robert Rathbone, AG4ZG,

was rushing to finish the course before Hurricane Katrina hit the area where he lived. He successfully finished just two days before the storm hit the mainland and his unit was activated ... my last words to him were, "Be safe." Below is his story as it happened.

#### Family of 5 People Trapped in Artic. by AG4ZG

I began monitoring SATERN around 1pm EST Monday 29, 2005 listening to the type of messages, the tempo and propagation, W7KB was the net control operator. Propagation on 20 meters was making it difficult at times to pass information requiring relays and sometimes relays to the relays. At times the propagation split the country into 3 parts causing doubling and difficult copy. I provided relay when it was clear that no other stations were available.

Routine messages were attempting to flow into the disaster area and were directed to the SATERN website and sometimes the messages were routed via the NTS network or SATERN NET Operators. Two stations reported emergency traffic into SATERN, in a close time frame around 3:00pm EST. The first was a group of 15 people stranded on a roof with an 81-year old woman in medical distress. This information was taken down and another ham operator began working on it. The next emergency traffic item was a family of 5 trapped in the attic, in Diamond Head, Louisiana at XXX AKIKAI DR. The people in distress had used their cell phone to call for help... unknown who they called initially.

I looked up the address on the computer for a map and saw the address was a coastal address - hit with the storm surge.

Another station (in the SATERN logs) attempted to call the local Sheriffs Department for that area as I also attempted to call the Sheriffs Department. I figured one person could call and I hadn't identified that I was working on the problem yet. Light bulb went off, house surrounded by water... Coast Guard! This was very early in the disaster and the idea of water being everywhere had not been shown on TV. I called the local SAR Coast Guard Station in Clearwater Florida at 727-824-7506 and identified myself to the Duty Officer, Petty Officer Heinzman as a Ham operator and the nature of my call. I told him I was looking for a closer station to pass the information. He informed me that New Orleans Coast Guard station had to relocate and was not available. I explained in detail the nature of the emergency - Family of 5 trapped in attic, water rising in Louisiana on the coast. I had to make sure of the address so I recontacted SATERN net. The address of XXX AKIKAI DR. (still not sure how to pronounce it) was passed to the Coast Guard along with other information. Petry Officer Heinzman professionally copied the information and told me he would call me back when a rescue mission was initiated. I continued monitoring SATERN... Two other emergency calls came in with people in trapped in attics. That day the SATERN net gradually changed from Health and Welfare to handling more and more Priority and Emergency calls. And hour later I received a call from South Haven Sheriff Department in Louisiana (662-393-8652) the officer informed me a rescue operation was in progress. He also told me the state EOC building had collapsed (unverified) and they had to relocate.

Fifteen minutes later Petty Officer Heinzman called me to let me know a rescue mission was in progress. I passed this information back to the SATERN net. I continued to monitor and assisting in relays when no other coverage was available.

Ham radio works when all else doesn't!

Day Two. By the end of day one it became clear that signals out of the effected area were not in coming and propagation was not great. The Health and Welfare traffic was shunted to the web page that became

overwhelmed at times. The tempo of SATERN net had changed to accepting only priority and emergency traffic that continued to increase. A QRP station final appeared in the affected area. By the end of day two it became more clear that the Coast Guard was the rescue unit of choice. Another SAR I ran with involved 3 people stuck on a toof and one was a child.... This person TEXT messaged a family member in Michigan. I don't have recorded who first placed the call to SATERN net. K9ERG was the net control at 11:50am EST. I called my local Coast Guard and was routed to District 8, Petty Officer Merkle answered. The District 8 Office was not yet the coast guard command center until day 3. I had to do a little convincing that they were the nearest and only outlet for this information and needed to act on it. All information was taken down.

Do note that text message got out though regular cell phone circuit would not. These people were located at XXXX Virgil Blvd... (other info available).

By the end of day two, people trapped on roofs and attics became the most predominate emergency traffic and became the norm.

Day Three. SATERN net continues to relay emergency and priority information from various people and agencies. And everyone now has a collection of phone numbers and resources so that almost everything that comes in could be routed someplace mostly. Traffic heavy, net control ops tired.

Overnight (or sometime late on day two) District 8 Coast Guard became the command center for the disaster and water rescue calls...No convincing needed today when calls placed.

Day 3 Addendum.... 2 Emergency Traffic messages placed... came to me via VOAD conference call summary... I verified by several phone calls before I placed them on the net.

Here's another SATERN story that was among one of the first three or four emergency messages handled and worked on Monday by another Ham before we knew how bad things were....

#### Robert -

Per your request, I am sending a sequence of events for a specific piece of traffic that occurred on the SATERN net on Monday. At approximately 22:30 hrs, I received a call from Bill Simpson (KE4WRH) on 14.265khz tequesting assistance in locating two elderly male individuals who were trapped in their house attic with water rising. The individuals were Steven Calcote and John Young, who reside at XXXX Glendale Place, Gulf Port, Mississippi. He had received a call from one of his co-workets who stated that he had received several calls from Mr. Calcote on his answering machine while he was at work. After trying to reach them for several hours, he temembered that KE4WRH was a ham operator and decided to call him.

After receiving the traffic, I tried to get a station on frequency who could deliver the message to authorities, but no stations were on. I turned over the net control duties to Tom Bucanon, (N9AL) SATERN 20 meter net Director, and started making phone calls. All circuits were either out of service or busy and I could not get any call through to emergency agencies. I then called Qwest, and got a hold of the supervising operator to see if they had any type of emergency link into the effected area. She referred me to the Red Cross and gave me their number. After waiting for 25 minutes on hold. I hung up and called Quinten Nelson, (WA4BZY) in Covington GA., and asked him to use his contacts to complete the traffic. Quint has been the National Health and Welfare Director for SATERN for many years and is extremely well connected in all patts of the world.

At approximately 23:50z, I received a call from Quinten stating that he was able to contact Captain John Robbins of the Southern Territory Salvation Army and he had contacted the Mississippi State Patrol, who were effecting the rescue.

Although not as dramatic, the above sequence of events continues many times during every emergency. During yesterdays net, we completed at least two messages related to individuals trapped in their attic with water rising. We also also listed over 400 pieces of H&W traffic of a more routine nature. The SATERN Organization is on call for any emergency,
