


#### **SCRA Club Meetings**

### Next VE Sessions (Tentative): Saturday, January 30, 2010 and Saturday, April 17, 2010

If you've been studying for a new license or upgrade, your next opportunity to take your test is coming up (tentatively) on Saturday, January 30. SCRA will be hosting VE exams on January 30, from 9am until noon, at the Blood Bank of the Redwoods, 2324 Bethards Dr. in Santa Rosa. All test elements will be administered. Please arrive by 9:15am to be signed in. Testing will begin shortly thereafter.

#### NOTE: As this is being written, the dates are tentative, so please visit the SCRA website and click on the VE Testing link for updates

The next SCRA-sponsored exam session is tentatively scheduled for April 17, 2010.

Directions: From Hwy 101, take Hwy 12 east toward Sonoma. Turn right onto Farmers Lane. Turn left onto Bennet Valley Road. Turn left on Bethards Drive. Please park on the street (parking lot is for blood donors).

Candidates should bring the following:

- One (1) photo ID or two (2) non-photo ID

- Social Security Number (if not currently licensed) or

FCC Registration Number (FRN, if licensed)

- Original and photocopy of your current amateur radio license (if licensed)

- Original and photocopy of any valid CSCEs (if applicable)

- #2 Pencil and eraser

- \$15.00 exam fee. Checks may be made payable to "ARRL-VEC"

Calculators may be used, but it must be demonstrated that all memories and programs have been erased. The calculator function in a cell phone or PDA may not be used! If you have any special needs, please contact Brian Torr, N6IIY in advance.

The meeting took place at Narsi's Hof Brau & Grill, Coddingtown Mall, Santa Rosa. Board members present: John KG6PEP, Pat KG6JSL, Dave W6IBC, Mike AD6YB, Dave KF6CLG, Darryl KI6MSP and Becky KE6PZV. Club members present: Brian N6IIY and John WB6FRZ

The meeting was called to order by Dave, KF6CLG at 5:55pm.

Approval of October BoD meeting minutes: Pat, KG6JSL moved that the October BoD meeting minutes be approved. All in favor, motion carried. **Treasurer's Report**:

• Pat reported that the club is in good shape financially and that that is true in a lot of ways due to a lot of donations. Dave, W6IBC suggested that the memo on donations to the club be revisited. It must stress that SCRA does not accept payment for services.

• After the club deposits the latest check from John, WB6FRZ there will be a \$400 balance on what was paid out for classes & education. Darryl, KI6MSP asked if there should be a separate education fund. Dave, W6IBC will look at the club website to see how the club assesses itself.

• Dave, W6IBC would like the club to purchase a new radio for the holiday party as a door prize. Dave, W6IBC will make sure that the radio gets purchased. Darryl moved that the club allocate \$200 for the purchase of the radio for the door prize. All in favor, motion carried.

Rack at Castle Rock: Owned by Bill Hillendahl, KH6GJV. Bill is asking \$90 for it. Darryl moved to purchase the rack from Bill for \$90. All in favor, motion carried.

**Repeater**: Dave, W6IBC reported that the 440-link radio is still on the bench and everything else is working.

**VE**: Brian, N6IIY reported that the next session would be after the upcoming technician class this weekend. The next session after that will be sometime in January. The ARECC Level 1 course has enough Ves for it's exam in December, but all of those Ves need to register as ARRL Field Examiners.

Darryl, KI6MSP presented to the board a draft of a certificate of completion for participants of the technician courses.
