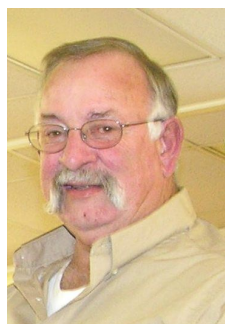

LEVI'S GRAND FONDO 2010

World-class bike racer Levi Leipheimer thanks Sonoma County Radio Amateurs (SCRA) President Dave Santori KF6CLG for the Club's service at Levi's Grand Fondo on October 9, 2010. The fun bike ride featured 6,000 riders: 4,000 from out of state. SCRA coordinated over 40 hams in providing ride communications including medical calls that resulted in two helicopter evacuations. The rides covered 32, 65 and 103 miles through the California County's western hills and coastal roads.

SCRA's communication van, affectionately known as "the toaster," was stationed

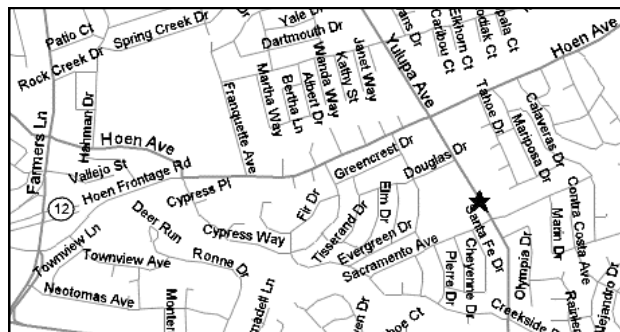

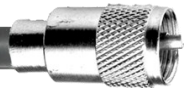
Hungry before the meeting?

Public Service Roundup - 2010

What a way to wrap up the year! Levi's Gran Fondo was huge and I can't think of an event that had everyone working their radios so hard. We fielded some 40 hams for an event with 5400 bike riders spread out all over the west county. I've never had the pleasure of riding in an event this big, let alone managing the radio ops for something so large. That we were able to do this with just 3 folks (2 shifts) at Net Control and 2 repeaters was remarkable. We were fortunate this year, thanks to Dave, W6IBC's suggestion, to establish a better link with the Seaview repeater. We were finally able to use 2 repeaters at once without knocking each other out, and with the number of incidents, we couldn't have done without it.

We had a few hams stationed out in the OES Communications van at the Occidental fire station and as near as we can tell everything went quite smoothly this year after last year's assortment of power failures and such. Perhaps the good news is the number of first timers that jumped right in. We had an assortment for folks from around the Bay Area, Gualala, and Ukiah come join us and it was a real pleasure to hear everyone, including hams I haven't worked with before, step right up to the plate, er, mike and handle traffic with such ease.

I said we were busy and we were. With 5400 riders the odds were good for a crash rate. The roads didn't disappoint as no sooner had the event started and we were dispatching sags for sidelined riders that had barely reached the Laguna. As could be expected we were fielding reports for all of the remote areas of the county, including the inevitable crashes up at Hauser Bridge. I'm told there were a total of 19 ambulance incidents and some of you also know that we did have a hit and run late in the day. This year we placed W8CAT, Cathy Crosby (Gualala), in one of the ambulances and it really helped with the overall emergency response. The guys with the best job of course were Pat KG6JSL and Dave, the prez, KF6CLG, hanging outside in the sun with the toaster at Portuguese Beach, getting their picture taken with Levi. 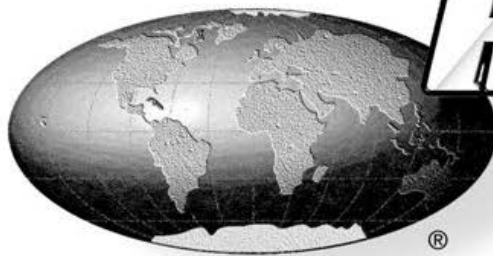

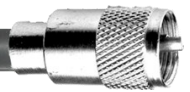

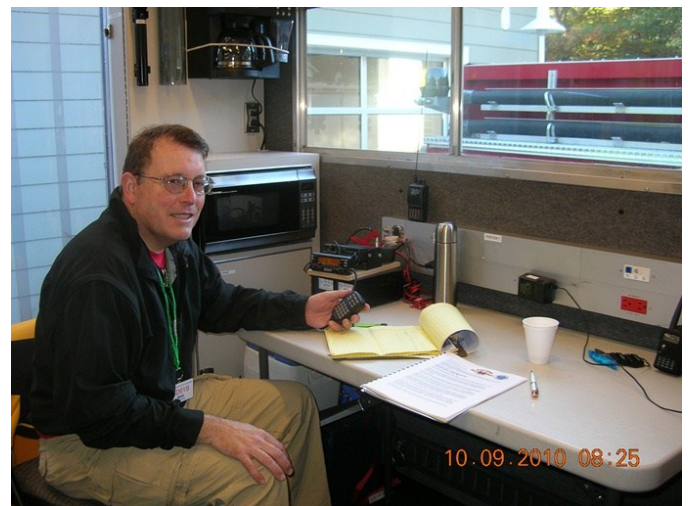

Professional EMS staff at the ride noted, "amateur radio is our most reliable method of communication."

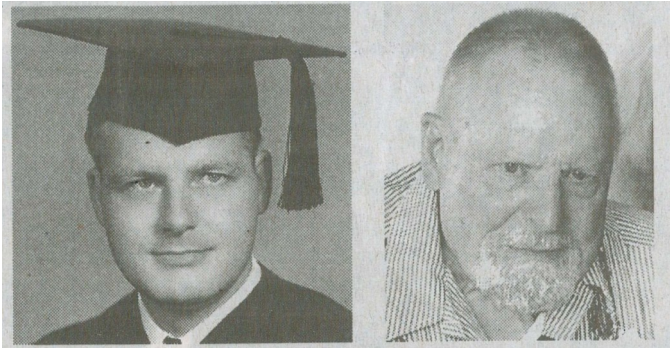

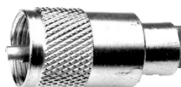
