

#### **Short Skip**

#### **New VHF-UHF Handheld** Dave W6IBC

For the price of a nice meal out, you can obtain a nicely-featured 2 watt FM handheld VHF-UHF trans-

ceiver, the BaoFeng UV-3R. This radio, offered mail order from a number of suppliers in the USA and overseas, is said to have a "digital processing system" design. Only one very large scale integrated circuit (VLSI) chip is employed and it is configured by software, making this little radio



another member of the software defined radio offerings now flooding the amateur radio marketplace. It uses a 3.8 volt cellphone battery, and each charge with intermittent transmit should last around 4-6 hours, making it an ideal candidate for repeater operations via a cross-band mobile rig at public service events.

The instruction manual is somewhat unclear, but complete, in describing the operating modes and features. It took me about 15 minutes to figure out how to load and store local repeater channels in the 99 channel memory. It's not as full-featured, as rugged, or as powerful as similarly featured offerings by Icom, Kenwood or Yaesu. Yet, it's a handy little radio, and at a price just below \$50.00 delivered to your door, it's a hard one to pass up. It even includes a bright LED flashlight and covers the FM broadcast band as well as the two ham bands.

I recommend the UV-3R for new hams as well as those on a tight budget that want to get on the air and enjoy our wonderful hobby.



Ever been mobile and forgot how to program in that new repeater. Oops, forgot the manual at home didn't you? Well, if you have a smartphone, you can upload the manual to it and have available any time.

With an iPhone or iPad, there is a free app from Apple called iBooks. Of course you can download books (that's what they want you to do), but you can also download and save PDF files. You can also do this on a Kindle and I assume there is something similar for an Android.



Its pretty easy to make work with an iPhone. Just download the iBooks app from the apps store. Then send yourself an email with a manual attached as a PDF file. When you open the PDF file, choose to open it using iBooks. You can then organize iBooks into different library stacks. So maybe your radio manuals go on one set of stacks, your auto repair manuals go into another stack. Heck, even have a stack for Short Skip.

The next time you sync your phone to your computer, you will have a new "Library Item" called "books". From now on, you can just drag and drop PDF files into the library, hit the sync button and have all of your manuals with you wherever you go.
