The monthly meeting of the SCRA membership was called to order at 7:02 PM.

A presentation on KPH operations primarily in Bolinas (transmit) and Point Reyes (receive) was given by Bill W6VSY is from KPH and Greg Ferrell K6SRO. They discussed the point-to-point service and the maritime service. Visitors and volunteers are welcome at the sites: check the website or call in advance.

Mike Von der Porten AD6YB, secretary, had nothing to report.

The treasurer was not present. Financial information is available from Darryl Paule KI6MSP or Steve Bramble.

The repeater committee reported that the power amplifier was being modified and has been received. It is expected to be installed tomorrow. IRLP, a voting receiver and maintenance are all in the works.

Craig Gaevert K6XLT reports that he has a full complement of volunteers for the Lake Sonoma event. Darryl Paule KI6MSP needs one volunteer for the MS Walk. For the May 5 Wine County Century, volunteers can still get in. For the May 5 Human Race, see Darryl. For May 12 Amgen Tour of California, we need as many volunteers as we can get. In June, there will be the Terrible Two.

We have a request to help the Tour de Organics on August 12 for the Sebastopol Community Center. By consensus of the membership, this will be added to the Club's public service calendar.

Jim Draeger KI6REK reports that refreshments are all good.

Mike Von der Porten AD6YB, membership, requests that membership renewals be submitted.

It was announced the EmComm West was coming

up. There is a new ARRL webinar available. See the ARES reflector or contact Rich Freitas KF6SZA.

The membership meeting minutes for March were published in Short Skip. It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the minutes as printed.

Sutter Laird KI6ZON reported that the website was working fine. Sutter will put tonight's presentation on YouTube and link it to our website.

Charlie Sikes KZ6T reported that the proposed bylaws changes had been distributed and posted as required. Dave Harrison W6IBC moved and Craig Gaevert K6XLT seconded that the bylaws be adopted as printed with the omission of the Station Licensing Committee. (The Station Licensing Committee will be part of the Repeater Committee.) The motion carried unanimously.

Charlie Sikes KZ6T reports that planning for a DXpedition has begun.

Jack Christensen K6ROW notes that the English Hill 440 repeater should be replaced because it doesn't belong to SCRA and needs some repair work. There is a proposal to spend approx. \$1,100 on a Kenwood TKR850 UHF repeater plus \$400 of additional costs. An authorization to spend up to \$1,500 on equipment was requested. Dave Harrison W6IBC moved, Craig Gaevert K6XLT seconded and it passed unanimously that the repeater committee is authorized to spend up to \$1,500 on the project.

Brian Torr N6IIY reported that Field Day planning is in process. The event is the fourth full weekend in June. It will be reported upon at the next membership meeting. Additional volunteers are solicited.

Pat Coyle reported on plans for the Mendo Rally which will be expanded this year.

Meeting called to order at 6:07 PM by President Darryl Paule KI6MSP.

VP Charlie Sikes KZ6T reported that the programs scheduled are APRS in May, Field Day and a movie in June, and possibly a battery presentation in July.

Charlie notes that the bylaws were passed by the membership. A copy will need to be signed by Darryl Paule KI6MSP (president) and Mike Von der Porten AD6YB (secretary). A copy of the minutes will be posted to the website.

It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the March Board of Directors minutes as published in Short Skip.

Steve Bramble KI6TUR reports that membership renewals are coming in slowly. The first quarter expenses came in as expected.

The repeater chairs report that the repeater is working better than ever with the updated feed to the amplifier. We are getting reports of both higher power net output and improved input sensitivity.

It was moved by Brian Torr N6IIY, seconded by Steve Bramble KI6TUR and approved that Jack Christensen K6ROW, John Felton KE5RI, Craig Gaevert K6XLT, Charlie Sikes KZ6T, Dave Harrison W6IBC, Kurt Helstrom WA6TIP and John Tracy W6SB be appointed to the new Repeater Committee.

It was reported that the 440 EH repeater will be replaced with the Kenwood repeater approved by the membership. The supplier is backlogged, so it will be a few weeks before this happens. The TKR 820 repeater may not be modifiable for 440 MHz use at Castle Rock. We will know more later. Further updates are likely to include APRS and IRLP. We have received five new IP addresses at each site.

Brian Torr N6IIY reports that the licenses from the recent exam took a bit longer to come through, possibly because of the Good Friday holiday. The next VE is 5/19/2012.

Brian will develop a plan and seeks a committee to help with Field Day. Some new modes and antennas may be added. We have the reservation at Youth Community Park and it includes the gazebo.

Jeff Tonelli KI6PBF reports that some new classes may include a basic electronics theory class, an electronics design class and/or a construction class. One idea is to have teams build different parts of a station and then put the station together for use at Field Day or the like. The system could then be sold to recover costs.

Mike Von der Porten AD6YB reports that emails will go out as renewal reminders. When needed, "snail mail" reminders will follow a month later.

Dave Harrison W6IBC reports that the assembly class was much fun.

There was a discussion regarding making sure that donations are fully acknowledged and records are retained by the Club.

There was a discussion that the number of paid members includes family members, so the total revenue is not a multiplier of the membership count.

Jack Christensen K6ROW reports that the TE amplifier upgrade previously authorized at \$200 will cost \$243.44. Moved, seconded and approved to authorize

\$243.44 for this project.

Jack Christensen K6ROW reports that the plan for the voting receiver at English Hill will best be accomplished using a RVS-8 LGD Repeater Voting System. Moved, seconded and approved to authorize up to \$400 to be spent on this equipment.

Jack Christensen K6ROW reports that Curt Helstrom WA6TIP will likely donate two GE radios that can be used for the link between Castle Rock and English Hill. If the donation is completed, the Club will gratefully acknowledge the donation.

The repeater committee will evaluate options regarding APRS and a digipeater. Depending on what is found, around \$600 may be needed for the project. Cumulatively, the repeater enhancements are still under the \$3,000 authorized in the budget.

Mike Von der Porten AD6YB will get envelopes for the new member kits.

John Chavez KG6PEP reports that the raffles have been generating approx. \$130 in revenue and costs have been around \$100. The Board consensus is that the raffle is for the enjoyment of the Club members and does not need to make a profit. John is authorized to increase spending on raffle prizes in this regard.

The meeting was adjourned by consensus at 7:12 PM.

Mike Von der Porten AD6YB reported that minutes were a month behind in Short Skip, but will be caught up.

Steve Bramble KJ6TUR, treasurer, reported that both expenses and income were behind plan, but that was to be expected during the quiet part of the year, and we are approx. \$1,000 favorable so far.

Repeater co-chairs John Felton JE5RI and Jack Christensen K6ROW reported that the HF repeaters are working well. The 440 repeater has been purchased and is expected to be installed on English Hill in the next month. IBC was acknowledged for his suggestion regarding reducing the power into an amplifier which was found to be an excellent idea that has been implemented. The installation of APRS is estimated to cost \$600 for an Alinco radio, TNC, antennas, etc. It was moved by Dave Harrison W6IBC to authorize up to \$700 to be spent on the APRS installation. The motion was seconded by Steve Bramble KJ6TUR. The motion carried unanimously. It was noted that IRLP will be an upcoming project.

Craig Gaevert K6XLT provided updates on public service. The MS Walk and Lake Sonoma 50 were very successful. Thanks go to the volunteers. Anyway, when we got to Petaluma I turned on the 2m rig to do a late check-in to the net, where-upon I received the coldest meanest stare because I interrupted the Giants broadcast. "I promise, this will only take a minute dear."

 $\{N/C\}\$ Are there anymore announcements for the net?

{me} KZ6T Late check-in.

 $\{N/C\}\ I$ heard a late check-in but didn't get the call, come again.

{me} KZ6T Charlie.

 $\{N/C\}\ I$ heard a Charlie, but which one, come again with your call.

{me} KZ6T, Kilo Zulu Six Tango, KZ6T Charlie.

 $\{N/C\}$ Oh that Charlie, got you checked in, ...

Well that was odd, but I was mobile in Petaluma with a cheap \$20 mag-mount ¹/₄ wave shaking in the wind while driving along at 65 mph. Maybe that was it.

Nope. After I get home I receive an email from our local public service wrangler that I am transmitting out that stupid squeal at the front end of my Tx. "Must be using your Yaesu tonight". So out I went to the car, sure enough that darn INT-ON icon is displayed.

For those of you not familiar with the Yaesu FT-8800, FT-60, and others, there is a "feature" called W.I.R.E.S. on these rigs. W.I.R.E.S. stands for Widecoverage Internet Repeater Enhancement. Think of it as IRLP for Yaesu's, except hardly anyone uses it. (Anyone outside of Japan that is.) It's a selectable option that is way too easy to select. When invoked, your 1st second of transmission is overwritten by a DTMF tone. This forces you to wait after pushing the PTT before speaking, while the listeners get to hear that wonderful tone, or you get cut-off.

Well that did it; there must be a way to defeat the "feature". There is, and it WORKS! An Internet Google search comes up with multiple hits on how. (Imagine that, other people with the same problem.) I had tried this mod a few times in the past but could never get the fix to work, this time I was determined. Turns out there are typos in the both of the instructions. A little persistence and finally success.

FT-60

1. Press the F/M key then immediately press the 0 key to enter the menu mode.

(Don't bother searching for the F/M key, they mean the F/W key)

2. Rotate the Dial knob to menu 23 – INT MR.

3. Press the F/M key then rotate the Dial knob to select a memory (d1 through d9) that is empty, i.e. it contains $\cdots \cdots$ (six dots) = no tone.

(Even though my d1 and d2 memory slots were blank, I could not get the mod to take until I used memory slot d3.)

4. Press the F/M key to store the setting.

5. Rotate the Dial knob to menu 21 – I NET.

6. Press the F/M key then rotate the Dial knob to select INT.MEM .

7. Press the F/M key to store the setting.

8. Press the PTT button to exit the menu mode.

To re-enable the WIRES [™] mode, select INT.COD in menu 21

(Don't even think about it)

FT-8800 / FT-8900

1. Press the SET key momentarily to enter the set mode.

2. Rotate the Main band Dial knob to select menu 15 – DTMF W

3. Press the Main band Dial knob momentarily then rotate the Main band Dial knob to select a memory (d1 through d16) that is empty, i.e. it contains •••••• (six dots) = no tone.

4. Press the Main band Dial knob momentarily to store the setting.

(This didn't work for me. I pushed the "SET" button instead.)

5. Rotate the Main band Dial knob to select menu 17 – INET.

6. Press the Main band Dial knob momentarily then rotate the Main band Dial knob to select INT. MEM

7. Press the Main band Dial knob for ½ second to store the setting and exit the menu mode. Continued on next page.

8. Rotate the Main band Dial while pressing and holding the left VOL knob to select the same memory selected in step 3 above.

To re-enable the WIRES[™] mode, select INT.COD in menu 17. (*WHY would you ever do this?*)

Although Yaesu doesn't really directly state it in the manuals, if you are fluent in Jinglish, the instructions to do this are there. As I understand it, this mod doesn't really shut off the WIRES "feature" but rather changes the DTMF tone to none. That's why after the mod is activated the INT-ON Icon is still on.

Hope this helps. Maybe our Public Service Wrangler will make it mandatory for all Yaesu users.

Come Join SCRA at Field Day 2012 June 22, 23, 24
