



Our next VE exam is scheduled for Sunday, April 7 from 3pm until 5pm. The location is TENTATIVELY set to be First American Title Company, 625 College Ave, Santa Rosa. Please check the SCRA VE Testing website for updates a few days before the session (http://www.sonomacountyradioamateurs.com/ve_testing.html). All test elements will be administered.

Please arrive by 2:45pm to be signed in. Testing will begin shortly thereafter.

Directions: From Hwy 101, take College Ave east past Mendocino Ave. Turn left onto Humboldt St., Turn left into the parking lot behind First American Title, Co. Enter through the door near the parking lot.

Candidates should bring the following:

- One (1) photo ID or two (2) non-photo ID
- FCC Registration Number (FRN, if you have one) or Social Security Number (if you do not have an FRN) If you have had any FCC license assigned to you, amateur or otherwise, or had any prior business with the FCC, you probably have an FRN.
- Original and photocopy of your current amateur radio license (if licensed)
- Original and photocopy of any valid CSCEs (if applicable)
- #2 Pencil and eraser
- \$15.00 exam fee. Checks may be made payable to "ARRL-VEC"

Calculators may be used, but it must be demonstrated that all memories and programs have been erased. The calculator function in a cell phone or PDA may not be used! If you have any special needs, please contact Brian Torr, N6IIY in advance.

Sonoma County Radio Amateurs Membership Meeting Minutes Wednesday, March 5, 2013

Called to order at 7PM by president Charlie Sikes KZ6T. Nearly 40 people were in attendance.

The board members introduced themselves.

New member Tom W1TAS Guests, Rich de Lambert, Nancy Codding (CERT coordinator), Susan. David, and Scott.

The presentation on the repeater was given by Charlie Sikes. The equipment at English Hill and Castle Rock were presented. The APRS system is currently down, but will be fixed. Projects in the works include the voting repeater, IRLP, Castle Rock UHF and on-going maintenance. Single tone = English Hill, dual tone = Castle Rock. Dave Harrison W6IBC, Jack Christensen K6ROW and Pat Coyle added to the presentation.

IRLP will likely be installed on March 14. This will be followed by testing by IRLP and ultimately authorization for operation. Messages and programming will need to be installed. The overall process may take a month. Information on operation will then be provided.

In maintenance a couple of weeks ago, Adam McLaughlin climbed the 120 ft. tower to approx. 100 ft. to inspect our antennas and connections.

Jeff Tonelli KI6PBF was recognized as the contact for mentoring help.

It was suggested that the member book be organized by first name.

The break was held.

Directors Reports:

VP John Felton KE5RI - not present

Secretary Mike Von der Porten AD6YB - nothing to report.

Steve Bramble KI6TUR Treasurer – reported that the finances are doing well. The threat of not being in the roster has expedited membership renewals. So far, we are ahead based on membership income and only a small amount of expenses.

Director Brian Torr N6IIY – nothing to report.

Director Doug Payne KF6LMB – nothing to report.

checked for alternate antennas and they are in the same price range. Dave reports that we have an advantage in replacing the antenna with one of the same appearance and that the site is environmentally challenging, so we want a long-life antenna. Andrew Reike KI6HID recommends "doing the job right" with a commercial-grade antenna. Pat Coyle KG6JSL also reports that our repeater pair coordination is based on our existing antenna configuration. Andrew reports that English Hill does have salt water effects. Dan Ethen WA6CRB reports that there are commercial antennas enclosed in a radome that might be explored. Fred Seitel AE6SF suggested that we might wait and test the antenna again. Dave reports that the high SWR could cause interference to the commercial antennas, so changing the antenna sooner rather than later is a good idea. Motion carried with two noes.

Past President report – Darryl Paule KI6MSP March 30 is "99 hobbies in one," so Hobby Towne will have us do a demo in several modes. See Darryl to sign up. Darryl is working on other possible classes on March 22, 2013 at Silvercrest / Salvation Army working with Lee Dibble KE6EAQ. After the demo, a class will be held the weekend of April 6.

Fred Seitel AE6SF reports that he was able to reach English Hill using an HT from 80 miles away in Mendocino County.

Bruce Hopfengardner K6BDH Public Service Chair and Craig Gaevert K6XLT reported on the April 13 Lake Sonoma 50, April 21 MS Walk, May 4 WCC, May 11 Human Race and the May 19 Amgen Tour of California. Contact k6bdh@me.com to volunteer.

John Chavez KG6PEP reports that the BSA Camporee is April 13 and may coordinated with the Lake Sonoma 50.

Brian Torr N6IIY, VE Liaison reports that two sessions have been held. All have earned what they tested for. Brian appreciates the VE volunteers. The April 6 VE may get moved to the April 7 class completion and the session may be open to the public.

The January 2013 and February 2013 Membership meeting minutes were included in Short Skip. Keith Payea AG6CI moved Dave Santori KF6CLG seconded to approve the minutes. Motion carried.

Old Business

The comm van (the "toaster") has the recommendation from the Board that radios and radio batteries be pulled from the toaster and the toaster be sold. Moved by Darryl Paule KI6MSP to remove the items and to sell the toaster. Steve Bramble KI6TUR seconded the motion. Pat Coyle KG6JSL reports that the brakes seem to have failed. The process of selling the toaster needs to be worked out. Andrew Raike KE6HID reports that we might find a place to donate it to. Nancy Yarborough K6NCY suggests listing it

"as is" and see what we can get. Who wants to handle this? Andrew says Cal Poly may want to do a repair project and sell it. Keith Payea AG6CI wonders if the State will take it as a gross polluter. Jack has had experience in which the State has no money. Jim says the vehicle for such programs must be operational. Motion carried unanimously.

The chair asked for help in moving out the toaster. Adam Mc Laughlin volunteered.
