There were about six sign-ups for the technician class, including a 10 year old, and two 11 year olds.

Directions: From Hwy 101, take Highway 12 East to Farmers Lane. Turn right onto Farmers Lane and then left onto Bennett Valley Road. Stay on Bennett Valley Road approximately 4.1 miles and turn right onto Grange Road. Bennett Valley Grange Hall is 0.5 miles from Bennett Valley Road on the right.

Candidates should bring the following:

- One (1) photo ID or two (2) non-photo ID
- FCC Registration Number (FRN, if you have one) or Social Security Number (if you do not have an FRN) If you have had any FCC license assigned to you, amateur or otherwise, or had any prior business with the FCC, you probably have an FRN.
- Original and photocopy of your current amateur radio license (if licensed)
- Original and photocopy of any valid CSCEs (if applicable)
- #2 Pencil and eraser
- \$15.00 exam fee. Checks may be made payable to "ARRL-VEC"

Calculators may be used, but it must be demonstrated that all memories and programs have been erased. The calculator function in a cell phone or PDA may not be used! If you have any special needs, please contact Brian Torr, N6IIY in advance.

Fred AE6SF demonstrated a 2 meter folded dipole, 70 cm J-pole antenna he has built for using for the Gran Fondo.

John Felton KE5RI presented the program involving a technical forum and "stump the chumps." Brian Torr N6IIY and Dave Harrison W6IBC acted as experts.

The break was held.

VP - John Felton KE5RI – next program is election and game night.

Treasurer – excused – Charlie Sikes KZ6T presented the financial data. The club is about \$3,000 ahead for the year, but the timing varies for revenues and expenses.

Review of minutes of Board of Directors of Sept 11, 2013. Moved to accept by Steve Bramble KI6TUR, seconded by Darryl Paule KI6MSP, approved.

Doug Payne KF6LMB inquired regarding how many events SCRA can support. Dave Harrison W6IBC notes that at the last meeting, the membership determined that it could not support a specific additional event. Nancy Yarborough N6NCY inquired regarding coordinating repeater access. Charlie Soles KZ6T noted that this was discussed at the prior Board meeting – controlling demands on the membership will be needed.

The conversion of efforts from outreach to classes to exams to members was discussed.

A discussion was held regarding membership being involved and what members want to hear and do.
