November 3 and November 9, 2013

This last month we held two VE exam sessions, one in conjunction with a weekend-long Technician class and the other which was open to all.

The November 3rd session was in conjunction wit the weekend-long Tech class and we had 16 candidates total. 11 earned their Technician class license and one earned a General class license. This was our biggest VE session over the last few years, and a few more VEs would have made it easier (we only had four). The ARRL VEC and FCC did a swift job of processing the paperwork; all callsigns were assigned by the following Thursday afternoon, November 7th.

The November 9th session was open to all and we had 9 candidates, and all but one earned the new license or upgrade they were hoping for. This session was also unique in that it was our first (and for this year, our last) "al fresco" VE session.

Why was this session held "al fresco", you may ask? Because that morning the power went out in the area that included the Bennett Valley Grange Hall. The session was supposed to begin at 9am and PG&E estimated that the power could be restored by 10:15am. It was cool, but the sun was shining, so we decided to hold the session outdoors rather than wait until power was restored. By the time power was restored, much of the testing had been finished. Fortunately, the VEs and candidates wore warm-enough clothing to make the session comfortable.
