Sonoma County Radio Amateurs Membership Meeting Minutes September 3, 2014

Meeting called to order at 7:05 PM by President Pat KG6JSL. A quorum was present.

Picnic Announcement: The club picnic will be held on Saturday September 13, 2014, at Lee Dibble's home (KE6EAQ). The club will provide all of the food, and Brian N6IIY will organize a hidden transmitter "fox hunt". A sign up sheet was circulated by Doug KF6LMB.

Program: Technical Questions and Answers. A panel of SCRA members, including John WB6FRZ, Brian N6IIY and Dave W6IBC, was moderated by president Pat KG6JSL. A number of questions and answers concerned antennas, baluns, and antenna modeling software. A question concerning restoring a Hallicrafters SX100 including replacement or renewal of electrolytic power supply capacitors provoked a lively discussion. Doug KF6LMB discussed a problem he experienced with newly introduced power breakers which have an arc detection capability. These breakers were being tripped when Doug used his ham transmitter. The manufacturer replaced the breakers with breakers less sensitive to ham radio emissions. Dave W6IBC presented and briefly discussed the application of the Arduino microcontroller board to ham radio projects including the TenTec Rebel 506 open platform SDR radio.

Guests and new members who attended last weekend's SCRA-sponsored Technician class were introduced all of whom successfully passed the FCC license exam and are awaiting their licenses. Terry KK6DQC upgraded from general class to extra class. Congratulations to all.

Business Meeting began at 8:20 PM after a break. A quorum of members was present.

Minutes for July Membership Meeting were approved on motion by John KE5RI, second by Jeff KI6PBF.

There were no director or officer reports.

Activities Chair Darryl KI6MSP reported that he will be making a presentation at this year's Pacificon conference concerning the STEM program. Deb KK6HRD October 2014

agreed to participate with Darryl and present a teacher's perspective. Darryl needs volunteers for PCAM and for the information booth at the Gran Fondo bicycle event.

Repeater Committee Chair Jack K6ROW reported that the voter receiver continues to work well.

Education Chair Jeff KI6PBF reported that the August Technician class resulted in three new licensees, as well as one ham who took the class as a refresher and update course. Jeff noted that a station assembly class will be held this next Friday evening, September 5th at the American Red Cross offices in Santa Rosa.

VE Liaison: Brian N6IIY reported that last Sunday's open VE session, combined with the Technician class, had seven successful examinees out of nine candidates.

Sonoma County Radio Amateurs Membership Meeting Minutes

October 1, 2014

Meeting called to order at 7:01 PM by President Pat KG6JSL. A quorum was present.

Officers and Directors were introduced. New Members and Guests included Dwane K6UMC, Wayne KK6WRR and Sandy Scheingold, wife of member Harvey KK6KQZ.

Program: Emergency Communications Roundup. Representatives of local agencies and organizations relying on amateur radio in emergencies explained their emergency communications ("emcomm") activities, so that SCRA members could better understand emcomm opportunities and choose an agency or organization to support.

City of Santa Rosa was represented by IT director and SCRA member Eric McHenry AA6EM. Eric shared his vision for the City's emergency communications structure and operation. He described the City's Emergency Operations Center.

ARRL ARES was represented by Bill Hillendahl KH-6GJV, San Francisco Section Manager. Bill reviewed the history of the Amateur Radio Emergency Service and the local ARES organization and opportunity for training and ARES accreditation for amateur volunteer communicators during an emergency. ARRL's ARES has memoranda of understanding with many agencies and organizations throughout the US.

Santa Rosa COPE was represented by SCRA member Lee Dibble KE6EAQ who explained that COPE is made up of neighborhood teams to survey and report damage and help neighbors during an emergency. Radio communications to fire stations are handled by Family Radio Service (FRS), while inter-fire station communications are handled by volunteer amateur radio operators.

Salvation Army's SATERN was represented by Gary KI6TEW, assisted by Wayne KK6WRR. Gary reviewed the history of SATERN and described its ham radio emergency communications capabilities and aspects. SATERN has a national organization and provides amateur radio communications when more traditional networks are not available.

President Pat KG6JSL thanked the presenters and explained the role of SCRA as a facilitator of amateur radio emergency communications, and not as an emergency communications service provider. SCRA has repeater equipment available for emergency use, and provides training to assist its members and all radio amateurs in gaining proficiency in handling traffic through training and public service events. Pat's vision is to increase amateur radio emergency communications training opportunities.

Business Meeting began at 8:10 PM after a break.

Sutter KI6ZON reported the challenges he experienced in obtaining the application for ham radio vehicle license plates.

John WB6FRZ will be leading a caravan to Ham Radio Outlet on Saturday October, 4th leaving from the Coddingtown Parkinglot at 8:15 AM.

Activities Chair Darryl KI6MSP needs volunteers for the information booth at the Gran Fondo bicycle event and for the North Bay Science Fair. He thanked the members who supported the SCRA booth at the local Wings over Wine Country air show.

Picnic Chair Jim KI6REK reported that although 47 members indicated they would attend the picnic, only 23 people actually showed up. Nonetheless, Jim indicated he'd probably arrange a picnic again next year. Jim thanked Lee KE6EAQ for the use of his lovely home, and thanked Brian N6IIY for arranging the fox hunt.

Education Chair Jeff KI6PBF noted that the next Technician class will be held at the Bennett Valley Grange Hall on November 7-9. There are no current plans to hold classes for the higher class licenses, and Jeff may consider using mentors instead of classes.

Public Service Chair Craig K6XLT noted that Levi's Gran Fondo bicycle event wraps up this year's public service calendar. Craig thanked all those who helped out at public service events in 2014.

Sonoma County Radio Amateurs Board of Directors Meeting

October 8, 2014 Minutes

Regular Board Meeting called to order by President Pat KG6JSL at 6:27 PM at IHOP Restaurant, Fourth St at Farmers Lane, Santa Rosa. Board Members were present included Pat, Vice President John KE5RI, Secretary Dave W6IBC, Director Doug KF6LMB, Director Jeff KI6PBF and Past President Charlie KZ6T. Treasurer Mike AD6YB was absent. Other SCRA members attending included Brian N6IIY, Darryl KI6MSP, Dan WA6CRB, Iola KK6HRE, Jack K6ROW, Jim KI6REK and Sutter KI6ZON.

Minutes of the September 2014 Regular Meeting of Board were approved on motion by Jeff KI6PBF, second by Doug KF6LMB. There were no officer or director reports.

Picnic: Chair Jim KI6REK summarized the 2014 Club Picnic, and offered several suggestions to improve turnout of those who positively RSVP'd, including, for example, a refundable deposit to encourage attendance.

Activities: Chair Darryl reported that the PCAM Wings over Wine Country Air show went well, with 11 potential Tech Class attendees. He also said the booth at the Gran Fondo event went well, considering it was on a very warm day. Darryl still needs volunteers for the Science Fair on Nov. 1st at the Fairgrounds from 11AM to 4PM. Darryl asked the Board for guidance concerning an ARRL-conducted local teacher training program for STEM. The Board suggested that he work closely with ARRL and its Field Service unit, led locally by Bill KH6GJV, ARRL SF Section Manager. Darryl will follow up with ARRL.

Emcomm: President Pat made a written inquiry concerning status of the Santa Rosa COPE program and has not received a definitive response from Santa Rosa. Pat reiterated his view that SCRA is not an emergency communication services provider, but rather a support organization for other groups who provide emergency communications. The Board voiced its support for this viewpoint. License Trustee/NARCC Rep John KE5RI reported that no one has proposed infringing on the club's repeater frequencies by seeking a coordination from NARCC.

Media: With no October Short Skip presently available, Darryl KI6MSP agreed to contact Donald WE4MOO, Short Skip Editor, to see if he wishes to continue in his role. Darryl will report back to the Board as soon as he has a chance to speak with Donald. If Donald is unwilling to continue in his role as Editor, the Board will find and appoint a replacement.

Merchandise: Chair Iola KK6HRE inquired about locating a supply of club logo stickers.

Public Service: President Pat reported that the Gran Fondo communications effort was a success.

Repeater: President Pat KG6JSL again raised a concern about the static noise bursts on the VHF repeater squelch tail. John KE5RI said there was nothing he could do about that matter as it probably was generated in each user's receiver, rather than in the club repeater system. John removed the "double" burst, and now only a single burst appears in the squelch tail.

Old Business;

The Nominating Committee will meet following the board meeting. Presently, Pat KG6JSL and Jeff KI6PBF intend to seek reelection to their respective offices. Secretary Dave W6IBC has declined to run for a second term. The committee has not heard from treasurer Mike AD6YB concerning his intention to seek reelection.

New Business:

On motion by John KE5RI, second by Doug KF6LMB, the Board recommends to the membership that 2015 club dues be reduced to \$30.00 for family membership; \$20 for member/associate membership; and, \$15 for student under 18 membership. The motion was unanimously approved, based on the healthy present state of the club treasury.

..... what is this?? Most of us think about the stem that apples, other fruit & veggies are connected to the tree.

This is a different type of STEM. STEM is about: Science, Technology, Engineering, & Math. Why is this important? America used to be the top country and a leader in the world. Unfortunately our country has slipped a lot. Why? The focus on Math and Science has been to separate them so that they are taught separately. Since math is needed in science, and science depends on math. They should be taught together.
