

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE MAY 2017



Sonoma County Radio Amateurs Club members visited the Maritime Radio Historical Society's two locations

Twelve members of the Sonoma

County Radio Amateurs Club visited the Maritime Radio Historical Society's two locations ~ Bolinas and Inverness, California, on Saturday, May 27, 2017. The KPH receive site is open for visitors every Saturday 1200 to 1700 local time. Visitors are welcome! The receive site is located at 17400 Sir Francis Drake Blvd in the Point Reyes National Seashore, just past G Ranch on the way to the lighthouse. Whisper "True Believer" when you visit for access to our Treasure Room!

The MRHS has returned the iconic KPH call sign to the air from its ancestral home at Bolinas/Point Reyes. KPH is on the air every Saturday from 1000 to 1600 Pacific time (Zulu times changes with daylight/ standard time).

MRHS Offers Radiotelegraph Exams!

The Maritime Radio Historical Society is now authorized to administer the examination for the commercial radiotelegraph license. Yes, the FCC still issues this ticket!

Sonoma County Radio Amateur Club has a newly radiotelegraph licensed operator in John Breckenridge, WB6FRZ. Congratulations, John!

According to their website, they describe themselves as: "Let's be honest... We're a bunch of radio squirrels. And very lucky radio squirrels at that. We inherited the last remaining Morse code coast station in North America. It was off the air but it was an intact time capsule.

"We made the restoration of KPH to operational status our life's work. That was back in 1999 - the year the last commercial Morse code message in the U.S. was supposedly sent.

"Through the trust and vision of the Point Reyes National

Seashore we were given permission to begin our project of restoration, documentation and operation. And we've never looked back.

"As True Believers in the importance of our maritime radio heritage we have tried to research and document every aspect of the field. Our area of specialization is the coast stations, ships and companies of the west coast of the United States. But anything to do with maritime radio anywhere in the world is of interest to us.

"Dedicated MRHS volunteers are busy with the preservation, restoration and repair of the historic artifacts with which we have been entrusted. That work is the foundation on which the real goal of our project rests. That goal is to assure that the culture, techniques and traditions of the men and women who came before us are not forgotten. We feel that the best way to achieve that goal is through actual on the air operations."





One of the bonus point tasks is to send or receive formal messages.

From the 2017 Field Day Rules:

7.3.6. Message Handling: 10 points for each formal message originated, relayed or received and delivered during the Field Day period, up to a maximum of 100 points (ten messages). Copies of each message must be included with the Field Day report. The message to the ARRL SM or SEC under Rule 7.3.5. does not count towards the total of 10 for this bonus. Available to all Classes. All messages claimed for bonus points must leave or enter the Field Day operation via amateur radio RF.

This year we will be using the VHF station to send and receive messages via Winlink. I am looking for 15 members to help out with this endeavor.

The caveat is that you cannot operate at the Youth Park at any of the radio stations. So if you can't make it down to the Park, this is your opportunity to still help out.

We are still working out the details. If you have the capability of utilizing the full Winlink system great (Radio +TNC), if you just have email capabilities we can work with that as well.

If you are willing to help out, please respond back to me at KZ6T@arrl.net copy to KZ6T@winlink.org.

In a nutshell, Winlink is a way to send and receive email via RF. It works on VHF or HF. At the heart of the system are RMS (Radio Message Station) stations which receive RF requests from radio operators and connect them into the internet. SCRA is one of those RMS stations operating as W6SON-10 on 144.910 Mhz. Try it out sometime.

After a winter and early spring that has brought an end to several years of drought, things are starting to warm up. And that means that Field Day can't be far away..

In fact, it's just less than two months away.

The big event begins at around 5pm on Friday, June 23 and ending around 3pm on Sunday, June 25. The location will be the same as last year, Youth Community Park (aka Skateboard Park) at 1725 Fulton Rd, in Santa Rosa, across the road from Piner High School.







Subject: Enforcement of Section 23123.5 of the California Vehicle Code

Effective January 1, 2017, Section 23123.5 of the California Vehicle Code (CVC) was amended by Assembly Bill 1785, which substantially expanded the scope of Section 23123.5 CVC, from simply prohibiting the use of a wireless phone to text while driving, to prohibiting holding and operating a handheld wireless telephone or an electronic wireless communications device while driving.

However, a driver may still use a handheld wireless telephone or an electronic wireless communication device while driving when:

The handheld wireless communication device is mounted to a windshield (in compliance with Section 26708[b] CVC), dashboard, or center console in a manner which does not interfere with the drivers view of the road, and;

The drivers hand is used to activate or deactivate a feature with a single tap or swipe of the drivers finger.

Pursuant to Section 23123.5(f) CVC, the definition of an electronic wireless communications device includes, but is not limited to: a broadband personal communication device, a specialized mobile radio device, a handheld device or laptop computer with mobile data access, a pager, or a two-way messaging device.

Section 23123.5 CVC does not apply to manufacturer-installed systems which are embedded in the vehicle, nor does it apply to an emergency services professional using a wireless telephone while operating an authorized Emergency vehicle, in the course and scope of employment.

For the purposes of Section 23123.5(f) CVC, a radio installed and mounted in a vehicle with a wired hand microphone (e.g., business band or citizen band [CB]radio) is not considered a wireless communication device, nor is it considered a specialized mobile radio device, and therefore is not subject to enforcement under this section.

This information will be added to an upcoming revision to Highway Patrol Manual 100.68, Traffic Enforcement Policy Manual, Chapter 5, Other Enforcement Issues.
