

DX is telegraphic shorthand for DISTANCE. So DXing is making contacts with stations at long distances. When we speak of DXing we are talking about HF contacts. While it is possible to get long distances over a repeater network or via the internet such as with IRLP, we're referring to radio to radio contacts.

As a new DXer you may set your sights on contacting stations with a different territory number such as 2 or 3 rather than the familiar West Coast 6. As you reach out, though, you will be listening for call signs that start with letters other than "K" from other countries.

This may be the point where you branch out into trading QSO cards with your contacts. Who knows?

The coming DXpedition in August is the perfect opportunity to try your hand under the guidance of seasoned veterans. Stay for a day or stay for the weekend, but come for the fun. ...more...



ANNOUNCEMENTS, NEW CALLS, UPGRADES, LIES AND BRAGS -

Doug KF6LMB reminded everyone to bring any cords, equip, etc. from Field Day they don't recognize as theirs to the next meeting. Jim KI6REK announced the Mendocino Rally is scheduled for Saturday October 28, 2017. It will be a one-day event that will need Ham Radio operators.

This month's program, Insight Into the Fusion System was presented by Eric McHenry AA6EM. System Fusion is Yaesu's implementation of Digital Amateur Radio utilizing C4FM 4-level FSK Technology to transmit digital voice and data over the Amateur radio bands. System Fusion Operating Modes include 1) V/D (Digital Narrow) that utilizes all bandwidth for high-fidelity voice operation; 2) Highspeed Data that transfers data such as images or text message at full rate with speeds up to 9600 Bps; and 3) Analog FM Mode and Automatic Mode that maintains backwards compatibility with existing Analog FM Equipment. Automatic Mode Select instantly recognizes whether the received signal is C4FM digital or conventional FM. This function enables stress-free operation by removing the need to manually switch the communication method each time.

AARL Pacific Division Section Manager Bill Hillendahl provided further comments.




