

- Original and photocopy of any valid CSCEs (if applicable)
- #2 Pencil and eraser

- \$15.00 exam fee. Checks may be made payable to "ARRL-VEC"

Calculators may be used, but it must be demonstrated that all memories and programs have been erased. The calculator function in a cell phone or PDA may not be used! If you have any special needs, please contact Brian Torr, N6IIY in advance.

Solar Eclipse

It was a busy end of the month of August 2017. The mini DX at Ocean Cove along the Sonoma Coast, the North American QSO party, and the solar eclipse in the states of Oregon, Idaho, and Montana, and all across the US. I did not attend the Mini DX, as I had the last FFA event with my 18-year-old grand daughter in Boise Idaho.

I brought up my HF equipment and set up a 51 foot inverted "V" my daughter's back yard, along with

the Icom 706MKG2. I made 5 contacts on the QSO party, and was ready for the eclipse. I made contact with Fred AE6SF who was in Montana for the eclipse. On August 21, about 09:30, the noontime net was activated in Washington on 40 meters. I contacted them and began to listen to reports as the eclipse began. I reported in stating the moon was starting to cover the sun. It was interesting to hear the progression crossing the states. During the noontime net, I heard K6AWA, Joe, check in to the net. I was surprised. I tried to have net control contact Joe and let him know I copied him in Boise Idaho. That was not completed, but I was excited to hear Joe.

Oh yes it was exciting to see the eclipse, and items related to the event. I had the good glasses and my daughter shared a glimpse. No animals were sacrificed, but strange things happened. It got dark, the temperature dropped, the street lights went on and shadows from tree leaves turned into crescents, and left strange patterns on the concrete patios. So all in all it was quite an adventure.



Martin Kilgore KJ6BQM presented information about openSpot. openSpot is a standalone digital IP gateway/ hotspot. If you don't have local repeater coverage, openSPOT can link you to DMR, D-STAR and C4FM/ System Fusion networks all around the world. If you do have local repeater coverage, you can still make use of an openSPOT to avoid interrupting local repeater traffic. You can reach any reflector or talkgroup with it, so you don't have to disconnect the local repeater and disturb other local users. Two openSPOTS can be linked together directly without any servers or network infrastructure by creating your own open source server application. Multiple openSPOTs can connect to this server as it handles all radio modes including DMR<->C4FM/System Fusion cross mode operation. Martin made a real-time call from our Membership meeting to Australia using openSPOT and was able to make a contact.






