

When I am getting dressed in the morning, riding in the car, or when I am at the gym, I listen to podcasts. What are podcasts? They are audio (and often video) recordings that you can listen to online or can download to an audio capable device such as a cell phone. You can watch many as videos as well.

I use BeyondPod, an app that runs on Android. Another popular way to find them is iTunes. I have a set of podcast providers that I listen to regularly that are amateur radio related and a few other

topics. I have learned a lot about amateur radio, technology, and other topics by listening to them. You should consider listening to some online at least, or try downloading some shows and take them with you. Here are some shows that I listened to this month that I recommend:

### Field Radio Podcast - http://fieldradiopodcast.org

– discusses topics about using Amateur Radio in the Field

Episode 12 ( <u>http://fieldradiopodcast.org/FRP12.php</u> ) was on Raising Field Expedient Antennas. On this podcast, they discuss the different methods and tools to use to get your antennas up in the air, how to keep them in the air, and how to bring them back down safely. This is an overlooked area of the hobby where you have to be inventive and adaptable to the situation. **Ham Nation** - <u>https://twit.tv/shows/ham-nation</u> -

Share in the excitement and importance of ham radio – from tossing an antenna wire into a tree allowing you to talk to the world, to the importance of ham radio operators in time of disasters.




