YEAR 1990

Founding of any type of an organization is time consuming, frustrating and very discouraging at times. In the founding of SIRARC, getting airborne, luncheon meetings, general organization and the first SSB Net were certainly no exception. The first rollcall was on March 12, 1974, with 21 reporting in. Time has taken toll - silent keys, resignations, etc. Only W6BUY Jack Holmes, W6CBR George Johnson, W6CBX Norton DeWolfe, W6JTQ and myself are around today to remember some of the problems that faced us.

Today, sixteen and one-half years later, we have nets on the air of all modes to meet the desire and need of SIRARC Members, except RTTY. Severe loss of hearing forced me to give up SSB and for a while it appeared that my long loved hobby of 34 years was gone forever. After investigating and with the encourage-of my good friend Forrest Balliet W6LWD, I decided to clean out my shack of all old gear and bought all new equipment for RTTY. This was the greatest decision of all my years of hamming and I have never enjoyed ham radio as much in my life. There is plenty of activity on this mode, not only all over the U.S.A. but Foreign. Since January of 1990, i have been in communication with almost 800 new stations world-wide with several hundred repeats.

I know many of our SIRARC old-timers must have worked RTTY in years past, with the box-car size equipment that made more noise than a threshing machine but that is not the RTTY today. With all of the new modern equipment and computers today it is a very quiet and smoothe operation.

I feel sure that, due to the age of so many of our members, many are facing problems working SSB with the pleasure they used to enjoy. Since January, I have been trying to establish a weekly SIRARC RTTY Net, but so far we have only been able to locate about six or so SIRARC members who operate RTTY and some of them for one reason or another have dropped out. Those of us who are left, together with three or four guests who join us weekly are continuing to meet each Tuesday Evening at 8:00 P. M. on 40 Meters, 7085. Should this frequency be busy we move on up to 7086, 7087, etc., until we find a free frequency. At the present time we are on Baudot operating at 60 WPM. Some consideration is being given to operating at 132 WPM.

This is a great mode to operate and a wonderful group of operators all over the world to chat with. To those of you who do or can operate RTTY, but have not heard our net on the air, why not tune in on us and take a listen. If you like what you print join in with us on Tuesday evenings - the few of us are having a nice get together.

For anyone that is interested, I would be very happy to have you pay a visit to my shack and get a first-hand view of RTTY operation. Band conditions are best in the evenings and this would be the best time to pay me a visit. Due to my hearing I can no longer use the telephone on voice but my Son Don is around most of the time and can take a message for me. Also, in case he is not around and you get no answer I can be reached on telephone TTY for hard hearing. It is a Relay Service for the hard hearing. To reach me on TTY simply dial 1-800-342-5833; tell them you want to talk with MILLARD at 415-525-6152. You will also have to give them your telephone number (including Area Code) and your name. With this information they will contact me and we can then carry on a telephone conversation.

Millard D. George K6ZRY

This month's winner is Millard C. George, K6ZRY, of El Cerrito, CA. Read on as he describes his shack and Amateur career.

I have been an Amateur for 34 years, working mostly SSB during that time. However, in mid 1989, I lost most of my hearing and can no longer work voice, so I cleaned out my station and purchased all new modern RTTY gear and revamped my entire shack.


The photo shows my new complete station. Starting from left to right it includes the following: A Robot 800 Keyboard, directly above is an NEC 13 inch green screen monitor and directly above that is a new 13 inch Toshiba color TV, which I can watch and enjoy my ball games and favorite programs as I work RTTY. To the right of the monitor is a Heathkit tuning scope, a most valuable addition to my station. Next is an Icom 735 transceiver, which is doing a remarkable job barefoot running 100W out to a roof-mounted dipole. Right next to the Icom is my control panel. This panel includes a volt meter; coax switch for three roofmounted dipoles; switch control for an electric room heater and control switch for a room fan in hot weather; a transmitter control switch for the Icom and a Swan 300 transceiver not shown; power switch for the Swan 300 and last, at the bottom, an SWR meter. All wiring and Icom power supply is enclosed and out of sight in the cabinet, of which the control panel is a part.

The cabinet has a "grand piano" type hinged lid for easy access to all wiring if necessary. I operate from a most comfortable upholstered arm chair and all equipment, including the control panel switches, can be reached without moving in my chair.

I have a low-pass filter attached snug to the Icom and almost a flat line on all three dipoles, eliminating the necessity

of a tuner and I have no RF floating around in or out of the shack - not even a flicker on my TV set, sitting almost on top of the Icom. The world map is over my desk.

While I have made no particular effort for DX, I have, nevertheless, had a few choice contacts, such as Denmark, Japan, Chile, Argentina, Guatemala, etc. I am 86-years-old and spend hours daily at my station, listening and calling - always glad for any new contacts or long chats with old friends.


I founded the SIRARC Radio Club.
