


ANTENNA POLARIZATION EXPLAINED



Antenna polarization may be one of the least understood properties of a wireless signal. If you are installing many antennas in one location, like on a tower, polarization is an important piece of the puzzle that you'll need to take into consideration. Here we give

Polarization is determined by the way an antenna is mounted, usually horizontally or vertically. To ensure optimal network performance only like-polarized antennas should be used in point-to-point wireless applications. It is possible to establish a wireless link using antennas with different polarities but network performance and connectivity will suffer.

tion schemes is to reduce interference. For example when mounting several antennas on a tower, it is best to stagger vertically and horizontally polarized antennas to reduce interference.

If horizontal or vertical polarization won't work for your wireless application there are dual-polarized, cross-polarized and circular-polarized antenna options to explore.

<u>Dual-polarized antennas</u> feature two antenna elements in a single physical package (radome), one that is vertically polarized and one that is horizontally polarized. When properly installed, dual polarized antennas can communicate with both vertically and horizontally polarized antennas. An advantage of dual polarity antenna is that you get basically two antennas in one package, this saves space and money. These types of antennas are often used with MIMO (multiple-in/multiple-out) wireless access points and CPE devices.

<u>Cross-polarized antennas</u> sometimes referred to as X-Pol antennas, feature two elements in one package. One element is +45° polarized and the other is -45° polarized. The two opposing 45° angle of the elements produces a cross or X orientation. Using a cross polarized antenna with vertically and horizontally polarized antennas further reduces interference.



<u>Circular-polarized antennas</u> have equal response to either horizontal or vertical polarized antennas. These antennas are designed to either support right hand or left hand polarization to suit varied wireless connectivity applications. Using a circular-polarized antenna on a fixed access point can be beneficial if the linear-polarized remote links are constantly moving.





Minutes, SCRA April 6, 2016, Membership Meeting

The April 2016 regular Membership meeting of SCRA was called to order by President Iola KK6HRE at 7:11 PM, following a 40 minute social hour. A quorum of members was present. After introduction of officers and directors, new members and guests were introduced, including Pete KG6YKO and Brian White (both representing the Mendo Rally), Alan KE6IDU, Marcus KG6GHW, James KI6RWG, Beth KK6UVC and her son Nathan, Bill Dornbush a former ham from the Red Cross. Ed N2WD, and Chris KM6BPS. Net Control Assignments:

April 12: Andrew KE6HID April 19: Dennis KI6REO April 26: Craig K6XLT May 3: Joe K6AWA

Pete KG6YKO and Brian White spoke briefly about the Mendo Rally. Again, ham radio volunteers are needed. The race will be on July 9-10 n Mendocino County. Sign up on-line at www.rallydata.com. Volunteers will get a commemorative tee shirt, and they are covered under the rally insurance policy. Pete expects 15-20 entries.

This month's program featured SCRA Member Matt KJ6LJI and covered High Frequency Digital Modes. Digital modes involve converting text or data into audio signals with a computer for modulating a radio transmitter, using AM, FM or SSB. Equipment includes a ham transceiver, a personal computer with sound card, and a control interface, such as Rig Blaster, Signalink, or a homebrew interface. The system requires computer software implementing the particular digital mode., such as Ham Radio Deluxe, Digital Master 780, fldigi, and a number of other programs. Most are freeware, but some, like Ham Radio Deluxe, are licensed. Matt discussed and illustrated Radio Teletype (RTTY), Slow Scan Television (SSTV), Phase Shift Keying with 31 phases (PSK31), Weak Signal Digital mode JT-65 having forward error correction, and Weak Signal Propagation Reporter (WSPR). JT-5 and WSPR were created by Nobel Laureate Dr. Joe Taylor K1JT. Matt also mentioned a website locator, PSKReporter.info where you can see which stations receive your signal.

During a break Dave W6IBC auctioned off equipment donated to the club via Mike AD6YB.

The business meeting commenced with Treasurer Wells KK6EXC reporting on the state of the treasury. Education Chair Dave W6IBC reported upon the successful Technician class and the follow-on class. And Iola KK6HRE reported that this Friday would be the last meeting of the CW class held by John WB6FRZ.

Public Service Chair Charlie KZ6T reported that the SoNoMas bike event at Lake Sonoma successfully marked the beginning of the Public Service season, and reviewed upcoming events. Craig K6XLT seeks volunteers for the AMGEN Tour of California on May 21st which will run all day long. Eric AA6EM, speaking on behalf of the City of Santa Rosa, reported that the ham radio communicators would provide backbone communications support for this event, so that hams can expect considerable radio activity.

Field Day Chair Brian N6IIY reported the next planning session will be April 16th at Youth Park at noon. He needs volunteers and Windows laptops for the event network. A two hour interview about Field Day will be broadcast on KOWS 107.3 MHz on the first Sunday in June. We will try to use social media for promotion and will establish a club twitter account.

HF Team leader Doug KF6LMB reported that the Mini-DX event will be first weekend of August at A.W Way Park west of Garberville. Merchandise Chair Kathy KK6KGW reported she's looking into new shirt designs. Outreach Chair Darryl KI6MSP mentioned past and upcoming outreach events.

Under Unfinished Business, the 2016 Roster has been sent out by email. Cross-reference pages will be added with the next update/revision. EmComm Chair Pat KG6JSL reported the Red Cross is having renewed interest in radio communications including ham radio. He also reported that Santa Rosa is proposing an ordinance related to "growing", but that the advocacy group is proposing square wave lamp ballasts which create untold radio interference. Minutes of the March 2016 Membership meeting were approved on motion by Doug KF6LMB, second by Darryl KI6MSP. The Art and Garden Center is increasing rent to \$100 per meeting over the next year. They also want floor cleaning after each event.

With no further business the meeting adjourned at 9:16 PM.

Minutes of the March 2016 Board Meeting were approved on motion by Joe K6AWA, second by Iola KK6HRE.

Treasurer Wells KK6EXC reported that he continues to work on the audit.

President Iola KK6HRE reported that the club presently has 135 paid members. The 2016 SCRA Roster will be updated by June 30, 2016 and will include cross-reference name and callsign indexes as per the 2015 Roster.

Charlie KZ6T agreed to revise the club's promotional brochure. Member Mike K6HCU proposed obtaining 18 inch by 24 inch fabric SCRA Logo pennants for use at club-involved events and will look into the matter further and report back to the board.

The Board discussed an appearance by club officials on Radio Station KOWS on June 5th. Iola KK6HRE requested preparation of questions for the expected interview.

The Board discussed the power of the Public Service Chair to decline requests for participation at newly proposed events. Any approval of a new event requires board approval.

After discussion, Dave W6IBC moved and Joe K6AWA seconded a motion to set the Board meeting time at 6PM. The motion carried.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:40 PM


